
CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR



AN ACT ADDING SECTION 19.60 TO THE GUAM
CRIMINAL AND CORRECTIONAL CODE REGARDING
ACTS OF TERRORIZING AND AMENDING SECTION
1972 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE RELATIVE TO
THE POLITICAL STATUS REFERENDUM.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 19.60 of the Guam Criminal and Corree-
3 tional Code is hereby enacted to read as follows:

4 "Section 19.60(a). A person is guilty of terrorizing
5 if he communicates to any person a threat to commit or to
6 cause to be committed a crime of violence dangerous to
7 human life, against the person to whom the communication is
8 made or another, and the natural and probable consequence
9 of such a threat, is to place the person to whom the threat
10 is communicated or the person threatened in reasonable fear
11 that crime will be committed.

12 (b) Terrorizing is a felony of the third degree."

13 Section 2. Section 1972 of the Government Code is amended
14 by substituting therein the date January 30, 1982, for September
15 12, 1981, and adding thereto subsections (b), (c) and (d) to
16 read:

17 "(b) The Commission shall use for the election the
18 ballots printed for use in the election heretofore scheduled
19 to be conducted September 12, 1981.

20 (c) Sections 3105 and 4104 of Title 3 of the Guam Code
21 Annotated shall not be applicable to the election required to
22 be conducted by this Section. In lieu of the provisions of
23 those sections, the Commission shall conduct registration
24 only at its main office and appoint to each and every polling

1 place a precinct board consisting of an inspector and two
2 judges, each of whom shall be paid \$50 for their services.

3 (d) The results of the plebiscite mandated by Section
4 1972 shall be tabulated by the Election Commission and the
5 results formally certified by it to the Legislature, the
6 Governor, the President of the United States, to the
7 presiding officers of each house of the Congress of the
8 United States and to the Secretary General of the United
9 Nations."
