CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR

This is to certify that Substitute Bill No. 422, "AN ACT TO RENUMBER SECTION 62015.3 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE TO BE SECTION 47060.1 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE AND TO ADD NEW SUBSECTIONS 47060.1(j) AND (k) TO CHAPTER 1 OF TITLE XLIV OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE," returned to the Legislature without the approval of the Governor was, in accordance with the Organic Act of Guam, reconsidered by the Legislature and after such reconsideration, the Legislature did, on the 4th day of January 1985, agree to pass said bill notwithstanding the objections of the Governor by a vote of two-thirds of all members thereof, to wit: by a vote of 15 members.

AN ACT TO RENUMBER SECTION 62015.3 OF THE  
GOVERNMENT CODE TO BE SECTION 47060.1 OF THE  
GOVERNMENT CODE AND TO ADD NEW SUBSECTIONS  
47060.1(j) AND (k) TO CHAPTER 1 OF TITLE XLIV OF  
THE GOVERNMENT CODE.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:  
2 Section 1. Introductory sentence and section number and no other  
3 parts contained in Section 7 of Public Law 15-132 are amended to read:  
4 "Section 7. Subsection 62015.3 of Chapter II of Title XLV of the  
5 Government Code contained in Section 1 of Public Law 15-84 is  
6 renumbered to be Section 47060.1 of Chapter I of Title XLIV of the  
7 Government Code and is repealed and reenacted to read:  
8 'Section 47060.1.'  
9 Section 2. A new Subsection (j) is added to Section 47060.1 of the  
10 Government Code as contained in Public Law 15-132 and amended by Section  
11 1 of this Act to read:  
12 "(j). Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Department  
13 of Commerce shall incorporate the amendments to the Tumon Bay  
14 Master Plan set out in Resolution No. 300 adopted by the Seventeenth  
15 Guam Legislature on January 5, 1984."  
16 Section 3. A new Subsection (k) is added to Section 47060.1 of the  
17 Government Code as contained in Public Law 15-132 and amended by Section  
18 1 of this Act to read:

1           "(k). Any amendment to the Tumon Bay Master Plan shall only  
2 be adopted after the Central Planning Council and the Department of  
3 Commerce hold at least one (1) public hearing. Notice of time, date,  
4 and place shall be given in a paper of general circulation at least ten  
5 (10) days prior to the date of the hearing. Upon completion of the  
6 scheduled public hearing, the Central Planning Council and the  
7 Department of Commerce shall prepare a recommendation on the  
8 amendment, and submit the recommendation to the Governor. The  
9 Governor shall then prepare a report containing his recommendation on  
10 the amendment. The proposed amendment, the recommendations of the  
11 Central Planning Council and Department of Commerce, and the  
12 recommendation of the Governor, shall be forwarded to the Legislature.  
13 The Legislature may conduct a public hearing on the amendment. If  
14 the amendment is approved by the Legislature, it shall be adopted by  
15 statute.

16           Section 4. The provisions of Section 3 of this Act shall apply to all  
17 proposed amendments to the Tumon Bay Master Plan not provided for in the  
18 provisions in Section 2 of this Act are complied with and after the effective  
19 date of this Act.

20           Section 5. Tumon Bay. No person shall operate a jet ski or water ski  
21 within the reef along Tumon Bay except that a jet ski may be operated in  
22 the channel to enter or exit Tumon Bay. This prohibition shall not apply  
23 to the use of a jet ski for emergency rescue or for law enforcement  
24 purposes. Any person who violates this section shall be guilty of a petty  
25 misdemeanor.
