SIXTEENTH GUAM LEGISLATURE 1982 (SECOND) Regular Session

Bill No. 645 (As Amended by the Committee on Criminal Justice)

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE DETERMINATION OF THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN GUAM AND THE UNITED STATES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 1973 of the Government Code (enacted
by P.L. 15-128) is amended to read:

"Section 1973. If no one political status proposal receives majority of the votes cast in the above plabiscite, a run-off plabiscite shall be held on September 4, 1982 between the two (2) status proposals receiving the highest number of votes."

Section 2. Section 1974 of the Government Code, as amended, is further amended to read:

"Section 1974. After the results of the plebiscite are made known, the Commission shall reduce the desires of the people of Guam to a written covenant, or Territorial-Federal Relations Act, or both, as necessary, to be submitted to the Congress of the United States as the manifest will of the people of Guam on the question of their relationship with the Government of the United States of America. Prior to submission of this Act, covenant or both to the United States Congress, the Commission shall hold public hearings on the proposed draft(s). Upon completion of the public hearings, the Commission shall submit a final draft or drafts to the people of Guam at a referendum to be held on November 2, 1982. The Commission shall represent the people of Guam in negotiating with the Congress

of the United States the implementation of such covenant,
Act, or both, if approved by the people of Guam by majority
vote of those persons voting in the referendum."

Section 3. Section 1001 of the Guam Code Annetated is amended to read:

"Section 1001. Holidays Falling on Meekends. If any of the holidays enumerated in Section 1000 (2) through (15), inclusive, falls upon a Sunday, the following Monday is a holiday, and if any of such holidays falls upon a Saturday, the preceding Friday is a holiday; provided, however, that if the holiday results from a primary election or a run-off or any other election, referendum or plebiscite held upon a Saturday, the preceding Friday is not a holiday."

Section 4. There is appropriated from the General Fund the sum of Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000) to the Guam Election Commission to satisfy the provisions of this Act. All unabligated or unexpended funds from this appropriation after September 4, 1982 shall revert to the General Fund.
