


CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR

AN ACT TO ADD SECTION 11208 TO THE GOVERNMENT
CODE RELATIVE TO REQUIRING ECONOMIC EDUCATION
IN SCHOOLS ON GUAM.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. A new Section 11208 is added to the Government
3 Code to read:

4 "Section 11208. Economic Education. (a) As used in
5 this section, the term 'economic education' means citizenship
6 competencies needed by the individual for effectively per-
7 forming his decision-making roles as a consumer, a worker
8 making career choices, and a voter on personal and societal
9 economic issues.

10 (b) The Board of Education shall adopt regulations and
11 implement programs to insure the teaching of economic edu-
12 cation to all pupils in grades 1 through 12 on a minimum
13 time schedule of grades 10 through 12 by the 1985-84 school
14 year, grades 7 through 9 by the 1984-85 school year, grades
15 4 through 6 by the 1985-86 school year, and grades 1 through
16 3 by the 1986-87 school year."
