## Committee on Rules at the request of the Governor

AN ACT MAKING SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS AND AUTHORIZING REAPPROPRIATIONS TO DISCHARGE PAST OBLIGATIONS TO UTILITIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. (a) Statement of Legislative Finding. Upon the basis of public hearings, lengthy debate and the general awareness that the members of the Legislature have of the facts that exist relative to the financial condition of Guam Power Authority, the Legislature finds:

(1) Guam Power Authority is on the verge of insolvency. Without help in the form of a direct subsidy by the Legislature from the General Fund, Guam Power Authority cannot continue to meet its obligations to employees and creditors on a timely basis.

(2) If Guam Power Authority is permitted by the Legislature to become insolvent, the health, safety and welfare of every person in the territory will be imperiled. If the lights go off, the people will be truly powerless; our island's economy will be destroyed. Moreover, a cessation of operations by Guam Power Authority would severely impair the national defense capability that the United States maintains on Guam. (3) The Legislature has determined that the resolution of the problems of Guam Power Authority lies in:

(i) Terminating the Joint Power Pool Agreement which is grossly unbalanced in favor of the military.

(ii) Conveying the interest of the federal government in the islandwide power system to the government of the territory.

(iii) Renegotiating the federally guaranteed \$36 million loan Guam Power Authority has to reduce the usurious interest rate that is now borne by the consumers of Guam Power Authority.

(b) Requirement of response. No later than 30 days from the date of this Act, the Board of Directors and the Governor shall each submit to the Speaker of the Legislature their written concurrence or disagreement with the conclusions stated by the Legislature in Section 1(a)(3) of this Act. In either event, reasons, therefor, shall be stated.

Section 2. One Million Eight Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,800,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Guam Power Authority for the purpose of discharging all unpaid obligations of the Department of Labor (\$3,300), the Commissioner's Council (\$20,000), Guam Memorial Hospital Authority (\$210,600), Government House (\$3,400), the Department of Public Safety (\$17,300) and the Public Utility Agency of Guam (\$1,545,400) for power purchased in fiscal year 1981 and in prior years. The appropriations made in this Section shall be satisfied by the transfer from any available lapsed, unencumbered or unexpended appropriations made from the General Fund in Section 3 of Public Law 15-142.

(a) There is appropriated from the General Fund Section 3. to the Guam Power Authority Four Million Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$4,300,000), provided, however, that this appropriation shall not be disbursed from the General Fund until the Board of Directors of Guam Power Authority shall have certified in writing to the Speaker of the Legislature that all notices of termination served upon employees of Guam Power Authority for reasons of economy during the month of August 1981 have been rescinded. Upon the filing of such a notice by the Board of Directors, the Legislative Secretary shall acknowledge receipt of the notice and the Board of Directors shall file the acknowledgement of receipt with the Treasurer of Guam in order that the appropriation made by this Section may be disbursed. Only funds paid into the General Fund pursuant to Section 30 of the Organic Act of Guam shall be used to satisfy the appropriation made in this Section.

(b) The sum appropriated by subsection (a) shall be immediately available to Guam Power Authority to continue its operations.

Section 4. Any department, agency, public corporation,
board or commission of the government which received appropriations under Public Law 15-142 may expend any available funds for
the purposes of paying electric bills incurred during fiscal
year 1981 and any prior fiscal years.
