AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS TO PROVIDE CORAL TO THE CITIZENS OF GUAN.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. The Department of Public Works shall distribute for non-commercial use government-owned coral mined from government-owned coral pits. The distribution of coral shall be limited to the loading of a personal vehicle of such recipient at the coral pit site. The department shall not permit distribution of coral to any commercial entity.

Section 2. One (1) year after the implementation of this program, the Department of Public Works shall report to the Guam Legislature on the financial impact of the program. The report shall contain a review of all costs incurred, including but not limited to, the cost of coral, the cost of manpower and the cost of equipment used in the distribution of coral.

Section 3. The Director of the Department of Public Works shall adopt rules governing the distribution of coral in accordance with the provisions of the Administrative Adjudication Act. The Director of the Department of Public Works may adopt temporary rules governing the distribution of coral. The temporary rules need not be adopted in accordance with the provisions of the Administrative Adjudication Act. The temporary rules shall remain in effect for no longer than eighteen (18) months after the enactment of this Act. The rules may require payment of a fee for the coral.

Section 4. Notwithstanding the provisions of Sections I through 4 of this Act, no coral shall be distributed for non-government use until the fiscal note required by Section 1900 of the Government Code is submitted by the Director of the Bureau of Budget and Management Research to the Legislature.

Any government employee distributing coral in violation of this Section shall be guilty of a petty misdemeanor.
