


CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR



AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 4 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED
RELATIVE TO REQUIRING THAT THE TERMS OF
UNCLASSIFIED EMPLOYEES OF THE GOVERNMENT BE
AT THE PLEASURE OF THE APPOINTING AUTHORITIES
AND TO FORBID THE EXECUTION OF CONTRACTS AND
FILLING OF SUCH POSITIONS.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. A new Section 2106 is added to Title 4 Guam
3 Code Annotated to read:

4 "Section 2106. Duration of Appointments. All employ-
5 ment within the unclassified service of the Government of
6 Guam including autonomous and semi-autonomous agencies where
7 no specific term of appointment or employment is specified
8 in law shall be at the pleasure of the appointing authority.
9 No employment agreement, however described, shall provide
10 for any other term, nor shall such agreement prohibit the
11 appointing authority from exercising its pleasure in
12 terminating said employment agreement. Any terms in conflict
13 with this Section in any employment agreement executed
14 after the effective date of this Section shall be null and
15 void from the beginning."

16 Section 2. A new Section 2107 is added to Title 4 Guam Code
17 Annotated to read:

18 "Section 2107. Employment Contracts - When Forbidden.
19 No contract of employment shall be entered into between any
20 employee, in the unclassified service within the Government
21 of Guam unless such employment contract is specifically
22 permitted by law.

1 Such employment shall be effected through the standard
2 form of personnel action. This Section shall not affect
3 the ability of the government to contract for temporary
4 services or for specific contracts not involving an employ-
5 ment relationship with the government."

6 Section 3. Sections 12 and 13 of Public Law 16-80 are
7 hereby repealed.
