AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF GOVERNMENT LANDS TO CERTAIN INDIVIDUALS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings. The government of Guam has entered into agreements with certain individuals relative to the transfer of government-owned real property to them. Pursuant to some of the sale agreements, the government has accepted compensation. The enactment of certain laws has prevented the completion of the transactions in a timely manner. Although the Legislature has acted to approve by resolution several of these transactions, the Governor has advised the Legislature that without enactment of further legislation, the commitments will not be honored and transactions will not be completed. In order to fulfill obligations of the government, remedial legislation authorizing the transactions is required.

Section 2. Notwithstanding any other provision of law with respect to the sale of government land including but not limited to the Chamorro Land Trust Act and laws requiring the concurrence of the Legislature in the sale of government land, the Governor shall sell government real property as follows:

Section 3. Notwithstanding any other provision of law with respect to the sale of government land including but not limited to the Chamorro Land Trust Act and laws requiring the concurrence of the Legislature in the sale of government land, the Governor shall sell government real property or exchange government real property with any person, partnership or corporation in accordance with the terms of any agreement entered prior to May 10, 1982, if such transaction was approved by a resolution of the Guam Legislature duly and regularly adopted prior to May 10, 1982.

Any transaction involving the sale or exchange of government owned real property which was entered prior to May 10, 1982 and

approved by a resolution of the Guam Legislature duly and regularly adopted prior to May 10, 1982 which has been finalized, shall be deemed lawful and suthorized by law retroactively to the date of the issuance of the deed by the government.

Section 4. The Governor shall direct the Director of the Department of Land Management and the Attorney General to prepare appropriate deeds and other contracts to consummate the sales of property within thirty (30) days after the receipt of compensation.
