AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE EXPUNGEMENT OF JUVENILE AND ADULT RECORDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:
Section 1. Section 271 of the Code of Civil Procedure is
amended to read:

and the second of the second o "Section 271. (a) The court shall make and keep records of all cases brought before it, and shall devise and cause to be printed such forms for social and legal records and such other papers as may be required. The court's official records shall be open to inspection only by order of the judge to persons having a legitimate interest therein. All information obtained and social records prepared in the discharge of official duty by any employee of the court or by any employee of the government of Guam at the request of the court shall be privileged and shall not be disclosed directly, or indirectly to anyone other than the judge or others entitled under this Title to receive such information, unless and until otherwise ordered by the judge.

(b) On motion, the court may order official juvenile records of the court, and the police and Attorney General reports and records in connection therewith to be expunged when the subject of the report reaches the age of eighteen (18) years."

Section 2. Section 271.1 of the Code of Civil Procedure is repealed.

Section 3. A new Chapter XI is added to 8 GCA to read: "CHAPTER XI

## Expungement of Records

Attorney General and the police reports in connection therewith dealing with a violation or attempted violation by an adult of territorial law or a regulation having the force and effect of law shall be expunged when the subject of the report is acquitted of the offense charged, when the prosecuting attorney decides not to prosecute the offense or when the time for commencing the criminal action as prescribed by Chapter X of this Title has passed.

Section 11.11. Expungement, defined. As used in this Act, expungement means the sealing of records to all persons outside of the law enforcement agencies of Guam and federal agencies entitled thereto and a refusal by such agencies to admit the existence of such records to persons not entitled to examine them."

Section 4. A new Section 9 GCA 70.45 is added to read:

"Section 70.45. A person is guilty of a misdemeanor if he permits to be made public or reveals to any person not entitled to review it any official record of the court, Attorney General or any other entity of the government of Guam which has been expunged in accordance with Section 271 of the Code of Civil Procedure or Chapter XI of 8 GCA."
