AN ACT TO AMEND PUBLIC LAWS 16-23 AND 16-41 RELATIVE TO CLASSIFIED POSITIONS AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:
Section 1. Title 4 Guam Code Annotated, Section 4102(a)(11) is
repealed and reenacted to read:

"(11) all legislative employees;"

Section 2. Title 4 Guam Code Annotated, Section 4102(b) is repealed and reenacted to read:

"(b) The classified service shall include all other positions in the government of Guam."

Section 3. The opening paragraph of Title 4 Guam Code Annotated Section 4104, is amended to read:

"Section 4104. Departmental Personnel Rules. Rules subject to criteria established by this Chapter governing the selection, promotion, performance evaluation, demotion, suspension and other disciplinary action, shall be adopted by the Board of Directors for the Guam Airport Authority, Board of Directors for Guam Economic Development Authority, Board of Directors for Guam Housing Corporation, Board of Commissioners for Guam Housing and Urban Renewal Authority, Judicial Council, the Board of Directors of the Guam Telephone Authority, the Board of Directors of the Guam Power

Authority, the Board of Education, the Board of Regents of the University of Guam, the Guam Community College Board of Trustees and by the Board of Trustees of the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority with respect to agencies or their respective branches, within matters personnel departments, and by the Director of Administration as to all other executive Such rules shall, to the extent practicable, provide branch employment. standard conditions for entry into and other matters concerning the government service. The personnel rules adopted for University of Guam, Guam Airport Authority, Guam Telephone Authority, Port Authority of Guam, Guam Power Authority, Department of Education, Guam Memorial Hospital Authority and by the Director of Administration shall require that all their classified employee appeals be heard by the Givil Service Commission. The personnel rules adopted for the Judiciary Branch by the Judicial Council shall require that all their classified employee appeals be heard by the Council. Personnel rules governing any other Executive Branch entities may require that their classified employee appeals be Rules concerning the Executive heard by the Civil Service Commission. Branch shall take effect upon their approval by the Civil Service Commission, by Executive Order of the Governor and filing with Legislative Rules concerning the Judicial Branch shall take effect upon adoption by the Judicial Council of Guam."

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Section 4. Title 4 Guam Code Annotated, Section 4134(e)(2) is amended to read:

interest in any firm, partnership, business or corporation which contracts with the government, at the time of submission of bids or commencement of negotiations as the case may be, shall file a statement under oath with the Director of Administration for Executive Branch employees, and the Court Administrator for Judiciary employees describing such interest. Any such statement shall also be given to the department head of such employee and shall also be a public record for all purposes."

Section 5. Title 4 Guam Code Annotated, Section 4134(f) is amended to read:

"(f) Failure by an officer or employee to comply with any of the

provisions of Subsection (e) of this Section shall be grounds for dismissal from government service and the Director of Administration or Court Administrator, as the case may be, shall order the compensation stopped of any officer or employee found to be in violation."

Section 6. Section 1016 of the Government Code is repealed and reenacted to read:

"Section 1016. Legislative staff: employment and conditions thereof. (a) The Legislature, in addition to the attaches referred to in Section 1010 of this Chapter, may employ such other employees as it may from time to time require. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Personnel Law and the Compensation Law, the methods of appointment and promotion and the compensation, tenure, leave and other conditions of employment of such employees and attaches shall be such as the Legislature may from time to time fix by its Standing Rules or by resolution.

- (b) The Committee on Rules shall certify the amount of compensation due such employees and attaches in accordance with the said Standing Rules or resolution of the Legislature and the disbursing officer of the Legislature shall thereupon pay the same in accordance with said certification.
- (c) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, and to provide for an orderly transition from one Legislature to another, it shall be the duty and obligation of all attaches and employees of the Legislature, to remain at their posts and perform their duties until otherwise relieved or until their services are terminated by an incoming Legislature. The chairman of the Rules Committee of an outgoing Legislature, within ten (10) days following the declaration of results and issuance of certificates of election under the Election Law, shall account for and effect the orderly turn-over of legislative keys and other property, records and files to the Legislator designated for the purpose by the majority of the incoming Legislators."

Section 7. Section 17 of Public Law 16-23 is amended to read:

"Section 17. The Civil Service Commission may approve temporary rules and regulations necessary for the implementation of this Act which shall remain in effect no later than June 30, 1982, governing those Executive Branch entities which have not previously adopted personnel.

rules which were approved by the Commission. The Administrative Adjudication Act shall not govern the adoption of the temporary rules and regulations which need not be issued as an Executive Order of the Governor. The existing personnel rules for the Judicial Branch as adopted by the Judicial Council shall continue to govern Judicial Branch classified employees."

Section 8. Section 19 of Public Law 16-41 is repealed.

Section 9. Section 20 of Public Law 16-41 is repealed.

Section 10. Any employee occupying a classified position which becomes an unclassified position by virtue of the provisions of this Act shall become an unclassified employee of the government of Guam.

Section 11. Section 16 of Public Law 16-120 is amended to read:

"Section 16. The sum of Eight Hundred Sixty-Five Thousand One
Hundred Seventy-One Dollars (\$865,171) is appropriated from the General
Fund to the Legislative Operations Fund for the personnel services to be
rendered by central staff employees of the Legislative Branch during 1983.
Positions funded by the appropriation shall not be filled as vacancies occur
nor shall the funds be expended for whatever purposes. Any lapse funds
as a result of the conversion from classified to unclassified within the
Legislative Branch shall revert to the General Fund."

Section 12. A new subsection (h) is added to Title 4 Guam Code
Annotated, Section 4172:

"(h) The provisions of this section shall not apply to the Judiciary or Legislature in compliance with the doctrine of separation of powers unless such separate branch opts to make them applicable by submitting to the jurisdiction of the Civil Service Commission. All reference to classified employees will be deemed to mean Classified employees of the Executive Branch including agencies and authorities."

Section 13. Section 8 of Public Law 17-4 is amended to read:

"Section 8. There shall be no reduction in force by any government of Guam department, bureau, or agency which includes autonomous agencies or other instrumentalities of the Executive Branch of the government of Guam until such time as the particular department, bureau or agency implements a layoff, demotion, or salary reduction

procedure, which among other considerations adopted by the Civil Service Commission shall be based upon employee efficiency and seniority. The provisions of this Section shall be effective retroactive to February 1, 1983 and any employee laid off or whose salary was reduced shall be reinstated or salary increased to the position or level they occupied or received on February 1, 1983."

Section 14. Section 14010(c) of Public Law 13-87 is amended to read:

"Section 14010(c). Notwithstanding any other provision of law,
the manager, assistant manager, the manager's secretary, the comptroller and assistant comptroller shall be within the unclassified service of the government of Guam and shall be hired, compensated and employed under the terms and conditions fixed by and at the pleasure of the Board."

Section 15. Severability. If a part of this Act is invalid, all valid parts that are severable from the invalid part remain in effect. If a part of this Act is invalid in one or more of its applications, the part remains in effect in all valid applications that are severable from the invalid application.
