AN ACT MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE STUDENT FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM, THE TEACHER TRAINING SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM AND THE NURSES TRAINING PROGRAM AND TO AMEND PROVISIONS OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE HAVING TO DO WITH MERIT AWARD, STUDENT LOAN AND PROFESSIONAL-TECHNICAL AWARD PROGRAMS ADMINISTERED BY THE BOARD OF REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF GUAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated from the General Fund the sum of One Million Two Hundred Ninety-Five Thousand Dollars (\$1,295,000) to the Student Financial Assistance Fund established under Section 11802 of Public Law 11-138, and administered by the Board of Regents of the University of Guam.

Section 2. The appropriations made under Section 1 of this Act shall supplement the unexpended balance of Two Hundred Seventy Thousand Five Hundred Ninety-Two Dollars (\$270,592) in the Student Financial Assistance Fund including all unexpended appropriations and repayments to the fund.

Section 3. There is hereby appropriated from the General Fund the sum of Four Hundred Forty-Six Thousand Four Hundred Seventy-Nine Bollars (\$446,479) to the University of Guam for implementation of the Teacher Training Scholarship Program and the Hurses Training Program, to be allocated as follows:

- a) Teacher Training Scholarship Program \$435,479
- b) Nurses Training Program \$ 11,000.

Section 4. The appropriations made under this Act shall 1 be available for encumbrances incurred commencing August 1, 1981. 2 Section 5. The appropriations made under Sections 1, 2 and 3 3 of this Act shall not be subject to any allotment reserves 5 which may be imposed by the Bureau of Budget and Management Research. Ó 7 Section 6. The Board of Regents shall by November 30, 1981, Я submit a comprehensive report to the Speaker of the Legislature 9 identifying the merits and benefits accruing from the student 10 financial assistance programs administered by the Board of Regents to date, and include such study recommendations for improving 11 12 the merit award, student loan and professional-technical award 13 programs. The Territorial Auditor shall conduct a performance 14 and fiscal audit of the last five years of the merit award, student loan and professional-technical award programs in an 15 16 effort to discern what benefits have accrued to the territory 17 and what, if any abuses there may have been of the programs and 13 submit recommendations for corrective legislative action. 19 Section 7. The loans provided in this subchapter are subject to the following limitations:

- (a) The applicant must be a bonn fide resident of Guam and a United States citizen or a permanent resident alien and must have achieved an overall grade point average of at least 2.5 in his high school studies, or an overall grade point average of at least 3.0 in his undergraduate studies if he is pursuing a graduate degree.
- (b) The applicant must agree that after completion of the course of studies for which the award was granted he will remain or return to work on Guan for a period of one (1) year.
- (c) The applicant must be in financial need, which shall be determined by regulations authorized by Section 11304 of Subchapter A of this Chapter.
- (d) The applicant must present to the Board prior to the granting of the loan satisfactory proof that he has been admitted to the college or university as a full-time student to pursue a program of study in the area for which the loan was applied for.
- (e) The off-island colleges and universities must be properly accredited and must be approved by the Loard; provided, however, that no loans shall be granted for studies at an off-island institution in a specific academic program that is available at the University of Guan."

There are hereby established annual perit awards to the University of Guam for high school students in the graduating classes of the several public and private high schools in Guam, now or hereafter established, who are bona fide residents of Guam and are United States citizens or permaneut resident aliens who have completed four (4) scadenic quarters in public or private high school in the territory of Guam. Lorned credits shall not include any credits transferred from a school outside of Guan. The students entitled to these awards shall be those students having the highest academic scholastic standing in their graduating classes. Each graduating class of each school is entitled to up to two (2) such awards and an additional award for every fifty (50) graduates or fraction thereof; provided, however, that if as a result of the equal scholastic standing of two or more graduates, there is a tie for the awards granted pursuant to this Chapter and there are an insufficient number of awards available for the tying graduates, additional awards shall be provided for such graduates.

In the event any graduate entitled to receive the benefits of an award granted pursuant to this subchapter declines or fails to accept the awards herein provided, the next student in academic scholastic standing in the class shall be entitled to such award."

Section 11. Section 11813 of the Covernment Code, as amended, is further amended to read:

"Section 11313. Schefits. Students entitled to merit awards pursuant to this Subchapter shell receive the following benefits:

(a) Free tuition and fees to be paid by the Fund for a period of not more than four (4) years at the

(b) An annual allowance of Two Thousand Pollars (92,690) per year for room and board, textbooks and educational supplies to be disbursed monthly in accordance with regulations adopted by the Board."

Section 12. Section 11814 of the Government Code is amouded to read:

"Section 11814. Students entitled to awards. are established twenty (20) professional and technical annual awards for graduate studies. Funds appropriated for the purpose of providing loans and professional and technical awards and which are not totally expanded may be used in succeeding years so as to increase the number of annual awards; provided, however, that in awarding additional averds or loans, first preference shall be given to those applicants who have been accepted or who have been admitted to graduate programs leading to a degree in medicine, dentistry or law. The awards provided in this subchapter are subject to the following limitations:

- (a) The applicant must be a bona fide resident of Guam and a United States citizen or a permanent resident alien and must have schieved an overall grade point average of 3.0 in his high school studies, or in him undergraduate studies if he is pursuing a graduate degree.
- (b) The applicant must agree that after completion or termination of his course of studies for which the award was granted, he will return to work on Guam for a period of one (1) year.
- (c) The applicant must present to the Board prior to the granting of the award setisfactory proof that he has been admitted to the college or university as a full-time student to pursue a program of study in the

- (a) The colleges or universities must be properly accredited and must be approved by the board; provided, however, that no award shall be granted for studies at an off-island institution in a specific academic program that is available at the University of Guam.
- (c) The Board shall select the recipients of the awards upon the basis of scholastic ability, financial need, aptitude, and health as well as the likelihood of the recipient returning to Guam to fill its professional needs.
- No award shall be made under this subchapter (f) unless the Board has made a written finding that the proposed award shall be for the professional or technical skills needed in the territory of Guam. Annually, the Board shall defermine those areas in which additional professional and technical skills are needed and establish a list of priorities prior to considering any applications for the awards."

Section 13. Section 11815 of the Government Code is amended to read:

"Section 11815. Henefits. Students entitled to merit awards pursuant to this subchapter shall receive the following benefits:

- Payment of tuition and fees for a period of not more than four (4) scholastic years;
- An annual grant loan of not more than Two Thousand Five Bundred Dollars (\$2,500) per year to be disbursed in accordance with regulations adopted by the Board, such grant leans to be non-interest bearing except as to unpaid deliaquent amounts. In no case shall the total anount lonned to a single individual under this

subparagraph exceed the sum of Ten Thousand Bollars (\$10,000).

"Section 11819. Awards for citizens of the Trust Territory. There are established six (6) annual merit awards to the University of Guam for high school students in the graduating classes of the several public and private high schools in the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands. Applicants for such awards shall be citizens of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands, shall have completed four (4) years of high school, of which at least the last full academic year shall have been in the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands. Each of the five (5) districts of the Trust Territory of the Facific Islands; is entitled to one (1) award per year, provided that the students given this award shall have attained an overall grade point average of 3.0. The Board shall select annually the recipient of the award from each district, such selection to be based on scholastic ability, aptitude, health, ambition, and other criteria to be determined by the Board by regulation."

Section 15. Section 11820 of the Government Code is repealed and reenacted to read:

"Section 11820. Awards for the Commonwealth of the Morthern Markana Islands. There are established two (2) merit awards at the University of Guam for high school students in the graduating classes of the several public and private high schools within the jurisdiction of the Commonwealth of the Morthern Mariana Islands. Applicants shall have completed four (4) years of high school, of which at least the last full academic year shall have been

3 in one of the schools of the Commonwealth of the Northern 2 Hariana Islands. To be entitled to this award, students 3 shall have attained an overall grade point average of 4 3.0. The Board shall select recipients on the basis of 5 scholastic ability, aptitude, health, and other criteria to be determined by the Board." Section 16. Section 11321 of the Government Code is amended 8 to read: 9 "Section 11821. Benefits. Students entitled to merit 10 awards pursuant to this subchapter shall receive the 11 following benefits: 12 (a) Free tuition and fees to be paid by the Fund 13 for a period of not more than four (4) years at the Univer-74 sity of Guam; 15 (b) An annual allowance of One Thousand Five Hundred 16 Dollars (\$1,500) per year for room and board, textbooks 17 and educational supplies to be disbursed monthly in 13 accordance with regulations adopted by the Board. Room 19 and board shall, whenever possible, be at dormitories at 20 the University of Guam." 21 Section 17. Subchapters f, g and 1 (being Sections 11822 22 through 11826.5) of the Government Code are repealed. 23 Section 18. A new Subsection (6) is hereby added to 24 Section 11837 of the Government Code of Cuam to read as follows: 25 "(δ). We tuition shall be levied upon any student 26 adultted to study under the 'Advance Placement Program'." 27 Section 19. Section 11977(a) of the Government Code is 25 amended to read: 29 "Section 11977(a). The Board shall establish a 30 schedule of tuition and fees for courses offered by the

Section 20. If any part of this Act is invalid, all valid parts that are severable from the invalid part shall remain in effect. If a part of this Act is invalid in one or more of its applications, the part remains in effect in all valid applications that are severable from the invalid applications.

Section 21. Sections 8 through 16 of this Act shall apply prospectively only and those sections shall not be used to deny assistance to any person whose enrollment in a course of study has been approved by the Board of Regents prior to the effective date of this Act.
