suspension and other disciplinary action, shall be adopted by the Board of Directors for the Guam Airport Authority. Board of Directors for Guam Economic Development Authority, Board of Directors for Guam Housing Corporation, Board of Commissioners for Guam Housing and Urban Renewal Authority, Legislature, Judicial Council, the Board of Directors of the Guam Telephone Authority, the Board of Directors of the Fort Authority of Guam, the Board of Directors of the Guam Power Authority, the Board of Education, the Board of Regents of the University of Guam, the Guam Community College Board of Trustees and by the Board of Trustees of the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority with respect to parsonnel matters within their respective branches, agencies or departments, and by the Director of Administration as to all other executive branch employment. Such rules shall, to the extent practicable, provide standard conditions for entry into and other matters concerning the government service. The personnel rules adopted for University of Guam, Guam Airport Authority, Guam Telephone Authority, Port Authority of Guam, Guam Power Authority, Department of Education, Guam Memorial Mospital Authority, the Judiciary and by the Director of Administration shall require that all their classified employee appeals be heard by the Civil Service Commission. Personnel rules governing the Legislature and other executive branch entities may require that their classified employee appeals be heard by the Civil Service Commission. Rules concerning the executive branch shall take effect upon their approval by the Civil Service Commission, by Executive Order of the Governor and filing

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with Legislative Secretary. Rules concerning the legislative and judicial branches shall take effect upon filing with the Civil Service Commission."

Section 3. The first paragraph of Section 4, Government Code Annotated 4175, is amended to read:

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"An employee who is dismissed, denoted, or suspended shall be given immediate notice of the action, together with a specific statement of the charges upon which such action is based, in the manner required by Article I of this Chapter. Copies thereof shall be filed with the Civil Service Commission and, if applicable, with the government entity charged with hearing his appeal under the personnel rules governing his employment not later than the working day next following the effective date of the action."

Section 4. Section 11842 of the Government Code is smended to read:

"Section 11842. Non-Academic Personnel. Notwithstanding any law, rule or regulations to the contrary, all non-academic personnel shall be classified and matters relating to employment of non-academic personnel shall be governed by and in accordance with Title 4 of the Guam Code Annotated and other personnel laws.

All employees of the University of Guam who have sequired government of Guam civil service tenure on the date of enactment of this Act and who are transferred to the corporate university in accordance with Section 11845 of this Act shall retain their tenure and status as employees of the government of Guam."

Section 5. Section 13 of Public Law 16-23 is repealed and 2 repeated to read:

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"Section 13. Subsection (b) of Section 49007 of the Government Code is amended to read:

'(b) All employees of the hospital, except
physicians and health care administrators, shall be
members of the classified service of the government."
Section 6. Section 16 of Public Law 16-23 is amended to
read:

"Section 16. The provisions of this Act shall take effect on January 1, 1982."

Section 7. New Sections 17, 18, 19 and 20 are added to Public Law 16-23 to read:

"Saction 17. The Civil Service Commission may approve temporary rules and regulations necessary for the implementation of this Act which shall remain in effect no later than June 30, 1982 governing those executive branch entities which have not previously adopted personnel rules which wers approved by the Commission. The Administrative Adjudication Act shall not govern the adoption of the temporary rules and regulations which need not be issued. as an Executive Order of the Governor. The existing personnel rules for the judicial branch as adopted by the Judicial Council shall govern judicial branch classified employees and shall remain in effect no later than June The Standing Rules of the Sixteenth Cuam Logisla-30, 1982. ture shall govern legislative branch classified employees and shall remain in offect no later than June 30, 1982.

Section 18. Soverability. If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstance is hold invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this and the provisions of this Act are severable.

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Section 19. Any employee occupying an unclassified position which becomes a classified position by virtue of the provisions of this Act, shall:

- (a) remain in his position if he meets the qualification requirements of the established position classification standards and shall rotain his salary if it is higher than the appropriate salary set for the position until he vacates the position or until January 1, 1984, whichever first occurs; or
- (b) resign or be removed from his position no later than January 31, 1933 if he does not meet the qualification requirements of the established position classification standards. A removal under this subsection shall be doomed an adverse action entitling the employee to an appeal to the appropriate entity under the provisions of this Act.

Section 20. Any employee occupying a classified position which becomes an unclassified position by virtue of the provisions of this Act, shall remain in his position if the appointing authority notified him in writing that his service shall continue or be removed from his position no earlier than June 30, 1982."

Section 8. The provisions of Sections 1, 2, 3, 4 and 7 of this Act shall take effect on January 1, 1983 at the same time. Public Law 16-23 takes effect.
