AN ACT TO AMEND SUBSECTIONS (b) AND (d) OF SECTION 4211, SUBSECTION (b) OF SECTION 4217.1, SECTIONS 4207.9, 4212.2 AND SUBSECTION (b) OF SECTION 4219 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE (4 GCA \$\$8122(b), 8122(d), 8135(b), 8113, 8125, AND 8137(b)), TO REPEAL AND REENACT SECTION 4212 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE (4 GCA \$8123), TO ADD A NEW 4 GCA \$8120.1, AND REPEAL SECTION 3 OF P.L. 14-119 TO INCREASING ANNUITIES FOR RELATIVE BENEFICIARIES OF THE RETIREMENT FUND, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Subsection (b) of Section 4211 of the Government Code (4 Section 1. GCA \$8122(b)) is amended to read:

"(b) Automatic increases in annuity. Effective July 1, 1984 any member who retired from service and who after Sept. 1, 1972 is entitled to receive benefits under this Chapter shall receive each year on the anniversary date of his retirement or entitlement, an automatic increase in his annual annuity, to be computed as follows:

3 annual increase of Six Hundred Dollars (\$600). 4 2. Members receiving an annual annuity of more than Three Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$3,500) but not more than Six 5 Thousand Three Hundred Dollars (\$6,300) shall receive an 7 automatic annual increase of Four Hundred Dollars (\$400). 3. Members receiving an annual annuity of more than Six 8 Thousand Three Hundred Dollars (\$6,300) but not more than Ten 9 10 Thousand One Hundred Dollars (\$10,100) shall receive an 11 automatic annual increase of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300). 12 4. Members receiving an annual annuity of more than Ten 13 Thousand One Hundred Dollars (\$10,100) shall receive automatic annual increase of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200). 14 15 Subsection (d) of Section 4211 of the Government Code (4 16 GCA §8122 (d)) is amended to read: 17 Automatic increases in Recomputed Annuities. Any 18 Annuitant who has had his basic annuity recomputed pursuant to 19 Subsection (c) of this Section shall on July 1, 1984 and each year 20 thereafter receive an automatic increase in his annual annuity as 21 computed in subsection (b) of this Section." 22 Section 3. Subsection (b) of Section 4217.1 of the Government Code 23 (4 GCA §8135 (b)) to read: 24 "(b) Automatic increase in annuity. Effective July 1, 1984, any 25 survivor annuitant who first becomes entitled to receive benefits after 26 September 1, 1972 shall receive, each year on the anniversary date of 27 his retirement or entitlement, an automatic increase in his annual 28 annuity, to be computed as follows: 29 Survivor annuitants receiving an annual annuity of 30 Three Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$3,500) or less shall 31 receive an automatic annual increase of Six Hundred Dollars

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(\$600).

1. Members receiving an annual annuity of Three Thousand -

Five Hundred Dollars (\$3,500) or less shall receive an automatic

2. Survivor annuitants receiving an annual annuity of more than Three Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$3,500) but not more than Six Thousand Three Hundred Dollars (\$6,300), shall receive an automatic annual increase of Four Hundred Dollars (\$400).

- 3. Survivor annuitants receiving an annual annuity of more than Six Thousand Three Hundred Dollars (\$6,300) but not more than Ten Thousand One Hundred Dollars (\$10,100), shall receive an automatic annual increase of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300); and
- 4. Survivor annuitants receiving an annual annuity of more than Ten Thousand One Hundred Dollars (\$10,100) shall receive an automatic annual increase of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200)." Section 4. Section 4207.9 of the Government Code (4 GCA \$8113) is

Section 4. Section 4207.9 of the Government Code (4 GCA \$8113) is amended to read:

"Subsection 4207.9 (58113). Credit for Education. Any bena fide resident of Guam, who receives his graduate or undergraduate degree from an accredited institution and is employed by the Government of Guam after obtaining such degree, may claim retirement credit equal to the period of time, including vacations, which a full-time student would normally take to complete the program leading to the degree he received, or any lesser period he may elect to claim, by paying to the Fund the appropriate member's and employer's shares based on the period of credit sought to be obtained and his salary when he begins employment with the Government of Guam; provided, however, that this section shall apply only to those persons:

- (a) who were bona fide residents of Guam at the time they began their undergraduate studies; and
- (b) who had been employed by the Government for at least ten (10) years as full time, locally hired employees."
- Section 5. Subsection (a) of Section 4212 of the Government Code (4 GCA \$4123(a)) is amended to read:

"Section 4212 (\$8123) Disability. (a) A member less than sixty-five (65) years of age, who shall become totally and permanently disabled for service, either mentally or physically, regardless of how

or where the disability shall have occurred, shall be entitled to a disability retirement annuity provided that he is not receiving disability payments from the United States Government for substantially the same ailment; and further provided that, to be eligible for a disability retirement annuity from a non-occupational cause, he shall have had at least six (6) years of creditable service in the government of Guam prior thereto. A total and permanent disability for the purposes of this Chapter is one which results from some impairment of body or mind that substantially precludes a person from performing with reasonable regularity the substantial and material parts of any gainful work or occupation that he would be competent to perform were it not for that impairment, and if founded upon conditions which for that impairment, and if founded upon conditions which render it reasonably certain that it will continue indefinitely."

Section 6. Section 4212.2 of the Government Code (4 GCA #8125) is amended to read:

"\$4212.2 (\$8125). Same. Amount of Annuity. The amount of disability retirement annuity shall be sixty-six and two-thirds percent (66 2/3%) based on the average of the three highest annual salaries received by a member during his years of credited service. As used in this Section 'annual salary' means the base pay for which the members contributed to the Fund as required in Item (1), (2) or (3) of \$8136(a) of this Chapter and any pay for which the member paid into the Fund in accordance with Item (4) of \$8136(a) of this Chapter."

Section 7. Section 3 of Public Law 14-119 is repealed.

Section 8. A new Section 4 GCA \$8120.1 is added to read:

"\$8120.1. Same. With the exception of members of the Fund prior to the effective date of this Section, any member of the Fund may retire:

(a) On a service retirement annuity, upon written application to and approval of the Board; provided that such member shall have attained at least sixty-five (65) years of age or sixty (60) years of

age in the case of a member of the uniformed personnel, and shall have completed at least fifteen (15) years of total service;

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- (b) if he or she is a member of the uniformed personnel he or she shall, upon retirement, be placed one rank grade above that held by him on the date of retirement;
- (c) if he or she has completed thirty (30) years of service he or she may retire and shall be entitled to full retirement annuity.
- (d) at his option, whether active or inactive, he or she may retire after twenty-five (25) years of service regardless of age. The retirement annuity for any employee or member described in this Paragraph shall be reduced one quarter (1/4) of one percent (1%) for each month such employees or member is under the age of sixty-five (65) years, from the amount determined for such employee or member as hereinafter provided."

Section 9. Section 4212.4 of the Government Code (4 GCA \$\$127) is repealed and reenacted to read:

Resumption of Employment. (a) "Section 4212.4. Same: least once each year during the first five (5) years following the allowance of a disability annuity to any member, and at least once in every three-year period thereafter, the Board of Trustees shall require any disability annuitant to undergo a medical examination to be made at a place mutually agreed upon, by a physician or physicians engaged by the Board. If any examination indicates that the annuitant is no longer physically or mentally incapacitated for service, or that he is engaged or is able to engage in a gainful occupation, payments of the disability annuity by the Fund shall be discontinued as soon as the disability annuitant is reinstated to the payroll, but in no case shall payments be made for more than sixty (60) days after physicians engaged by the Board find the annuitant is no longer incapacitated for service."

(b) Should the annuitant become able to resume a gainful occupation and his earnings therefrom be less than his salary at the date of retirement or that salary currently paid for similar positions, whichever is lower, the Board shall continue the disability allowance in

an amount which added to his earnings from a gainful occupation, shall not exceed his salary at the date of retirement or the salary currently paid for similar positions, whichever is lower."

Section 10. Subsection (b) of Section 4219 (4 GCA #8137(b)) is amended to read:

 "(b) An amount resulting from the application of a rate percent of total salaries of all members which will amortize the remaining liability for prior service over the remainder of a specified period, as determined by the Board upon recommendation of the actuary, but not to exceed a period of eighty (80) years following the operative date. From July 1, 1955, to August 30, 1972 the rate of contribution shall be not less than one and three hundred seventeen thousandths percent (1.317%) of the total salaries of the members participating in the fund. From September 1, 1972 the rate of contributions shall be not less than one and four hundred and seven thousandths percent (1.407%) of the total salaries of the members participating in the fund.

The amount of contributions by the government shall be determined by applying the applicable percentage rate of contributions as hereinabove prescribed to the total salaries paid to the members during each payroll period, and such amounts shall be paid into the fund following the close of each payroll period, concurrently with the contributions made to the fund by members."

Section 11. A new Subsection (q) is added to 4 GCA Section 8104 to read:

"(q) 'join the Fund' means the act of the employee in making his or her first contribution to the Fund regardless of whether he or she later separates from the government as long as he or she does not withdraw his contribution. If a member withdraw his contributions after separation from government service then 'join the Fund' means his act of making a contribution after rehire."
