BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 1 of Chapter I of Substitute Bill 254, passed September 30, 1983, vetoed by the Governor October 6, 1983, and overridden by the Legislature is repealed and reenacted to read:

"Section 1. Short Title, Effective Dates.

This Act may be cited as the 'General Appropriation Act of 1984.' The provisions of Chapter I of this Act shall take effect October 1, 1983. The provisions of all other chapters of this Act shall take effect October 1, 1983, unless otherwise provided for within the Act. Except as otherwise provided for by this Act, the appropriations made by the Act shall be available to pay for obligations incurred on or after October 1, 1983, but no later than September 30, 1984. In the event that any portion of this Act is found contrary to Federal law, all portions of the Act not so found shall remain valid."

Section 2. Section 2, Chapter I of Substitute Bill 254, passed by the Legislature on September 30, 1983, vetoed by the Governor October 6, 1983 and overridden by the Legislature is hereby repealed.

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Section 36. Part XXVII of Section 5 of Chapter I of Substitute Bill 254, passed by the Legislature on September 30, 1983, vetoed by the Governor October 6, 1983, and overridden by the Legislature, is repealed.

Section 37. Subsection B of Part XXVIII of Section 5 of Chapter I of Substitute Bill 254, passed by the Legislature on September 30, 1983, vetoed by the Governor on October 6, 1983, and overridden by the Legislature, is amended by deleting the last paragraph.

Section 38. Item 3 of Subsection A of Part XXXI of Section 5 of Chapter I of Substitute Bill 254, passed by the Legislature on September 30, 1983, vetoed by the Governor October 6, 1983, and overridden by the Legislature, is repealed and the last paragraph of that Subsection A is deleted.

Section 39. Subsection G of Part XXXIV of Section 5 of Chapter I of Substitute Bill 254, passed by the Legislature on September 30, 1983, vetoed by the Governor on October 30, 1983, and overridden by the Legislature, is repealed.

Section 40. Subsection S of XXXVII of Section 5 of Chapter I of Substitute Bill 254, passed by the Legislature on September 30, 1983, vetoed by the Governor October 6, 1983, and overridden by the Legislature, is repealed.

Section 41. Subsection (d) of Section 3 of Chapter I of Substitute Bill 254, passed on September 30, 1983, vetoed by the Governor October 6, 1983, and overridden by the Legislature, is amended to read:

"(d) 'FTE' means the equivalent of one (1) permanent position continuously filled for two thousand eighty (2,080) hours per year for the year commencing October 1, 1983."

Section 42. Subsection (e) of Section 4 of Chapter I of Substitute Bill 254, passed on September 30, 1983, vetoed by the Governor October 6, 1983, and overridden by the Legislature, is amended by adding a new sentence at the end to read:

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"No FTE shall be used to employ more than one person at one time whether on a full-time, part-time or on a limited term basis."

Section 43. A new Section 21 is added to Chapter II of Substitute Bill 254, passed September 30, 1983, vetoed October 6, 1983 by the Governor and overridden by the Legislature, to read:

"Section 21. It shall be a petty misdemeanor for any person to knowingly employ in the government of Guam more than one person at a time on a part-time, limited term or temporary basis so that more than one person

receives salary at the same time from funds appropriated for the utilization of one FTE."

Section 44. Section 4 of P.L. 17-24 is repealed and reenacted to read:

"Section 4. No revenue from duties and taxes covered into the Treasury of Guam pursuant to Section 30 of the Organic Act of Guam, as amended, shall be used to pay debts or obligations incurred prior to September 30, 1983 except as hereinafter provided. Section 30 funds may be used for the purposes authorized by Section 7 of Chapter II of Substitute Bill 254 which was passed by the Legislature September 30, 1983, vetoed by the Governor October 6, 1983 and overridden by the Legislature and One Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,500,000) may be used only to pay for contractual services or property for which an appropriation was made in Fiscal Year 1983."

Section 45. The sum of Thirty-Two Thousand Dollars (\$32,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Revenue and Taxation for the purchase of a camera and license card films and accessories for the Driver's License Examining Branch.

Section 46. Subsection (a) of §23354.1 of the Government Code is repealed and reenacted to read:

"(a) There is established within the Treasury of Guam a fund to be known as the 'Abandoned Vehicle and Street Light Fund' which shall be maintained separate and apart from any other funds including the General Fund of the Government and independent records and accounts shall be maintained in connection therewith. Money in the Abandoned Vehicle and Street Light Fund shall be used to remove and dispose of abandoned vehicles found upon public and private property and to pay for the installation and operation of public street lights.

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Ninety percent (90%) of all revenue deposited in the Fund is appropriated to the Guam Power Authority for payment for operation and installation of public street lights. The Treasurer of Guam shall transfer funds to Guam Power Authority pursuant to this Section at the end of each month."

Section 47. A new §19302.1 is added to the Government Code to read:

"§19302.1. Such revenue as is necessary from the tax imposed pursuant to this Chapter is appropriated for the installation and operation of public street lights. At the end of each month the Treasurer of Guam shall pay to Guam Power Authority the difference between its billings for installation and operation of public street lights pursuant to §23354.1 of this Code."

Section 48. Section 8105.1 is added to Title 12 of the Guam Code Annotated to read:

"§8105.1. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary the Guam Power Authority shall at all times provide power necessary for operation of at least as many public streetlights as were working on July 1, 1983. If the Authority does not receive prompt payment for such power consumption, it shall notify the Legislature and it shall not disconnect any street lights until thirty (30) days after so notifying the Legislature."

Section 49. Section 15 of Chapter II (Administrative Provisions) of Substitute Bill 254 passed by the Legislature on September 30, 1983, vetoed by the Governor on October 6, 1983 and overridden by the Legislature, is repealed and reenacted to read as follows:

"Section 15. Non-professional employees of the Department of Education who have been occupying positions for at least one hundred eighty (180) days or more prior to the effective date of this Act, and who have provided satisfactory service during this period, shall be permanent employees in the classified service of the Department of Education."

Section 50. Section 3 of Chapter II of Substitute Bill 254 passed by the Legislature September 30, 1983, vetoed by the Governor October 6, 1983 and overridden by the Legislature, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 3. The Governor shall submit to the Legislature no later than November 15, 1983 a request for an appropriation

for the payment of outstanding debts or obligations incurred prior to September 30, 1983."

Section 51. Section 6 of Chapter I of Substitute Bill 254, passed September 30, 1983, vetoed by the Governor October 6, 1983, and overridden by the Legislature, is repealed and reenacted to read:

"Section 6. The authorization granted to the Governor pursuant to §4103.1 of the Government Code is suspended for Fiscal Year 1984, but there is appropriated from the General Fund for the purpose hereinafter specified Six Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$6,500,000). The appropriation shall be used by the Director of Administration to pay to persons whose salaries or wages are funded by this Act the cost-of-living allowance established by Executive Order 82-22. The cost-of-living allowance shall be paid pro rata as a part of the biweekly compensation of the employees."

Section 52. Section 1 of Chapter II of Substitute Bill 254, passed September 30, 1983, vetoed by the Governor October 6, 1983, and overridden by the Legislature, is repealed and reenacted to read:

"Section 1. None of the appropriations made in Chapter I of this Act shall be used to purchase or lease new or additional microfilm or microfiche equipment, word processors or data processing equipment until a complete assessment of government of Guam requirements is made by the local General Services Administration."

Section 53. Subsection H of Part I of Section 5 of Chapter I of Substitute Bill 254, passed September 30, 1983, vetoed October 6, 1983 by the Governor and overridden by the Legislature, is repealed and reenacted to read:
