AN ACT AMENDING CERTAIN SECTIONS OF THE BUILDING CODE, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. Section 31003(j)(1) of the Government Code, enacted by Public Law 14-112, is amended to read:

- "(1) the building or structure has been placed on the Guam Register of Historical Places;"
- Section 2. Subsection (a) of Section 31017 of the Government Code is amended to read:
 - "(a) Any new or alternative materials, methods, devices or equipment may be used by their proponent only when the proposed use has been expressly authorized in writing by the Director of Public Works in execution of the board policy set forth in Section 31014(a) of this Chapter. The Director of Public Works may promulgate procedures not inconsistent with rules, regulations and standards in addition to the provisions of the National Codes adopted in this Chapter to adopt or to accommodate circumstances and materials which affects the energy, efficiency and construction costs of single-family dwellings. Such procedures, rules, regulations and standards shall be promulgated in accordance with Sections 31014 and 31015 of Title XXXII of this Code."
- Section 3. A new Section 35800 is added to the Government Code of read:

"Section 35800. Standard. The latest edition of the Uniform Mechanical Code of the International Association of Plumbing and Mechanical Officials (IAPMO) and the International Conference of Building Officials (ICBO) shall be accepted as the generally recognized

standard of design and construction of cooling and refrigeration systems."

Section 4. Section 303 of the Uniform Building Code, Section 31047, 36402, 35411, 36415, 36416, 36417, 36418, 36419, 36420 and 36421 of the Government Code are amended by updating all references to the 1976 Uniform Building Code to read "Latest Edition of the Uniform Building Code".

- Section 5. Value engineering study shall be required for projects costing One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) or over.
- Section 6. Subsection (e) of Section 62313 of the Government Code is amended to read:
 - "(e). A licensed agent or his employee may sell lottery tickets or shares only in the Territory of Guam."
- Section 7. The Governor of Guam with the concurrence of the Legislature is authorized to borrow from any bank or commercial lending institution licensed on Guam a sum not to exceed One Million Nine Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,900,000) for the purpose of purchasing real property to relocate and consolidate all central divisions of the Department of Education. Such real property shall have clear and marketable title. The Governor is authorized to mortgage such real property to secure the loan.
- Section 8. The Department of Education is authorized to create a "Central Complex Building Fund". Funds appropriated to the Department of Education for rental payments of leased facilities shall be covered into the fund and payments for the purchase of the central complex building shall be made therefrom. The Legislature shall annually appropriate necessary funds within the Department of Education's operating budget to make annual payments on the central complex building. Such annual payment shall not exceed the sum appropriated to the Department of Education for lease of office space for Fiscal Year 1985.

The available balance of the appropriation made to the Department of Education for lease of office space (Section 5, Part XI, Item D 3, P.L. 17-70) for Fiscal Year 1985 shall be used for the initial annual payment of the central complex building.

Section 9. A new Section 31072 is added to the Government Code to read:

"Section 31072. Whenever the Uniform Building Code used by the Government of Guam pursuant to Title XXXII of the Government Code is updated, the Department of Public Works is required to notify in a newspaper of general circulation all parties who have completed construction who have been issued building permits or who have construction in progress that an updated version of the Uniform Building Code is in use and make a copy of such updated version of the Uniform Building Code available for their inspection. When there are amendments to the Uniform Building Code which relate to safety, notice of such amendments must be published in a newspaper of general circulation to make owners of buildings aware of possible safety violations or deficiencies. All buildings under construction at the time of adoption of amendments to the Uniform Building Code relating to safety shall conform thereto if practicable."

Section 10. A new Section 31073 is added to the Government Code to read:

"Section 31073. Whenever a building inspector of the Department of Public Works becomes aware of non-conforming construction in buildings which does not meet current safety standards as a result of amendments made to the Uniform Building Code subsequent to approval of the building's plans by the Department of Public Works, the Department shall notify the building owner of the variance in writing in order that the building owner be aware of the potential safety hazard."

Section 11. A new Section 5165 is added to the Government Code of Guam to read:

"Section 5165. The Director of the Bureau of Budget and Management Research shall immediately commence negotiations with the Office of Inspector General, Department of the Interior in order to establish a provisional indirect cost rate which incorporates a central services cost allocation plan to be applied to the line Departments of the Government of Guam for fiscal years 1983 and 1984. Not later

than 180 days subsequent of the obtainment of the provisional rate, the Burau of Budget and Management Research must submit a formal indirect cost allocation plan meeting applicable requirements as prescribed by the U. S. Federal Government for fiscal year 1985 and each subsequent fiscal year therafter.

For Fiscal Years beginning 1986, the Governor shall include in his annual budget estimates of the negotiated rate and the attendant cost by program."
