


CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR





Substitute Bill by the
Committee on Ways and Means

Introduced by: F. R. Santos

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FROM THE GENERAL FUND
THE SUM OF TEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$10,000) TO
THE OFFICE OF GUAM'S WASHINGTON DELEGATE AND
FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. A new Chapter II of Title XVI of the Government
Code is hereby enacted to read as follows:

"CHAPTER II

DELEGATE TO CONGRESS

Section 15100. Establishment of Contingency Fund. There is
hereby established a contingency fund which shall be made
available to the Guam Delegate to support the carrying out of
official duties of his office. Upon acceptance of these funds,
the Guam Delegate or his Principal Assistant shall file a
quarterly report with the Director of Administration and the Guam
Legislature itemizing and certifying expenditures made therefrom.
Said funds shall be utilized at the discretion of the Delegate.
Use of said funds shall include official expenditures not regu-
larly or normally provided for by the Congress, including enter-
tainment expenses for official purposes."

Section 2. The sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) is
hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the contingency fund
of the Guam Delegate to the U. S. Congress as provided for in
Section 15100 of the Government Code.

1 Section 3. Section 13 of Public Law 16-105 is amended to
2 read:

3 "Section 13. There is appropriated from the General
4 Fund to the Legislature Ninety-Five Thousand Dollars (\$95,000
5 for the purpose of maintaining the Legislature's membership
6 in the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures and its
7 membership in the Asian Pacific Parliamentarians Union, and
8 in the hosting of the Association of Pacific Island Legis-
9 latures First General Assembly in August 1982 in Guam and
10 Asian Pacific Parliamentarians Union meeting in Guam in
11 1983. The money appropriated by this Section shall be
12 deposited in a special account, separate and apart from
13 other funds of the Legislature and shall be available to
14 the Legislature through February 28, 1983. Any sum not
15 expended or encumbered by that date shall then revert to
16 the General Fund by operation of law."

17 Section 4. From lapse funds appropriated for Merit Awards
18 (Guam) in Section 1 of Public Law 16-106 the University may award
19 an additional scholarship to a qualified graduate of each high
20 school for the graduating classes of 1982 under the terms and
21 conditions set forth in Section 11800 of the Government Code.

22 Section 5. The sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000)
23 is appropriated from the General Fund to the Legislature Opera-
24 tions Fund to establish a contingency fund to give Ten Thousand
25 Dollars (\$10,000) to the Majority Leader and Five Thousand
26 Dollars (\$5,000) to the Minority Leader of the Seventeenth Guam
27 Legislature.

28 Section 6. Section 9 of Public Law 16-125 is amended to
29 read:

1 "Section 9. In furtherance of Section 6 of Public
2 Law 15-110 the sum of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000)
3 is appropriated from the General Fund to the Guam Legislature
4 for the purpose of retaining a law firm specializing in
5 international law with experience necessary to represent
6 the territory in becoming a financial center and for the
7 purpose of lobbying with the appropriate persons in develop-
8 ing a tax policy for Guam."
