




CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR



AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC
WORKS TO PROVIDE CORAL TO THE CITIZENS OF GUAM.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. The Department of Public Works shall distribute
3 for non-commercial use government-owned coral mined from govern-
4 ment-owned coral pits. The distribution of coral shall be
5 limited to the loading of a personal vehicle of such recipient
6 at the coral pit site. The department shall not permit distri-
7 bution of coral to any commercial entity.

8 Section 2. One (1) year after the implementation of this
9 program, the Department of Public Works shall report to the Guam
10 Legislature on the financial impact of the program. The report
11 shall contain a review of all costs incurred, including but not
12 limited to, the cost of coral, the cost of manpower and the cost
13 of equipment used in the distribution of coral.

14 Section 3. The Director of the Department of Public Works
15 shall adopt rules governing the distribution of coral in accor-
16 dance with the provisions of the Administrative Adjudication Act.
17 The Director of the Department of Public Works may adopt tempo-
18 rary rules governing the distribution of coral. The temporary
19 rules need not be adopted in accordance with the provisions of
20 the Administrative Adjudication Act. The temporary rules shall
21 remain in effect for no longer than eighteen (18) months after
22 the enactment of this Act. The rules may require payment of a fee
23 for the coral.

1 Section 4. Notwithstanding the provisions of Sections 1
2 through 4 of this Act, no coral shall be distributed for non-
3 government use until the fiscal note required by Section 1900
4 of the Government Code is submitted by the Director of the
5 Bureau of Budget and Management Research to the Legislature.
6 Any government employee distributing coral in violation of this
7 Section shall be guilty of a petty misdemeanor.
