AN ACT TO AMEND SUBSECTION 23001(a) AND (q) OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE RELATIVE TO THE DEFINITION OF A BICYLE EQUIPPED WITH A MOTOR.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:
Section 1. Subsection (a) of Section 23001 (Public Law 14-75)

"(a) A 'bicycle equipped with a motor' is a two or three-wheeled vehicle equipped with a motor having a power rating not in excess of two (2) horsepower and is designed to travel on not more than three (3) wheels in contact with the ground."

Section 2. Subsection (q) of Section 23001 of the Government Code (Public Law 14-140) is amended to read:

"(q) A 'motorcycle' is a motor vehicle having a power rating in excess of two (2) horsepower designed to travel on not more than three (3) wheels, or two (2) wheels and a side car, in contact with the ground, and not a 'bicycle equipped with a motor."

Section 3. Subsection (a) of Section 23319 of the Government Code is amended to read:

"(a) Upon registering a vehicle, the Department of
Revenue and Taxation shall issue to the owner one (1) license
plate (one rear) for a motor vehicle. Such plates shall
identify the vehicles for which they are issued for the
period of their validity. A person who purchases personal
license plates for his vehicle shall be issued two (2)

1	license plates (one front and one rear)."
2	Section 4. Section 23367 of the Government Code is repealed
3	Section 5. A new Section 23101.4 is added to the Government

5	"Section 23101.4. It shall be a violation for a person

"Section 23101.4. It shall be a violation for a person to alter a bicycle equipped with a motor to exceed the manufacturers specified maximum speed of the vehicle."
