

CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR





AN ACT TO DESIGNATE AS PEACE OFFICERS THE  
PROBATION OFFICERS OF THE SUPERIOR COURT OF  
GUAM.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. New Subsections (k) and (l) are added to Section 5.55 of  
3 Title 8 of the Guam Code Annotated to read:

4 "(k) Probation Officers of the Superior Court of Guam; and

5 (l) Criminal Investigators of the U.S. Government defined as  
6 any individual duly authorized by a department, agency or armed force  
7 of the United States to conduct or engage in investigations of or  
8 prosecutions for violations of the criminal laws of the United States.  
9 Included, but not limited to this subsection, would be Criminal  
10 Investigators of the Drug Enforcement Administration."

11 Section 2. New Items (xii) and (xiii) are added to Subsection (c) of  
12 Section 4020.1 of the Government Code to read:

13 "(xii) Probation Officers of the Superior Court of Guam; and

14 (xiii) Criminal Investigators of the U.S. Government defined as  
15 any individual duly authorized by a department, agency or armed force  
16 of the United States to conduct or engage in investigations of or  
17 prosecutions for violations of the criminal laws of the United States.  
18 Included, but not limited to this subsection, would be Criminal  
19 Investigators of the Drug Enforcement Administration."
