

CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR





AN ACT MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE STUDENT  
FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM, THE TEACHER  
TRAINING SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM, AND THE NURSES  
TRAINING PROGRAM AT THE UNIVERSITY OF GUAM,  
AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM

2 Section 1. There is hereby appropriated from the General Fund of  
3 Government of Guam the sum of One Million Three Hundred Eighty-e  
4 Thousand Nine Hundred Twenty-eight Dollars [\$1,388,928] to the Star  
5 Financial Assistance Fund established under Section 15103, Title 17, G  
6 and administered by the Board of Regents of the University of Guam, t  
7 expended as follows:

8 (a) Professional/Technical Awards	\$349,354
9 (b) Student Loans	384,490
10 (c) Merit Awards (Guam Residents)	657,999

1 (d) Merit Awards (Northern Marianas Citizens) 8,698

2 (e) Merit Awards (Trust Territory Citizens) 8,387

3 Section 2. Pursuant to Section 15103, Title 17, GCA,  
4 appropriations made under Section 1 of this Act shall supplement  
5 unexpended balance of Two Hundred Twenty-Two Thousand Nine Hundred  
6 Twelve Dollars (\$222,912) in the Student Financial Assistance Fund  
7 including repayments to the Fund.

8 Section 3. There is hereby appropriated from the General Fund of  
9 Government of Guam the sum of Three Hundred Thirty-Eight Thousand  
10 Hundred Twelve Dollars (\$338,212) for the Teacher Training Scholars  
11 Program and the Nurses Training Program at the University of Guam  
12 established under Sections 18102 and 19102, respectively, in Title 17, GCA  
13 to be expended as follows:

14 (a) Teacher Training Scholarship Program \$308,212

15 (b) Nurses Training Program 30,000

16 Section 4. The appropriations made under this Act shall be for  
17 period commencing August 1, 1984 and ending July 31, 1985, and shall  
18 be subject to any allotment reserve that could be imposed by the Bureau  
19 Budget and Management Research.

20 Section 5. There is hereby appropriated to the Land Acquisition  
21 Fund, Section 13978 of the Government Code of Guam the sum of  
22 Hundred Seventy-Seven Thousand Four Hundred Twenty Dollars (\$177,420)  
23 for the following purposes:

24 (a) To Antonio C. Rosario and Magdalena B.  
25 Rosario for Lot No. 5384-3, Mangilao \$103,627.00

26 (b) To Nicolas F. Campos and Francis T.  
27 Campos for Lot No. 239-NEW-1-1, Mangilao 15,520.00

28 (c) To Juan G. Cruz for Lot No. 3274-3G, Ordot 25,000.00

29 (d) To Maria U. Aflague for Lot No. 8-3G,  
30 Tract 1919, Sinajana 7,362.00

31 (e) To Fred A. Natividad and Remedios C.  
32 Natividad for Lot No. 3339-6-16, Sinajana 13,813.00

33 (f) To Jesus M. Salas for Lot No. 3339-8-1G,  
34 Sinajana 10,348.00

1 (g) To Robert R. Ventura for the survey of

2 Lot No. 8-R2, Tract 1919, Sinajana 1,750.00

3 Section 6. The sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) is  
4 hereby appropriated from the General Fund from fees received pursuant to  
5 Section 19200 of the Government Code (P.L. 17-56) to pay for temporary  
6 drainage access for three (3) years in the village of Agat by allowing the  
7 Government of Guam to obtain a three-year lease of land for a culvert from  
8 the existing roadway to the river behind Lot No. 170-1-NEW-2 in the village  
9 of Agat. This lease should contain an option to renew for an additional  
10 two-year term with an escalation cost of the lease to be negotiated between  
11 private property owners involved and the Government of Guam.

12 Section 7. The sum of Thirty-Six Thousand Dollars (\$36,000.00) is  
13 appropriated from the Tourist Attraction Fund to the Department of Parks  
14 and Recreation to replenish the Off-island Sports Travel Fund.

15 Section 8. There is hereby appropriated from the General Fund the  
16 sum of Nine Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$9,500) to compensate the  
17 estate of Jose T. Tajalle for his services to the government as Acting  
18 Municipal Commissioner of Merizo for the period January 6, 1977 through  
19 September 26, 1977.

20 Section 9. Section 11819 of the Government Code (17 GCA Section  
21 15501) is amended to read:

22 "Section 11819 (15501). Awards for Citizens of the Region.  
23 There are established six (6) annual merit awards to the University of  
24 Guam for high school students in the graduated classes of the several  
25 public and private high schools in the region. Two awards shall be  
26 granted to citizens of the Republic of Palau, two awards shall be  
27 granted to citizens of the Republic of the Marshall Islands and two  
28 awards shall be granted to citizens of the Federated States of  
29 Micronesia. Applicants for such awards shall have completed four (4)  
30 years of high school of which at least the last full academic year shall  
31 have been in his home country. The students given this award must  
32 attain an overall grade point average of 3.0. The Board shall select  
33 annually the recipients of the awards, such selection to be based on
