AN ACT TO ADD NEW SECTIONS 70.41, 70.42 AND 70.43 TO TITLE 9 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED TO PROHIBIT CRIMINAL TRESPASS AND UNLAWFUL DISCHARGE OF FIREARMS AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PROPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUANT Section 1. A new Section 70.41 is added to Title 9 of the Guan Code Annotated to read:

"Section 70.41. A person commits a misdemeanor if, he without the written permission of the owner or of the owner or of the owner's agent or of the person in lawful possession:

- (a) Maliciously tears down, damages, mutilates or destroys any sign, signboard or notice placed upon, or affixed to any property that belongs to the government of the territory, which sign, signboard or notice is intended to indicate or designate a road or highway or is intended to designate speed limits or a traffic hazard or is intended to direct travelers from one point to another or is intended to advise of prohibited entry or relates to fires, fire centrol, traspassing or other matters involving the protection of the property;
- (b) Wilfully opens, tears down or otherwise destroys any fence on the land of another or wilfully removes, injures, cuts or tampers with any lock or any

locked gate or any locked chain or any other locked barrier on any road, track or trail leading into lands of another or maliciously tears down, mutilates or destroys any sign, signboard or other notice forbidding shoeting on public or private property; or

- enclosed by fence, for the purpose of injuring any property or property rights or with the intention of interferring with, obstructing or injuring any lawful business or occupation carried on by the owner of such land, his agent or by the person in lawful possession; or
 - enclosed by fence, belonging to, or occupied by, any other or enters upon uncultivated and unenclosed lands belonging to, or occupied by, any other where signs forbidding trespass are displayed at intervals not less than three to the mile along all exterior boundaries on all roads and trails entering such lands:
 - (1) For the purpose of hunting, shooting, killing or destroying any animal or bird upon such lands; or
 - (2) Discharges any firearms upon such land or lands; or
 - (3) Refuses or fails to leave such lands immediately upon being requested to leave by the owner of such land, his agent or by the person in lawful possession; or
 - (4) Tears down, mutilates or destroys any sign, signboard or notice forbidding entry on such lands.

Enters upon any lands declared closed to public entry by the government where such closed lands are posted with notices declaring such closure at intervals not greater than one mile along the exterior boundaries or along roads and trails passing through such lands declaring the lands closed to public entry or stating 'no trespassing'. The Director of the Department of Land Management, in compliance with the Administrative Adjudication Act, is authorized to desig nate as closed to public entry and post 'no trespassing signs on any portion or portions of property belonging to the government upon his determination that such designation is reasonably necessary for the purpose of public safety, preservation of government property, conservation of resources, fire prevention, safety of adjoining property owners or prevention of nuisances." Section 2. A new Section 70.42 is added to Title 9 of the

Section 2. A new Section 70.42 15 added to little For the Guam Code Annotated to read:

"Section 70.42. A person commits a misdemeanor who wilfully discharges a firearm:

- (a) At any occupied dwelling, building or other structure;
- (b) At any utility pole, or line or device for transmittal of power or communications of any kind;
- (c) At any sign, signboard or notice placed upon or affixed to any property belonging to the government of the territory."

Section 3. A new Section 70.43 is added to Title 9 of the Guam Code Annotated to read:

"Section 70.43. A person commits a misdemeaner who wilfully discharges a firearm within fifty (50) yards ef any occupied dwelling, building or other structure without the prior consent of the owner thereof or his agent or of the person in lawful possession thereof, with the exception of the discharge of firearms at a properly constructed shooting range approved by the Director of the Department of Public Safety or by a peace officer in pursuit of his duty as a peace officer."

Section 4. Subsection (e) of Section 8900 of the Government Code is amended to read:

- "(e). The terms 'director' and 'department' mean the Director of Public Safety and the Department of Public Safety, respectively."
- Section 5. New Subsections (f) and (g) are added to Section 8900 of the Government Code to read:
 - "(f) 'Body armor' means a commercially available, soft, lightweight material with penetration resistance equal to or greater than that of eighteen (18) layers of KEVLAR.
 - (g) 'Rostricted bullet' means a bullet that, as determined by the Director, when fired from a pistel or revolver with a barrel five inches (5") or less in length, is capable of penetrating body armor."
- Section 6. A new Section 8907.1 is added to the Government Code to read:

"Section 8907.1. Any person who imports, manufactures or sells a restricted bullet on Guam, except as specifically authorized by the Director for purposes of public safety shall be guilty of a felony of the third degree and if the person holds a business license or is registered under the

provisions of this Chapter, such business license and such registration shall be subject to revocation."

Section 7. A new Section 8987.2 is added to the Gevernment Code to read:

"Section 8907.2. Any person who possesses of carries a restricted bullet not in accordance with the regulations promulgated by the Director shall be guilty of a felony of the third degree."

Section 8. The sum of Five Hundred Ten Thousand Dollars (\$510,000) is hereby appropriated to the Department of Youth Affairs for the purpose of administering a Summer Youth Internship Program for college and junior and senior high school students subject to the following conditions:

- (a) Employment of youth shall be within the branches of the government of Guam or in any duly licensed and registered firm complying with all fair labor laws existing in and for the territory of Guam.
- (b) Employment of an eligible youth shall be in an area that will be meaningful to the youth's development of a career.
- (c) Employment shall be for a person aged fifteen (15) to twenty-five (25), provided, however, that the student is currently registered as a student in a recognized college, university or junior or senior high school within the United States or Guam.
- (d) Trainees who are enrolled in college shall be paid the sum of Three Dollars (\$3.00) per hour, and trainees who are enrolled in junior or senior high school shall be paid Two Dollars and Seventy-Five Cents (\$2.75) per hour. Provided, hower, no trainee shall be paid for more than thirty-five (\$5) hours per week. Payment shall be made only for work performed from June 7, 1982 through August 21, 1982. Student trainees shall not be members of the Government Guam Retirement Fund.

(f) The Department of Youth Affairs shall not expend any of this appropriation for administrative expenses.

Section 9. The Department of Youth Affairs shall establish procedures, rules and regulations to implement the provisions of this program not inconsistent with the conditions prescribed above. This section is not subject to the provisions of the Administrative Adjudication Act.

Section 10. The Director of the Department of Youth Affairs shall submit a report to the Legislature not later than September 30, 1982, which shall be limited to, a detailed statement of expenditures under each program, a review and evaluation of the Guam Summer Youth Employment Program under the department's sponsorship and recommendations for improving the program.

Section 11. One-half of the appropriation made in Section 8 of this Act shall come from the General Fund and one-half from the Tourist Attraction Fund, notwithstanding any law to the contrary.
