AN ACT TO REPEAL AND REENACT SECTION 5102 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM, TO ADD A NEW SECTION 5115 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM. TO ADD NEW CHAPTERS 72, 73, AND 74 TO TITLE 10, ESTABLISHING RELATIVE TO GCA. **AMEND** TO SECTIONS DEPARTMENT, FIRE 4111.1(a), AND 800 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM, TO ADD A NEW SUBSECTION (M) TO SECTION 5.55 OF CHAPTER 5, 8 GCA, TO ADD NEW SECTIONS AND 6222 TO CHAPTER 6, 4 GCA, AND TO AMEND SUBSECTION B(1) OF SECTION 6206, 4 GCA. AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:
Section 1. Section 5102 of the Government Code of Guam is repealed
and reenacted to read as follows:

"Section 5102. Guam Police Department. There is within the Executive Branch of the Government of Guam the 'Guam Police Department', the head of which is the Chief of Police of the Department. The Chief of Police of the Guam Police Department is appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Legislature."

Section 2. A new Section 5115 is added to the Government Code of Guam to read:

"Section 5115. There is within the Executive Branch of the Government of Guam a 'Guam Fire Department.' The Fire Chief is the head of the Department. The Fire Chief is appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Legislature. The Fire Chief shall meet the following qualifications:

(a) Must have a bachelor's degree in Fire Science and

(b) have at least ten (10) years of experience in fire control including control and extinguishment of fires and fire preventions, of which five (5) years must be in a supervisory position therein.

Section 3. A new Chapter 72 is added to Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

"CHAPTER 72

Guam Fire Department

Section 72101. The Guam Fire Department shall have the power and duty to control and extinguish injurious or dangerous fires and to remove that which is liable to cause such fires, and to enforce all laws relating to the preventing or spreading of fires and all laws pertaining to fire control and fire hazards within the territory.

Section 72102. The Officer of the Fire Department in charge at the scene of any fire shall have full power and authority to direct the operation of extinguishing the same and to take the necessary precautions to prevent the spread thereof. In the course of such operations he may prohibit approach to such fire by any person, vehicle, vessel or thing and may remove or cause to be removed and kept away from such fire any vehicle, vessel or thing and all persons not actually and usefully employed, in the judgment of said officer, in the extinguishing of such fire or the preservation of property in the vicinity thereof.

Section 72103. Any person who shall in any way obstruct the operations of the Fire Department in connection with any such fire or who shall disobey any lawful command of the officer of the Fire Department in charge at the scene of such fire, or of the police in cooperating with them, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

Section 72104. Nothing in the Chapter shall be construed to limit the authority of the master or officers of any vessel on fire or in danger from fire, subject to the general authority granted herein of the Fire Department, to control the operations in protection of the public interest.

Section 72105. The Fire Department shall have the power and the responsibility of maintaining an emergency medical and rescue services system. The Department shall employ emergency medical services personnel who have been certified to provide such services under the provisions of Chapter 84, 10 GCA. The Fire Department shall maintain and operate equipment necessary to convey on land and sea an individual who is acutely ill, injured, incapacitated or helpless and requires emergency care. The Fire Department personnel shall provide emergency medical assistance on the scene and enroute to designated emergency medical services facilities to the full extent of their certification by the Emergency Medical Services Commission.*

Section 4. A new Chapter 73 is added to Title 10, Guan Code
Annotated, to read:

"CHAPTER 73

Fire Prevention

Section 73101. Theaters: Prohibition. No manager or other person shall use, or assist in, or countenance the use of, any theater, hall or other building for theatrical purposes, or for public entertainment of any kind where stage scenery and apparatus are employed, without a certificate in writing by the Fire Chief to the effect that the provisions of all existing regulations for the prevention of fires have been complied with to his satisfaction.

Section 73102. Same: fire equipment. Every manager or other person using any such building shall keep and maintain in good condition therein such fire fighting equipment as the Fire Chief, by regulation, shall prescribe.

Section 73103. Same: freedom from obstruction. Every manager or other person using any such building shall, at all times during performances, or when such building is open to the public, keep every aisle, passageway, exit, entrance, and stairway open and clear of temporary seats or other obstructions and all doors and gates in or of every such aisle, passageway, exit, entrance and stairway, unlocked and fastened so that they will open freely, and no person shall stand

or remain in any such aisle, passageway, exit, entrance, or stairway during performances, or while such building is open.

Section 73104. Same: admission of Fire Department. Every manager or person using any such building shall at all times freely admit a detail from the Guam Fire Department in every building used as a theater or place of public amusement, whenever the same shall be necessary in the discretion of the Fire Chief for the purposes of assisting in case of fire or in enforcing the provisions of this Chapter.

Section 73105. Fire equipment: woodworking establishments. Sawmills, carpenter shops and other places where wood is sawed, planed or worked in such manner as to cause accumulations of sawdust or shavings, shall maintain in good condition therein such fire fighting equipment as the Fire Chief, by regulation, shall prescribe.

Section 73106. Woodworking establishments: fire prevention. Before a sawmill or woodworking shop is closed for the day, the floors and machinery of the same shall be swept clean of accumulations of wood, dust and shavings, which shall be placed outside the building in trash cans or in a place approved by the Fire Chief for storage of such materials.

No furnace or anvil shall be used or placed nearer than twenty-five (25) feet from any saw, plane, or woodworking machine.

Lumber shall be stored so as not to constitute a fire hazard.

The Fire Chief or his agents may inspect any sawmill or woodworking shop at any time.

Section 73107. Fire equipment: garages. Every space maintained as a garage for taxis or for commercial repairing, cleaning, upkéep, or storage of automobiles, trucks or gaseline engines, shall maintain in good condition therein such fire fighting equipment as the Fire Chief, by regulation, shall prescribe.

Section 73108. Prohibition. It shall be unlawful for any person to remove the gasoline tank cover of any vehicle in the vicinity of a gasoline pump, while the motor of such vehicle is running.

Section 73109. Fire hydrant inspection. The Fire Chief shall have all fire hydrants inspected quarterly to see that they are maintained in good working order.

Section 73110. Penalty. Violation of any provision of this Chapter is a misdemeanor.

Section 73111. Fire Prevention Code. Inspection of premises and areas authorized by this Chapter shall be in accordance with the Fire Prevention Code issued by the American Insurance Association. Standards and requirements for fire prevention as set out in said Fire Prevention Code shall apply in Guam in the absence of specific provisions of this Chapter."

Section 5. A new Chapter 74 is added to Title 10, Guant Code
Annotated, to read:

*CHAPTER 74

Combustibles

Section 74101. Storage. Gasoline or kerosene for private consumption or sale may be kept on the premises or private property only under the conditions prescribed by this Chapter and Titles XVIII, XIX and XXXII of the Government Code.

Section 74102. Same: containers. Standard metal containers of five (5) gallon capacity or galvanized iron drums, fifty (50) gallon capacity only, are to be used as containers when the quantity kept is fifty (50) gallons or less.

When five (5) gallon containers are used the screw cap must always be in place except when drawing liquid.

When drums are used the drums must be grounded to wet earth, a water pipe, or some similar substance to prevent explosion by frictional sparks when drawing liquid from container through spigot or faucet. A spigot or faucet shall be used on all drums used in this connection and they shall be tightly affixed and not leak.

Section 74103. Same: underground. Storage of quantities exceeding fifty (50) gallons but not more than five hundred (500) gallons must be by underground tank under the following conditions:

(a) Outside any commercial, public or private building, the tank must be covered with not less than two (2) feet of earth and equipped with a standard pump, a filling box with a sealed and locked cap to tank filling pipe, and a one and one-quarter (11) inch vent pipe from the opposite end of the tank from the filling box. The vent pipe will extend not less than five (5) feet above any adjoining building, and be capped with a tee head and inverted elbows sealed with No. 16 mesh copper screening as a flame arrester.

inside commercial or public buildings, commercial garages, etc., the above specifications will apply with the exception that the tank must be covered with at least one (1) foot of stone concrete, and the filling box and cap to filling pipe must be located at least two (2) feet outside the building.

Violation of any provision of this Penalty. Section 74104. Chapter is a misdemeanor."

All references to the Department of Public Safety, the Director of Public Safety or the Director of Public Works in Chapter 58, 10 GCA shall be construed to mean the Fire Department or the Fire Chief, as appropriate.

Section 4111.1(a) of the Government Code (4 GCA Section 7. §6219(a)) is amended to read:

Notwithstanding any other law, rule, regulation, or order to the contrary, all firemen within the Fire Department, except the Fire Chief and the Deputy Fire Chief, shall be compensated at the regular hourly rate of pay being paid them on September 1, 1974, for up to ninety (90) hours worked during any pay period, and shall be compensated at one and one-half (11) times said regular hourly rate for hours worked in excess of one hundred twenty (120) hours per The Civil Service Commission shall adjust the pay pay period. schedule for firemen to that schedule which pays, based on a standard pay period of ninety (90) hours, the hourly amount nearest to the hourly amount being paid firemen on September 1, 1974. Section 8. Section 8000 of the Government Code is amended to read:

Unless otherwise provided, every "Section 8000. Definitions. reference in any law, order or regulation to the Commissioner or 2 Director of Public Safety, or Chief of Police shall be construed to mean 3 the Chief of Police of the Guam Police Department." Section 9. A new Subsection (m) is added to Section 5.55 of Chapter 5 5, 8 GCA to read: 6 "(m) Fire personnel when engaged in the enforcement of the Fire 7 Prevention Code and designated by the Fire Chief." 8 Guam Fire Department; Transition. On the first day of 9 the month following the effective date of this Act, all personnel serving in 10 the Fire Division of the Department of Public Safety shall be transferred to 11 the Guam Fire Department without loss of seniority, personnel status or 12 benefits accruing to them at that time. On the first day of the month 13 following the effective date of this Act, all records, files, supplies, and 14 equipment under the control of the Fire Division of the Department of 15 Public Safety shall be transferred to the Guam Fire Department. If any 16 real property is used by the Department of Public Safety which is used by 17 the Fire Division, the Attorney General shall prepare the necessary 18 documents and take action to effect the property transfer to the Guam Fire 19 Department and report any such actions to the Legislature. 20 The following real property, including any structures, shall be placed 21 under the control of the Fire Department. 22 1. the Minority Office to supplement the allocation of Seven Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$700,000) made by Section 1 of Public Law 17-37.

Section 13. Notwithstanding any other provisions of law to the contrary, the Guam Legislature is authorized to retain the unexpended balance of Seventy-six Thousand One Hundred Fifty-five Dollars and Eighty-three Cents (\$76,155.83) from the appropriation made by Section 6 of Public Law 17-2 for the payment of accrued annual leave of the Seventeenth Guam Legislature and for other purposes.

Section 14. The sum of Four Hundred Thirty-Five Thousand Three Hundred Five Dollars and Thirty-two Cents (\$435,305.32) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Legislature Operations Fund for the payment of accrued annual leave of the Seventeenth Guam Legislature and for other purposes.

Section 15. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Legislature Operations Fund the sum of Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000) of which One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) shall be allotted to the Minority Offices to provide for the operation expenses of the Eighteenth Guam Legislature. The appropriation made by this section is an interim appropriation. The appropriation made by this section may be used to meet obligations incurred by the Seventeenth Guam Legislature for the Eighteenth Guam Legislature.

Section 16. The sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Legislature Operations Fund for the purpose of conducting the inauguration of the Eighteenth Guam Legislature. The Chairperson of the Committee on Rules of the Seventeenth Guam Legislature may authorize expenditure of funds from this appropriation prior to January 7, 1985.

Section 17. The sum of Sixty-five Thousand One Hundred Fifty Dollars and Ninety-seven Cents (\$65,150.97) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Legislature Operations Fund for the reimbursement of expenses of state funerals.

Section 18. Effective Date. The provisions of Sections 1 through 11 of this Act shall take effect Ninety (90) days following enactment:
