
CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR



AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR FULL IMPLEMENTATION OF  
THE HIGH SCHOOL CURRICULUM AND TO PROVIDE  
SUFFICIENT TEXTBOOKS AND OTHER SUPPLIES, AND  
FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 3120.1 is hereby added to Title 17, Chapter 3  
3 Guam Code Annotated to read:

4 "Section 3120.1. Sufficient textbooks and other supplies.  
5 Pursuant to the authority and power established by Section 3120(a)  
6 and Section 3118 of this Chapter, the Board shall provide textbooks in  
7 sufficient quantities so as to assure that each student is assigned an  
8 adopted appropriate individual textbook for each subject in which the  
9 student is enrolled. Sufficient laboratory equipment and supplies shall  
10 also be provided for science, physical education, music, and business  
11 courses so as to achieve full implementation of those courses in the  
12 curriculum."

13 Section 2. Section 4118 is hereby added to Title 17, Chapter 4 Guam  
14 Code Annotated to read:

15 "Section 4118. It is the policy of the Territory of Guam that  
16 public school students' access to educational programs should not be  
17 restricted by the size or location of the school they attend.  
18 Therefore, the Director shall assure that the full approved curriculum  
19 is offered at each public school. This assurance shall be made in  
20 writing no later than September 15 of each year and shall be submitted  
21 to the Governor and the Speaker of the Legislature."

22 Section 3. Section 4118 and Section 3102.1 of 17 GCA, Chapter 4 shall  
23 be implemented by school year 1984-85.

1 Section 4. Subsection (a) of Section 11809 of the Government Code  
2 (codified as 17 GCA Section 15201) is amended to read:

3 "(a) The applicant must be a bona fide resident of Guam and a  
4 United States citizen or a permanent resident alien and must have  
5 achieved an overall grade point average of 2.5 in his high school  
6 studies or in his undergraduate studies if he is pursuing an academic  
7 graduate degree or an irrevocable letter of acceptance from a  
8 professional school including but not limited to an accredited  
9 professional school of medicine, dentistry, law or veterinary medicine."

10 Section 5. Section 5 of Public Law 17-53 is amended to read:

11 Section 5. There is hereby appropriated from the General Fund  
12 to the Department of Education the sum of One Million Six Hundred  
13 One Thousand Seven Hundred Ninety-Five Dollars (\$1,601,795) for the  
14 purpose of advancing funds from FY'85 Operational budget to procure  
15 Instructional Materials. Such advance appropriation shall be expended  
16 in the following item of appropriation:
