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- (e) 'private citizen' means any natural person other than a peace officer who is actively engaged in the performance of his duties;
- (f) 'relative' means a victim's spouse, parent, grandparent, stepfather, stepmother, child, grandchild, brother, sister, half-brother, half-sister or spouse's parents;
- (3) 'victim' means a person who is injured or killed by any act or omission of any other person coming within the description of any of the crimes specified in Section 5561.10 of this Chapter; and
 - (h) 'person' means a natural person.

Section 3361.2. Creation of the Criminal Injuries
Compensation Commission. There shall be a Criminal Injuries
Compensation Commission which shall be composed of seven (7)
members appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent
of the Legislature. One (1) member of the commission shall
be an attorney who has been admitted to practice in the
territory of Guam for at least five (5) years. No officer
or employee of the territory shall be eligible for appointment to the commission. The commission is placed within the
Department of Law for administrative purposes. Annually,
the members shall elect a chairperson of the commission.

Section 3551.5. Tenure and compensation of members. The term of office of each member of the commission shall be four (4) years or until his successor is appointed

except that (1) the terms of office of the members first taking office shall expire as designated by the Governor at the time of appointment, two (2) on December 31, 1982, two (2) on December 31, 1983, two (2) on December 31, 1984 and one (1) on December 31, 1985; and (2) any member appointed to fill the vacancy occurring prior to the expiration of the term for which his predecessor was appointed, shall be appointed for the remainder of the term. A vacancy in the commission shall not affect its powers. If any member of the commission is unable to act because of absence, illness or other sufficient cause, the Governor may make a temporary appointment, and such appointee shall have all the powers and duties of a regular member of the commission for the period of his appointment.

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Section 3361.4. Powers and procedures of Commission. upon an application made to the commission under this Chapter, the commission shall fix a time and place for a hearing on such application and shall cause notice thereof to be given to the applicant. The commission may hold such hearings, sit and act at such times and places, and take such testimony as the commission may deem advisable. Any four (4) members shall constitute a quorum. The concurring vote of the four (4) members shall be necessary to take any action. Any member of the commission may administer oaths or affirmations to witnesses appearing before the commission. The commission shall have such powers of subpoena and compulsion of attendance of witnesses and production of documents and of examination of witnesses as are conferred upon the Superior Court. Subpoenas shall be issued under the signoture of the chairman. The Superior Court may, upon the

application of the commission, enforce the attendance and testimony of any witness and the production of any documents so subpoensed. Subpoens and witness fees and mileage shall be the same as in criminal cases in the court, and shall be payable from funds appropriated for expenses of administration.

Any other person may appear and be heard who satisfied the commission that he has a substantial interest in the proceedings. In any case in which the person entitled to make an application is a child, the application may be made on his behalf by his parent or legal guardian. Where under this Chapter any person is entitled to appear and be heard by the commission, that person may appear in person or by his attorney. All hearings shall be open to the public unless, in a particular case, the commission determines that the hearing, or a portion thereof, should be held in private, having regard to the fact that the offender has not been convicted or to the interest of the victim of an alleged sexual offense.

the right to produce evidence and to cross examine witnesses.

The commission may receive in evidence any statement, document, information, or matter that may, in the opinion of the

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commission, contribute to its functions under this Chapter, whether or not such statement, document, information, or matter would be admissable in a court of law.

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If any person has been convicted of any offense with respect to an act or ormission on which a claim under this Chapter is based, proof of that conviction shall, unless an appeal against the conviction or a petition for a rehearing in respect of the charge is pending or a new trial or rehearing has been ordered, be taken as conclusive evidence that the offense has been committed.

Section 3361.6. Medical examination. The commission may appoint an impartial licensed physician or examine any person making application under this Chapter, and the fees for the examination shall be paid from funds appropriated for expenses of administration.

Section 3361.7. Attorneys' fees. The commission may, as part of any order entered under this Chapter, determine and allow reasonable attorneys' fees, which if the award of compensation is more than the Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) shall not exceed fifteen per cent (15%) of the award, to be paid out of but not in addition to the award, to the attorneys representing the applicant, provided, that the amount of the attorneys' fees shall not, in any event, exceed the award of compensation remaining after deducting that portion thereof for expenses actually incurred by the claimant.

Amy attorney who charges, demands, receives, or collects for services rendered in connection with any proceedings under this Chapter any amount in excess of that

allowed under this section, if any compensation is paid, shall be fined not note than Two Thousand Bollars (52,000).

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Section 3361.8. Reconsideration by Commission; judicial review. (a) The commission may, at any time, on its own motion or on the application of any person aggrieved by an order or decision of the commission, reconsider the order or decision and revoke, confirm, or vary the order or decision, based upon the findings of the commission.

(b) Any person aggrieved by an order or decision of the commission on the sole ground that the order or decision was in excess of the commission's authority or jurisdiction, shall have a right of appeal to the Superior Court, provided, the appeal is filed within thirty (30) days after service of an original or a certified copy of such order or decision. Except as otherwise provided in this Section, orders and decisions of the commission shall be conclusive and not subject to judicial review.

Section 3361.9. Eligibility for compensation.

- (a) In the event any person is injured or killed by any act or omission of any other person coming within the criminal jurisdiction of the territory after September 30, 1986, which act or omission is within the description of the crimes enumerated in Section 3561.19, the Commission may, in its discretion, upon an application, order the payment of compensation in accordance with this Chapter:
 - (1) to or for the benefit of the victim;
- (2) to any person responsible for the maintenance of the victim, where that person has suffered pecuniary loss or incurred expenses as a result of the victim's injury or death;

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(3) in the case of the death of the victim, to or for the benefit of any one or more of the dependents of 4 the deceased victim; or 3 (4) to a parent of an adult deceased victim, or to an adult son or daughter of a deceased victim, where the parent or adult son or daughter has incurred expenses on account Ö 7 of hospital, medical, funeral and burial expenses as a result of the victim's injury and death. (b) For the purposes of this Chapter, a person shall be deemed to have intentionally committed an act or omission iù notwithstanding that by reason of age, insanity, drunkenness II or otherwise he was legally incapable of forming a criminal 12 15 intent. 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- (11) criminal sexual conduct in the third degree (Criminal and Correctional Code Section 25.25)
- (12) criminal sexual conduct in the fourth degree (Criminal and Correctional Code Section 25.30) and
- (13) assault with intent to commit criminal sexual conduct (Criminal and Correctional Code Section 25.45)
- (b) For the purposes of this Chapter, the operation of a motor vehicle, boat or aircraft that results in an injury or death shall not constitute a crime, unless the injuries were intentionally inflicted through the use of such vehicle, boat or aircraft.
- (c) Any fine imposed pursuant to Section 80.50 of Title 3 of the Guam Code Annotated upon conviction of any of the crimes specified in subsection (a) of this Section shall be paid into the Criminal Injuries Compensation Fund established by Section 3361.18 of the Civil Code.

Section 3361.11. Award of compensation. The commission may order only from available balances in the Criminal Injuries Compensation Fund the payment of compensation under this Chapter for:

- (1) expenses actually and reasonably incurred as a result of the injury or death of the victim;
- (2) loss to the victim of earning power as a result of total or partial incapacity;
- (3) pecuniary loss to the dependents of the deceased victim;
 - (4) pain and suffering to the victim; and
- (5) any other pecuniary loss directly resulting from the injury or death of the victim which the commission determines to be reasonable and proper.

Section 3361.12. Relationship to offender. No compensation shall be awarded, except for expenses specified in Section 3361.14 (1) of this Chapter, if the victim was at the time of his injury or death living with the offender as spouse or as a member of the offender's household.

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Section 3361.13. Recovery from offender. Whenever any person is convicted of an offense that includes any crime enumerated in Section 5561.10 of this Chapter and an order or the payment of compensation is or has been made under this Chapter for injury or death resulting from the act or omission constituting such offense, the commission may institute a derivative action against the person and against any person liable at law on his behalf, in the name of the victim or such of his dependents as have been awarded compensation under this Chapter in the Superior Court for such damages as may be recoverable at common law by the victim or such dependents without reference to the payment of compensation. The court shall have jurisdiction to hear, determine and render judgment in any such action. The time for the occurrence of the act or emission until conviction of the offense and, thereafter, as long as the offender is in confinement for conviction of the offense, shall not constitute any part of the time limited for the commencement of the action by the commission under the applicable statute of limitations. Any recovery in the action shall belong to the territory, provided, that the commission shall amend its order of compensation to provide for the payment of any portion of the recovery in excess of the amount of compensation prescribed in the order to any of the persons entitled to

receive compensation under Section 3361.9 of this Chapter in such proportions and upon such terms as the commission shall deem appropriate.

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Section J361.14. Eligibility for compensation. In the event a private citizen incurs injury or property damage in preventing the commission of a crime within the territory, in apprehending a person who has committed a crime within the territory, or in materially assisting a peace officer who is engaged in the prevention or attempted prevention of such a crime or the apprehension or attempted apprehension of such a person, the commission may, in its discretion, upon an application, order the payment of compensation in accordance with this Chapter:

- (1) to or for the benefit of the private citizen; or
- (2) to any person responsible for the maintenance of the private citizen, where that person has suffered pecuniary loss or incurred expenses as a result of the private citizen's injury.

Section 3361.15. Award of compensation. The commission may order the payment of compensation under this Chapter for:

- (1) expenses actually and reasonably incurred as a result of the injury of the private citizen;
 - (2) pain and suffering to the private citizen;
- (3) loss to the private citizen of earning power as a result of total or partial incapacity; and
- (4) pecuniary loss to the private citizen directly resulting from damage to his property.

provided in this Chapter, any order for the payment of compensation under this Chapter may be made on such terms as the commission deems appropriate. Without limiting the generality of the preceding sentence, the order may provide for apportionment of the compensation, for the holding of the compensation or any part thereof in trust, for the payment of the compensation in a lump sum or periodic installments, and for the payment of compensation for hospital, medical, funeral or burial expenses directly to the person who has provided such services. All such orders shall contain words clearly informing the claimant that all awards and orders for payments under this Chapter are subject to the making of an appropriation by the Legislature to pay the claim, except as otherwise provided in Section 3361.18 of this Unapter.

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Section 3361.17. Limitations upon award of compensation. (a) No order for the payment of compensation shall be made under this Chapter unless the application has been made within eighteen (18) months after the date of injury, death or property damage.

(b) No compensation shall be awarded under this Chapter in an amount in excess of Ten Thousand Bollars (\$10,000).

Section 3561.18. Criminal Injuries Compensation Fund; when payments authorized. (a) There is established a Criminal Injuries Compensation Fund from which the commission may make payments as provided in Subsection (b) of this Section. The Attorney Ceneral shall be the certifying officer of the fund, and all payments therefrom shall be paid by him upon order of the commission.

(b) Where the commission has made an award pursuant to this Chapter, the commission shall make such payments to or on behalf of the victim, or to or for the benefit of one or

for the dependents of a deceased victim, or to or for the benefit of other persons who have suffered pecuniary loss or incurred expenses on account of hospital, medical, funeral or burial expenses as a result of the victim's injury or death. Payments made pursuant to this Section shall not exceed the total amount of the award.

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Section 3361.19. Recovery from collateral source.

(a) In determining the amount of compensation to be awarded under this Chapter, the commission shall deduct amounts or benefits received or to be received from any source, whether from the offender or from any person on behalf of the offender, or from public or private funds, and which amounts or benefits result from or are in any manner, directly or indirectly, attributable to the injury or death which gave rise to the award; provided, that no deduction shall be made for death benefits received or to be received under any insurance policy covering the life of a deceased victim.

(b) Where compensation is awarded under this Chapter and the person receiving same also receives any sum required to be, and that has not been deducted under Subsection (a) of this Section, he shall refund to the territory the lesser of the sum or the amount of the compensation paid to him under this Chapter.

Section 3301.21. Exemption from execution. No compensation payable under this Chapter shall, prior to actual receipt thereof by the person or beneficiary entitled thereto, or their legal representatives, be assignable or subject to execution, garnishment, attachment or other process whatsoever, including process to satisfy an order or

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judgement for support or alimony.

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Section 5361.22. Survival and abatement. The rights to compensation created by this Chapter are personal and shall not survive the death of the person or beneficiary entitled thereto, provided, that if such death occurs after an application for compensation has been filed with the commission, the proceeding shall not abate, but may be continued by the legal representative of the decedent's estate.

Section 3361.23. Rule-making powers. In the performance of its functions, the commission may adopt, amend and repeal rules and regulations, not inconsistent with this Chapter, prescribing the procedures for conducting its business, the procedures to be followed in the filing of applications and the proceedings under this Chapter and such other matters as the commission deems appropriate.

Soction 3361.24. Commission staff. Supervisory, administrative and clerical personnel necessary for the efficient functioning of the commission may be appointed.

Section 5301.25. Annual Report. The Attorney Seneral shall transmit annually to the Governor and to the Legislature a report of the Commission's activities under this Chapter including the name of each applicant, a brief description of the facts in each case, and the amount, if any, of compensation awarded. The Attorney General shall transmit the report, together with a tabulation of the total amount of compensation awarded, and a legislative bill appropriating funds accessary to repleaish the Criminal Injuries Compensation Fund for the compensation awarded."

Section 2. A new Section 9 Government Code Annotated 90.53 is added to read:

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"Section 80.53. When Restitution Required. The court shall require restitution in all cases wherein the offender has been convicted of a crime involving damage to property of the victim when the offender is or, given a fair opportunity to do so, will be able to pay the restitution."

Section 3. Section 9 Government Code Annotated 80.91 is amended to read:

"Section 80.91. In lieu of or in addition to a fine, confinement, or probation, a judge in any felony case where force or violence is not an element of the offense of which the dependant stands convicted, or in any misdemeanor, petty misdemeanor, or violation case, including juvenile cases, but excluding every case in which the offense of which the defendant stands convicted carries a mandatory sentence of confinement or involves damage to property of the victim, may impose a sentence that contains any or all of the following elements:

- (a) Restitution as provided for in Chapter 80 of the Criminal and Correctional Code;
 - (b) Alternative community service; or
- (d) Participation in a solf-improvement and rehabilitative program.

This provision shall not apply to any case in which the crime of which the defendant stands convicted is punishable by fine only."

Section 4. (a) he later than January 1, 1986, the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission shall report to the Governor and and the Legislature its recommendation on continuing the program

providing victims compensation for damages from criminal activities. The Commission shall make recommendations as to any changes in the statute required to improve the program if it favors continuation.

(b) Unless otherwise provided by law, no applications for compensation shall be filed by any person after April 30, 1986.

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(C) Unless otherwise provided by law, Section 1, of this Act shall expire on December 31, 1986. The Commission shall continue in existence until December 31, 1986 for the purpose of winding up its arfairs and disposing of all applications filed before may 1, 1986.
