AN ACT TO AMEND THE PROVISIONS OF THE MILITARY CODE IN ORDER TO CONFORM TO PROVISIONS OF UNITED STATES LAW IN THE PREPARATION FOR ACTIVATION OF NATIONAL GUARD UNITS IN GUAM.

1 EE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:
2 Section 1. Chapter I of Title XXXVI of the Government Code
3 is repealed and recnacted to read:

"CHAPTER I

General Provisions

Section 40000. Department of Military Affairs. There is within the government of Guam the Dopartment of Military Affairs. The administrative and executive head of the department shall be the Adjutant General. The government of Guam shall provide adequate office space for the Department of Military Affairs.

Section 40001. Definitions. As used in this Title:

- (a) 'Enlisted person' means all members of the Guam Army or Air National Guard who are not officers.
- (b) 'Federal recognition' means enrollment in the Army National Guard of the United States and Reserve of the Army or Air National Guard of the United States and Reserve of the Air Force, in a particular grade, of members of the Guam National Guard, in accordance with federal law and regulations.

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(c) 'Guam National Guard' means the Guam Army 1 National Guard and the Guam Air National Guard. 2 'Officer' means any commissioned officer, or any warrant officer, of the Guam National Guard. (e) 'Order' means a general or special order, 5 oral or written, given pursuant to either territorial or federal authority. 7 'Resident' means any person who is legally Я in Guam with the intent of making this his permanent 9 homo. 10 'Territorial duty' means all duty performed 11 by members of the Guam National Guard pursuant to 12 orders of the Commander-in-Chief calling such members 13 into the active service of the territory of Guam. 14 Section 40002. Management of the Guam National Guard. 15 The Dopartment of Military Affairs shall be responsible for 16 the management of all elements of the Guam National Guard 17 not in active service of the United States. 18 Section 40003. Restriction to Guam. Except when on 19 active duty in the service of the United States, the Guam 20 National Guard, or any part thereof, shall not leave Guam 21 with arms or equipment without consent of the Governor. 22 Section 40004. Commercial Ventures and Political 23 Activities. No member of the Guam National Guard shall 24 use his position in, or affiliation with the Guam Mational 25 Guard to promote or endorse any commercial venture, pro-26 duct or service not connected with the Guam National Guard, 27 or to sponsor or support a political candidate, political 28 party, or public issue not connected with the Guam National 29 Guard. The wearing of the Guas National Guard, in conjunc-30 tion with such activities, shall be deemed a promotion or

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endersement thereof.

Section 40005. Discrimination against members:

penalty. Any person who deprives a member of the National
Guard of Guam of his employment, or attempts to prevent
his being employed by himself or another, because said
member of the Guam National Guard is such a member, or
dissuades any person from enlisting in, or joining the
Guam National Guard by threat of any sort, shall be deemed
guilty of a violation and upon conviction thereof, shall
be fined a sum not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000).

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Section 40006. Leaves of absence. All officers and employees of the government of Guam who are members of the Guam National Guard shall be entitled to leaves of absence from their respective duties without loss of time or efficiency rating on all days during which they shall be engaged on duty ordered or authorized under the laws of the United States or under this Title. The officers and employees shall be entitled to leave with pay for such active duty not to exceed fifteen (15) days per year then the officers and employees shall receive leave without pay." Section 2. Chapter II of Title XXXVI of the Government

Code is repealed and reenacted to read:

Organization, Powers and Responsibilities

Section 40100. Commander-in-Chief. The Governor

is ex-officio Commander-in-Chief and shall have command

of the Guam National Guard when not in active federal

service. During the absence of the Governor, or a vacancy
in the Covernor's Office, the person legally acting as

Governor shall also be Acting Commander-in-Chief of the

Guam National Guard with all the powers and authority of
the Commander-in-Chief.

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- (a) if nominated to the President by the Governor, be capable of being federally recognized in accordance with federal law and Army or Air Force regulations, as appropriate, in the grade of at least colonel;
- (b) be promoted in the Guam Army or Air National Guard, as appropriate, at the discretion of the Commander-in-Chief, to a grade not to exceed major general, if eligible for federal recognition in such grade, and shall then be recommended to the President of the United States for promotion;
- (c) serve until such time as his replacement is appointed by the Prosident or until he resigns. The Governor may recommend to the President the relief of the Adjutant General for malfeasance, misfeasance, or his inability to continue federally recognized status;
- (d) issue and promulgate regulations in furtherance of the provisions of this Title. The regulations
 shall take effect by Executive Order of the Governor.
 The provisions of the Administrative Adjudication Act
 shall not apply to the issuance and promulgation of
 regulations of the Department of Military Affairs;

(e) be the senior commander, under the Commander-1 in-Chief of the Guan Mational Guard and be respon-2 sible for the training of all members and units of the Guam National Guard for both federal and territo-1 rial missions; 5 (f) be the paymaster general and be charged 6 with all disbursements of pay and allowances for the 7 service of the troops when in the service of Guam; give his entire time to his military duties; Ü (h) have such military and civilian assistants 10 and clerks as may be required to properly conduct the 11 operation of his department. All positions in the 12 Department of Military Affairs and the Guam National 13 Guard shall be in the unclassified service of the 14 government of Guam. 15 issue and transmit and keep a record of 16 all orders and regulations of the Commander-in-Chief 17 and the Department of Military Affairs pertaining to 18 the Guam National Guard; 19 (j) keep a record of all appointments, commis-20 sions and warrants of officers and appointments of 21 non-commissioned officers and shall have general 22 charge of recruiting and records of enlistments and 23 discharges; 24 keep the military history of the Guam 25

14	Section 40102. Assistant Adjutant General for Army.
15	The Assistant Adjutant General for Army shall be appointed
16	by the Adjutant General and he shall:
17	(a) be a citizen of the United States and a
13	resident of Guam;
19	(b) be qualified for immediate federal recogni-
20	tion as a colonel or lieutenant colonel and shall
21	serve only so long as federally recognized in such
22	grades; and
23	(c) perform all such military duties as may be
24	required of him by the Adjutant General under his
25	supervision and control.
26	Section 40103. Assistant Adjutant General for Air.
27	The Assistant Adjutant General for Air shall be appointed
28	by the Adjutent Conersl and he shall:
29	(a) be a citizen of the United States and a

resident of Guam;

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(b) be qualified for immediate federal recognition as a colonel or lieutenant colonel and shall serve only so long as federally recognized in such grades; and

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(c) perform all such military duties as may be required of him by the Adjutant General under his supervision and control.

Section 46104. Headquarters Staff. The headquarters staff of the Department of Military Affairs shall consist of the Adjutant General, the Assistant Adjutants General for Army and Air, and such other offices as the Adjutant General, with the approval of the Governor, shall establish.

Section 40105. National Guard Personnel. The Guam National Guard shall consist of the federally recognized commissioned officers, warrant officers and enlisted members, organized, armed, and equipped as prescribed by the laws of the United States, and the regulations and tables of organization in conformity therewith, published from time to time by the President of the United States, the Secretary of Defense or the appropriate service secretary.

Section 40106. Uniforms and insignia. No member of the Guam National Guard shall wear any Army or Air Force uniform unless federally recognized and no member shall wear the insignia other than that of his federally recognized grade, nor other badges, emblems, decorations, awards, or evidences of qualification unless authorized by appropriate federal law or regulation. Members may wear awards, decorations or service ribbons conferred by the territory

of Guam or other states, commonwealths or territories, provided written orders have been issued by the Adjutant General, territory of Guam, authorizing the wearing of such awards, decorations and service ribbons and provided the member is not in the active service of the United States."

Section 3. Chapter III of Title XXXVI of the Government Code is repealed and reenacted to read:

"CHAPTER III

Commissioned and Warrant Officers

Section 40200. Appointment. No person shall be appointed and commissioned or warranted as an officer of the Guam National Guard unless he shall be qualified for immediate federal recognition in the grade to which he is to be appointed and approved by the Adjutant General. If a person so appointed shall fail to receive federal recognition when first recommended, his appointment and commission or warrant shall be terminated promptly. Subject to federal regulations, and at the discretion of the Adjutant General, such person may be reappointed and commissioned or warranted and submitted for federal recognition one additional time after the passage of one year from the date federal recognition was denied.

Section 40201. Oath of office. Every officer in the Guam National Guard shall at the time of accepting his commission, and before entering upon the duties of his office, take and subscribe to the following oath of office:

Promotion. Officers of the Guam 13 14 National Guard shall be promoted only when eligible for federal recognition in the grade to which promoted, upon 15 recommendation of their commander and approval of the 16 17 Adjutant General. 18 Section 40203. Commissions and warrants: how vacated. Commissions of officers of the Guam National Guard may be 19 20 vacated: 21 (a) by resignation if accepted by the Commander-22 in-Chief; 23 (b) by withdrawal of federal recognition in accordance with federal law or regulations; 24 25 (c) pursuant to the sentence of a General Court-26 Martial: upon recommendation of a board of examiners 27

or Air Force; and

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pursuant to regulations of the Departments of the Army

4	Section 4. Chapter IV of Title NXXVI of the Government

8	Section 40500. Enlistment eligibility. Any able-
9	bodied person of good character who is capable of immediate
10	federal recognition shall be eligible for enlistment in
11	the Guam National Guard, provided a position is available
12	for which he is qualified.
13	Section 40301. Oath of enlistment. Each person en-
14	listing in the Guam National Guard shall take and subscribe
15	to the following oath:
16	'I,, do solemnly swear (or
17	affirm) that I will support and defend the Constitution
18	of the United States and the Organic Act of the
19	territory of Guam against all enemies, foreign and
20	. domestic; that I will bear true faith and allegiance
21	to them; and that I will obey the orders of the Pre-
22	sident of the United States and the Governor of Guam
23	and the orders of the officers appointed over me,
24	according to law and regulations, so help me God.'
25	The oath of enlistment may be taken before any officer
26	of the Guam National Guard, an officer of the active military

	Section 40302. Promotion. Enlisted persons of the
2	Guam National Guard shall be promoted only when eligible
3	for federal recognition in the grade to which promoted, upon
4	recommendation of their commander and approval of the
5	Adjutant General.
6	Section 40303. Enlistments: how terminated. Terms of
7	enlistment of enlisted persons of the Guam National Guard
8	may be terminated by:
ð	(a) expiration of enlistment;
10	(b) withdrawal of Federal recognition in
11	accordance with federal law or regulations;
12	(c) pursuant to the sentence of a General or
13	Special Court-Martial;
14	(d) upon recommendation of a board of examiners
15	pursuant to regulations of the Departments of the Army
16	or Air Force;
17	(e) transfer to another component of the military
18	services of the United States, with the approval of
19	the Adjutant General; and
20	(f) upon permanent relocation of residence out-
21	side the territory of Guam."
22	Section 5. Chapter V of Title XXXVI of the Government Code
23	is repealed and reenacted to read:
24	"CHAPTER V
25	Territorial Duty
26	Section 40400. Active service: authority of Governor
27	to order. The Commander-in-Chief may in time of war, in-
28	surrection, rebellion, riot, or imminent danger thereof,
29	or in time of any state of emergency, order the Guam

National Guard, or any part thereof, into the active service of the territory of Guam, except when such members of the Guam National Guard are already in the active service of the United States.

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Section 40401. Labor organizations and strikes: use of National Guard limited. In no case shall the Guam National Guard, or any part thereof, be used against any labor organization, or for the purpose of strike breaking within Guam except such as shall be necessary in an emergency proclaimed by the Governor to maintain law and order.

Section 40402. Fay and allowances. When in the actual service of Guam under orders of the Commander-in-Chief, officers of the Guam National Guard, except officers on permanent duty receiving regular pay, and onlisted personnel shall receive for each day's service, or fraction thereof, the same basic pay and allowances as provided by law for members of the United States Army or Air Force of like grades, including longevity pay.

Section 40463. Transportation, lodging and subsistence. Transportation for all members of the Guam National Guard on duty and receiving pay under Sections 40402 of this Title shall be furnished by the territory of Guam either in-kind or by reimbursement. Lodging and subsistence will be furnished in-kind or by reimbursement when it is determined by the Adjutant General that lodging and subsistence at the member's usual place of residence is impractical during any part of the period of territorial duty.

Section 40404. Worker's Compensation Law applicable to I 2 The service of all officers and enlisted persons of the Guam National Guard, while on territorial duty and 3 lawfully performing the same, shall be deemed to be 'public employment' within the terms of Section 37002(p) of Title 5 XXXIII of the Covernment Code, the Worker's Compensation ť 7 Law. 8 Section 40405. Same: computation of claims. a claim is to be computed under the Worker's Compensation. 9 Law, as provided in Section 40404 of this Title, because 10 11 of injury or death of any officer or enlisted person of the Guam National Guard as such, it shall be computed on 12 the basis of the active duty pay of such person as if such 13 person were on permanent active duty with the Guam National 14 15 Guard. 16 Section 40406. Physicians: compensation. Physicians 17 attending cases of injury or illness incurred by a member 18

Section 40406. Physicians: compensation. Physicians attending cases of injury or illness incurred by a member of the Guam National Guard in the line of duty under Section 40400 of this Chapter shall receive reasonable compensation for each case as the circumstances may warrant and as approved by the Adjutant General."

Section 6. Chapter VI of Title XXXVI of the Government Code is repealed and reenacted to read:

"CHAPTER VI

National Guard Facilities

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Section 40500. Facilities to be maintained. The government of Guam shall maintain adequate armories, shops, ranges and sites suitable for training, assembly, maintenance, storage and other purposes as may be required for

cach unit of the Guam National Guard; such buildings and sites may be leased, constructed or financed out of territorial appropriation by cooperative arrangements between the government of Guam and the federal government.

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Section 40501. Control of facilities. Each facility shall be subject to the order of the Adjutant General, and under direct charge of the commanding officer of the unit occupying the same; such facility may house all property, arms or equipment issued to the unit occupying the same.

Section 40502. Use of facilities for civilian activities. Subject to such regulations as are promulgated by the Adjutant General, the individual facilities may be used for reasonable and legitimate civilian activities so long as such activities do not interfere with their military purposes. Proceeds, if any, received from the civilian use of such facilities shall be deposited in the General Fund." Section 7. Chapter VII of Title XXXVI of the Government Code is repealed.

Section 6. A new Subsection (c) is added to Section 6500.01 of the Government Code to read:

"(c) For the purposes of the Government Claims Act, any officer or enlisted person of the Guam National Guard on territorial duty shall be deemed an employee of the government."
