


CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR



AN ACT TO ENACT TITLE XIV, CHAPTER VII OF THE
GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM RELATIVE TO LAND
USE PERMITS.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:
2

3 Section 1. Section 13600 of the Government Code is enacted to read:

4 "Section 13600. Use Permits. (a) The Director with the
5 approval of the Governor is authorized to grant permits for the use of
6 any suitable government real property, not otherwise occupied or in
7 use, for any lawful purposes except agriculture.

8 (b) Such permits shall be granted for a period not exceeding
9 two (2) years.

10 (c) No such person shall use or occupy under any such permit
11 more than one (1) acre.

12 (d) The Department shall collect a reasonable charge from each
13 permit holder based upon the fair market value of the land and the
14 use made thereof.

15 (e) The form of such permits shall be prescribed by the
16 Attorney General.

17 (f) The Director, with the approval of the Governor, shall make
18 such reasonable rules, not inconsistent with the foregoing provisions
19 of this section, governing the qualifications for, applications for an
20 issuance of such permits, the terms and conditions thereof, the
21 changes to be collected therefor, supervision of operations thereunder,
22 and enforcement of the terms thereof as may be necessary or desirable
23 to the efficient administration of the program and in the public
interest."

1 Section 2. Section 13601 of the Government Code is enacted to read:

2 "Section 13601. Use Permits: Civic purposes. (a) The Director
3 may, with the approval of the Governor, grant permits for the
4 temporary use of government real property and structures, not
5 otherwise occupied or used by the government, by civic leagues or
6 organizations not organized for profit as defined by Section 501(c)(4)
7 of the Guam Territorial Income Tax Law (Internal Revenue Code as
8 made applicable to Guam by virtue of Section 31 of the Organic Act).

9 (b) Such permits shall be granted for a period not exceeding
10 two (2) years.

11 (c) Such permits may be issued on a nominal-charge basis, but
12 the permit holder shall in every case be responsible for all utilities
13 and maintenance.

14 (d) The form of such permits shall be prescribed by the
15 Attorney General.

16 (e) The Director, with the approval of the Governor, shall make
17 such reasonable rules, not inconsistent with the foregoing provisions
18 of this section, governing the qualifications for, applications for and
19 issuance of such permits, the terms and conditions thereof, the
20 charges to be collected therefor, supervision of operation thereunder,
21 and enforcement of the terms thereof as may be necessary or desirable
22 to the efficient administration of the program and in the public
23 interest."
