



CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR





AN ACT TO AMEND THE PROVISIONS OF LAW  
RELATIVE TO ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION PROGRAMS  
IN THE SECONDARY SCHOOLS OF GUAM.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:  
2 Section 1. Section 11999.15 of the Government Code (which is codified  
3 as Section 42101 of Title 17 of the Guam Code Annotated) is amended to  
4 read:

5 "Section 11999.15 (42101). Definitions. As used in this Chapter:  
6 (a) 'student' means a student enrolled or accepted for enrollment  
7 in an alternative education program; and  
8 (b) 'alternative education program' or 'program' means a wide  
9 ranging system of alternative programs significantly different from the

1 conventional curricula of the public secondary school system which is  
2 open to students on an optional basis.

3 Section 2. Section 11999.16 of the Government Code (which is codified  
4 as Section 42102 of Title 17 of the Guam Code Annotated) is amended to  
5 read:

6 "Section 11999.16 (42102). Organization. The Territorial Board  
7 of Education shall promulgate policies, rules and regulations governing  
8 the alternative education program."

9 Section 3. Section 11999.19 of the Government Code (which is codified  
10 as Section 42105 of Title 17 of the Guam Code Annotated) is amended to  
11 read:

12 "Section 11999.19 (42105). Community Involvement. The  
13 Territorial Board of Education shall endeavor to obtain the  
14 participation of the community as a major part of the alternative  
15 education program. This participation shall consist among other  
16 things, the utilization of community resources in employment, and  
17 on-the-job training, and the use of parents, professionals,  
18 technicians, clergy, government leaders and other talented members of  
19 the community of teachers or resource personnel in the education and  
20 training of students in the program."

21 Section 4. Section 11999.20 of the Government Code (which is codified  
22 as Section 42106 of Title 17 of the Guam Code Annotated) is amended to  
23 read:

24 "Section 11999.20 (42106). Designation. The Territorial Board of  
25 Education shall designate the school(s) for the implementation of the  
26 alternative education program."

27 Section 5. Section 11999.21 of the Government Code (which is codified  
28 as Section 42107 of Title 17 of the Guam Code Annotated) is amended to  
29 read:

30 "Section 11999.21 (42107). Funding. The Territorial Board of  
31 Education shall prepare a budget for implementation of the alternative  
32 education program and submit same to the Legislature no later than six  
33 (6) months before the beginning of each academic year."

1           Section 6. Section 19541.0104 of the Government Code is amended to  
2 read:

3           "Section 19541.0104. Provided, that a manufacturer or producer,  
4 other than a manufacturer of alcoholic beverages, engaging in the  
5 business of selling his products to manufacturers, wholesalers,  
6 licensed retailers, or persons actually selling the products to the  
7 United States government, shall not be required to pay the tax  
8 imposed in this Act for the privilege of selling such products at  
9 wholesale. Nor shall any such manufacturer or producer, other than a  
10 manufacturer of alcoholic beverages, be required to pay the tax  
11 imposed in this Act for the privilege of selling products for delivery to  
12 the purchaser outside of Guam."
