AN ACT TO REPEAL SECTION 1020 AND TO ADD A NEW SECTION 42020 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE TO DESIGNATE THE NIEVES FLORES MEMORIAL LIBRARY AS THE TERRITORIAL DEPOSITORY FOR ALL GOVERNMENTAL DOCUMENTS OF THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. Section 1020 of the Government Code is repealed. Section 2. A new Section 42020 is added to the Government Code to

read:

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"Section 42020. Governmental Depository. The Nieves M. Flores Memorial Library is designated the depository for all government publications including any printed or processed paper, book, periodical, pamphlet or map, originating in, or printed with the imprint of, or at the expense and by the authority of the government of Guam."

Section 3. The sum of Forty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$45,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Public Utility Agency of Guam for the purpose of extending the sewer line from Route 10, Tai, Mangilao to the neighborhood of the Infant of Prague Nursery, and Mercy Convent to service the twenty (20) families living in the area.

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Section 4. Subsection (b) of Section 11102 of the Government Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

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The Student member shall be a public school freshman, "(b) sophomore or junior at the time of his selection and shall serve for a term of one (1) year beginning at 12 o'clock noon on June first of the year in which he is selected. The Student member shall be selected by a plurality vote of freshmen, sophomores, juniors, and seniors attending public schools, voting in an election held in all the public high schools on one day in May of each year. This selection shall be supervised by the Director in cooperation with student governing bodies. Any student member candidate must be nominated by a petition signed by one hundred (100) freshmen, sophomores, juniors, and seniors from the public schools. No student may be a candidate if he is under suspension or on academic probation at the time of his nomination. Any vacancy during the term of a student member shall be filled for the remainder of the term by appointment by the Guam Youth Congress."
