




CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR



AN ACT TO ADD A NEW CHAPTER IX TO TITLE XI
OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE TO ESTABLISH AN INVENTORY
OF ALL GOVERNMENT OF GUAM VEHICLES AND TO ASSIGN
THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS THE DUTY TO MAIN-
TAIN AND REPAIR ALL GOVERNMENT OF GUAM VEHICLES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. A new Chapter IX is added to Title XI of the
3 Government Code to read:

4 "CHAPTER IX

5 Vehicle Maintenance and Repair

6 Section 10610. This Act shall be known as the
7 'Vehicle Maintenance and Repair Act of 1981.'

8 Section 10611. The Director of the Department of
9 Public Works shall maintain an inventory of all motor
10 vehicles owned by the government of Guam, its various
11 departments and agencies, including autonomous or semi-
12 autonomous agencies. The inventory shall contain a
13 description of the vehicle, its engine or serial number,
14 the entity using the vehicle, the date the vehicle was
15 acquired and placed in the inventory, the date the vehicle
16 was removed from the inventory, and the reason for removal.

17 Section 10612. Except as otherwise provided, the
18 Department of Public Works shall maintain and repair all
19 vehicles owned by the executive branch of the government
20 of Guam, its various departments and agencies, including
21 semi-autonomous and autonomous agencies.

1 Section 10613. (a) The Director of the Department
2 of Public Works may authorize an agency to repair and
3 maintain its own vehicles if the vehicles are specialized
4 equipment used primarily by that agency on the performance
5 of duties unique to it.

6 (b) The Director of the Department of Public Works
7 may contract with a private entity to repair and maintain a
8 vehicle if no employee of the Department of Public Works
9 possesses the capability to repair and maintain it or if
10 private repair and maintenance would be more economical and
11 will not cause the layoff of any Department of Public Works
12 personnel.

13 (c) The Director of the Department of Public Works
14 may repair and maintain the vehicles owned by the Legislative
15 and Judicial Branches of the government of Guam upon the
16 request of the branch.

17 (d) The Director of the Department of Public Works
18 may contract with the Department of Vocational Rehabilita-
19 tion or the Guam Community College to repair and maintain
20 a vehicle if repair and maintenance would be more economical
21 than contracting with a private entity and will not cause
22 the layoff of any Department of Public Works personnel.

23 Section 10614. The Department of Public Works shall
24 charge other branches and autonomous and semi-autonomous
25 agencies for services rendered by the department."

26 Section 2. There is authorized to be appropriated such
27 sums as may be required to implement this Act.

28 Section 3. The provisions of this Act shall take effect
29 ninety (90) days after enactment.

30 Section 4. This Act shall not affect existing contracts.
31 At the expiration of existing service or maintenance con-
32 tracts, the Director of the Department of Public Works shall
33 review the contracts pursuant to Section 10613 of this Act.
