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AN ACT TO ADD A NEW CHAPTER V TO TITLE VI OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE TO CREATE AN ECONOMIC PLANNING COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, there is no central body which has overall control and which can establish priorities in these agencies; and

WHEREAS, the Governor's Office should have a formal body to establish economic goals and priorities and a forum for the airing of views; -now,-therefore,

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. A new Chapter V is added to Title VI of the Government Code to read:

"CHAPTER V

Economic Planning Council

Section 5250. Creation: Composition. There is within the Office of the Governor an 'Economic Planning Council' to be comprised of nine (9) members. Of the nine (9) members, four (4) members shall be selected by the Governor from among those who head the following agencies: the Department of Commerce, the Department of Agriculture, the Guam Economic Development Authority, the Guam Housing and Urban Renewal Authority, the Guam Housing Corporation, the Department of Labor, the Agency for Human Resources Development, the Bureau of Budget and Management Research, the Department of Revenue and Taxation, the Guam Mass Transit Authority, the Guam Airport Authority, the Port Authority of Guam, the Guam Community College, the University of Guam, the Guam

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Advisory Council on Vocational Education, the Central Planning Council, the Bureau of Planning and the Guam Visitors Bureau. In addition to the agency members, there shall be four (4) members from the business community and community-at-large chosen by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Legislature. The ninth member of the Council shall be chosen by the other eight (8) members. The non-agency members shall receive the sum of Fifty Dollars (\$50) for each attendance at a meeting of the Council, not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100) per month.

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23 24 Section 5251. Purpose. The Council shall undertake an economic program of the territory for the purpose of formulating a short-and-long-range economic master plan for the territory which shall be approved by the Governor and transmitted to the Legislature for approval by resolution. The Council shall monitor the approved progress of the program and report any actions of nonconforming and/or noncooperative governmental agencies to the Governor and the Legislature.

Section 5252. The Governor is authorized to designate appropriate governmental agencies to provide office space, clerical, and professional assistance to the Council.

Section 5253. The Council shall have the authority to recommend policy guidelines for any government agencies necessary to be in conformity to the economic program adopted by Section 5201 of this Chapter.
