AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE OPERATION OF THE SEVENTEENTH GUAM LEGISLATURE AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. The sum of Four Million Nine Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$4,950,000.00), of which Seven Hundred Thousand Collars (\$700,000) shall be for the operation of the Minority Offices, is appropriated from the General Fund to the Legislature Operations Fund for the operation of the Seventeenth Guam Legislature and for the Office of the Suruhanu. The funds for the operations of the Office of the Suruhanu shall be allocated by the Committee on Rules.

Section 2. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary any appropriation made to the Seventeenth Guam Legislature for use in the First Session as previously allocated by the Committee on Rules shall continue to be available during the Second Session.

Section 3. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary any appropriation made to the Office of the Suruhanu for the calendar year 1983 shall continue to be available for said Office during calendar year 1984.

Section 4. The sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Legislature Operations Fund for the Association of Pacific Island Legislators.

Section 5. The sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Legislature Operations Fund for the Asian Pacific Parliamentarians Union.

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Section 6.

Subsection (k) of Section 53552 of the Government Code, codified as Section 2103, 12 Guam Code Annotated is amended to read: The Corporation shall act as a central financial manager consultant those agencies or for instrumentalities Government requiring financial guidance and assistance. Such technical assistance by the Corporation shall include but not be limited to obtaining of funds through bond or other obligations, structuring such bond issuances, preparation and dissemination of financial and investment information, including bond prospectuses, development of interest among investment bankers and bond brokers, maintenance of relationships with bond rating agencies and brokerage houses and, generally, acting as the centralized and exclusive financial planner and investment banker for all the agencies and instrumentalities of the Covernment. purposes of this Subsection, For lagencies instrumentalities of the Government' include but are not limited to such public corporations as the Guam Economic Development Authority, the Port Authority of Guam, the Guam Airport Authority, the Guam Telephone Authority, the Guam Power Authority, the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority, the University of Guam, and all other agencies or instrumentalities of the Government given the power, now or in the future, to issue and sell bonds or other obligations for the purpose of raising funds. Such agencies and instrumentalities of the Government shall issue bonds and other obligations only by means of and through agency of Corporation, the and each such agency instrumentality shall furnish the Corporation long-term estimates of financial needs so that the Corporation can coordinate a long-term plan cbtaining necessary funds for all such agencies instrumentalities on a rational, noncompetitive and efficient basis. Corporation shall not issue or sell any bond without the approval of the Legislature of the terms and conditions of the issuance of the The failure of the Legislature to adopt a resolution rejecting the terms and conditions of the issuance of the bonds within forty-five (45) calendar days of the date of its submission to the Legislative Secretary shall be concurrence to the issuance of the bonds.

purposes of this Subsection, the terms 'bonds or other obligations' does not include an instrument evidencing debt for a term of one (1) year or less. This Section shall not apply to obligations which are sold by an agency of the Government of the United States. The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to bonds or other obligations issued pursuant to Article V of this chapter on or before March 31, 1984."

Section 7. Section 17 of Chapter 2 of P. L. 17-25 is amended as follows:

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"Section 17. Payment of medical bills by the Department of Public Health and Social Services for the indigent shall not begin prior to December 1, 1983, but may be applied to any covered service rendered during the current fiscal year. The administrative funds, not to exceed ten percent (10%) of the \$2.3 million allotted for that program, shall be immediately available for program planning and development. For the period of October 1, 1983 to March 1, 1984 the program shall provide coverage for the same services as in the Medicaid Program, except that coverage for off-island care may be authorized by the Any subsequent change in services to be covered shall be made according to provisions of the Administrative Adjudication Act." Section I of Part XXXIV of Section 5 of Chapter 1 of the General Appropriations Act of 1984 as added by Section 4 of P.L. 17-26 is amended to read:

"Section 9100. Legislative Intent. Recently the Guam District Court ruled that the Guam Visitors Bureau is a private entity contrary to the general understanding of the Legislature. It is the intent of the Legislature to continue, without interruption, the current acts and actions of the Guam Visitors Bureau and to clarify its legal status, duties, powers and the status of its employees."

Section 10. Subsection (c) of Section 9114 of Title 12 of the Guam Code Annotated is amended to read:

existing Guam Visitors Bureau shall call and conduct a meeting of contributing members no later than December 28, 1983 to elect elected directors to serve for a two-year term commencing January 9, 1984. For the first election contributing members who have paid contributions for the 1984 annual period on or before December 14, 1983, shall be entitled to one (1) vote for each \$100 contributed up to a maximum of ten (10) votes. No contributing member may first meeting. The quorum for the first meeting shall be at least fifty percent (50%) of votes of contributing members. The four persons receiving the four highest number of votes shall be elected. In case of a tie, a run-off shall be held."
