AN ACT TO ENACT TITLE 15 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED RELATIVE TO WILLS, SUCCESSION, PROBATE PROCEDURES, AND ADMINISTRATION OF ESTATES, AND TO REPEAL ALL LAWS INCONSISTENT THEREWITH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. There is hereby enacted Title 15 of the Guam Code Annotated, which is composed of three (3) Divisions as follows:

Division 1. Wills

Division 2. Succession and Simultaneous Death

Division 3. Administration of Decedents' Estates,

and which is attached hereto and made a part hereof. Such enactment shall
be according to the terms contained within the said Title 15.

9 Section 2. Sections 1 through 1240, inclusive, of the Probate Code of
10 the Territory of Guam are hereby repealed.

11 All other laws are hereby repealed to the extent of their Section 3. inconsistency, if any, with the said Title 15, except those laws contained in 12 Title 1, Title 8, Title 9, Title 13 and Title 14 of the Guam Code Annotated. 13 Section 4. References in any law, rule, regulation, executive order, 14 or other public document referring to the sections repealed by Section 2, 15 above, shall be deemed to refer to the comparable sections within Title 15 16 of the Guam Code Annotated, if such comparable sections have been 17 reenacted in the said Title. 18

Section 5. Division IV of the Probate of the Territory of Guam,
entitled "Guardian and Ward", including all amendments thereto heretofore
enacted, is hereby reenacted in its entirety as Division 4 of Title 15 of the
Guam Code Annotated, commencing with Chapter 35 of said Title.

23 Section 6. The effective date of this Act shall be ninety (90) calendar
24 days after the date it becomes law.
