AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE OPERATION OF THE FIRST SESSION OF THE EIGHTEENTH GUAM LEGISLATURE, FOR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS FOR THE LEGISLATURE AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Legislature Operations Fund to be allocated by the Committee on Rules for the operation of the First Regular Session of the Eighteenth Guam Legislature from January 1, 1985 to September 30, 1985, the sum of Four Million One Hundred Twenty-three Thousand Nine Hundred Sixty-two Dollars and sixty-six cents (\$4,123,962.66). Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$750,000) of the total amounts appropriated for the operation expenses of the Eighteenth Guam Legislature shall be allocated to

Section 2. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any appropriation made to the Seventeenth Guam Legislature for use in calendar year 1984 shall continue to be available during the First Session of the Eighteenth Guam Legislature from January 1, 1985 to September 30, 1985 and may be expended to honor claims for payment.

Section 3. A new 2 GCA \$1123 is added to read:

"§1123. Legislature Capital Improvement Fund. There is hereby created a special fund to be known as the 'Legislature Capital Improvement Fund', such fund to be administered by the Legislature. All money appropriated for capital improvements and additions for the Legislature building and for the provision of offices while such capital

improvements and additions are being made shall be paid directly to the fund and disbursed by the Legislature."

Section 4. Section 34 of Public Law 17-81 is amended to read:

 "Section 34. There is appropriated from the fund created by Section 2508.1, Article 5, Chapter 2, 12 GCA, to the Legislature Capital Improvement Fund the sum of Eight Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$800,000) for the renovation and repair of the Guam Legislature building and the construction of any additions thereto."

Section 5. Section 35 of Public Law 17-81 is repealed and reenacted to read:

"Section 35. There is appropriated from the fund created pursuant to 12 GCA §2508.1 to the Legislature Capital Improvement Fund the sum of Four Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$400,000) for capital improvements and additions to the Legislature building and provision of offices while such capital improvements and additions are being made."

Section 6. The sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) is appropriated from the fund created pursuant to 12 GCA Section 2508.1 to the Guam Council on Arts and Humanities for the promotion of band music.

Section 7. (a) The sum of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) is appropriated from the fund created pursuant to 12 GCA Section 2508.1 to the Department of Public Works to alleviate the overcrowded conditions at the Agana Lockup by constructing a temporary lockup on the "Rosario" property located next to the Guam Penitentiary by remodeling the building presently there and adding a thirty (30) cell building adjacent to that building and renovating and upgrading the present Agana Lockup site at the Department of Public Safety in Agana.

(b) There is hereby authorized to be appropriated to the Department of Public Works such sums as are necessary to construct two (2) new buildings at the penitentiary, consisting of one building ("D4") which is to be used for a Jail and one dormitory building ("D1") which is to be located within the perimeter for future penitentiary population, as shown on Department of Public Works Drawing C-8 of the Guam Correctional Facility Complex dated 5-28-81. The Department of Public Works is directed to solicit bids for the two

(2) buildings described in this Subsection. The Department of Public Works shall not charge an administrative cost for processing bids.

Section 8. The sum of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000) is appropriated from the fund created pursuant to 12 GCA Section 2508.1 to the Tenth Guam Youth Congress.

Section 9. Section 2 of P.L. 17-72 is amended to read:

"Section 2. The sum of One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000) is appropriated from the General Fund, to be reimbursed to that fund from the fund established by 12 GCA Section 2508.1, added by P.L. 17-39 Section 7, as soon as funds are available in this fund, to Guam Memorial Hospital Authority for the purpose of purchasing and installing air-conditioning equipment for use to cool the fifth and sixth floors of the old Guam Memorial Hospital building where the Skilled Nursing Facility (SNF) and Intermediate Care Facility (ICF) are located and for elevators at both the old and new hospital buildings."

Section 10. The sum of One Million Seven Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,700,000) is appropriated from the fund created pursuant to 12 GCA \$2508.1 to the Department of Education for the period from February 1, 1985 to September 30, 1985 to implement the teacher reclassification approved by the Civil Service Commission in April, 1984.

- Section 11. (a) All secondary teachers who teach during a preparation period shall receive additional payment of twenty percent (20%) of their yearly salary at the rate of one nine hundredth (1/900) of their annual salary for each instructional day they teach.
- (b) The sum of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000) is appropriated from the lapses of the funds appropriated to Department of Education in the FY'85 budget which have been identified in paragraph 4 of the letter from the Governor to the Speaker of February 5, 1985 and Section 2 of the draft bill attached to that letter, to the Department of Education to implement the provisions of Subsection (a) of this Section for the period from August 27, 1984 to September 30, 1985.

Section 12. The sum of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000) is appropriated from the lapses of the funds appropriated to the Department of Education in the FY'85 budget which have been identified in paragraph 4 of

the letter from the Governor to the Speaker of February 5, 1985 and Section 2 of the draft bill attached to that letter to the Guam Community College to implement for the period from February 1, 1984 to September 30, 1985 the teacher reclassification passed September 21, 1983.

Section 13. The sum of Four Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$400,000) is appropriated from lapses occurring from the FY'85 budget which have not been identified by law for any other purpose to the office of the Governor for renovation of the Executive offices.

Section 14. The sum of Four Hundred Ninety-eight Thousand Dollars (\$498,000) is appropriated from the fund created pursuant to 12 GCA \$2508.1 to the Commission on Self Determination to further the purposes of that Commission.

Section 15. The sum of Two Hundred Fifty-two Thousand Four Hundred Forty-three Dollars (\$252,443) is appropriated from the fund created pursuant to 12 GCA §2508.1 to the Guam Economic Development Authority for authorized loans.

Section 16. (a) The sum of Sixty-three Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$63,500) is appropriated from the fund created pursuant to 12 GCA \$2508.1 to the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation for building maintenance, equipment, and necessary expenses of the Workshop Center.

(b) The sum of Two Thousand Eight Hundred Dollars (\$2,800) is appropriated from the fund created pursuant to 12 GCA \$2508.1 to the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation for the purchase of a Visualtek (Voyager XL Series) Visual Aid for the use of visually-impaired citizens of the Territory of Guam.

Section 17. A new Section 6010 is added to the Government Code to read:

"Section 6010. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, unless work has commenced or ten percent (10%) of the funds have been expended to accomplish the purpose of an appropriation, any appropriation for capital improvements or the acquisition of capital goods and equipment made by the Legislature shall cease to be an appropriation and shall become an authorization for an appropriation one year from the date the appropriation is made and all sums

previously appropriated shall revert to the General Fund. The Director of Administration shall identify the sums which are changed from an appropriation to an authorization for an appropriation pursuant to this Section, and their uses, and shall report them to the Legislature within ninety (90) days of the date of the changes. The provisions of this Section shall be effective September 30, 1985 for any appropriation made before September 30, 1984; except that the Director of Administration shall make a report of sums which will be changed from an appropriation to an authorization for an appropriation, and their uses, and also a report in a format which will be submitted by the Committee on Ways and Means on sums which have been appropriated and which will continue to be appropriated for on going projects as of September 30, 1985, to the Legislature within ninety (90) days after the effective date of this Act."

Section 18. The sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Revenue and Taxation for the use of the Foreign Sales Corporation Task Force to promote Foreign Sales Corporations on Guam.

# COMMITTEE REPORT BILL NO. 158

The Committee on Rules conducted a public hearing on Thursday, January 31, 1985, in the Legislative Conference Room, on Bill 158, "An act making an appropriation for the operation of the first session of the Eighteenth Guam Legislature."

The hearing was called to order at 8:45 a.m. by Senator John P. Aguon, Chairman. Present were: Senators E.P. Arriola, H.D. Dierking, P.C. Lujan, T.S. Nelson, D. Parkinson, J.T. San Agustin, F.R. Santos and E.R. Duenas. Also present were Senators F.F. Blas and J. Miles.

Senator Aguon asked if there was anyone present who wished to testify on Bill 158 and there was no response. Senator Santos confirmed with Senator Aguon that letters had been sent to the Director of Administration, the Director of the Bureau of Budget and Management Research, the Chairman of the Legislative Review Committee and to the Commissioners Council.

Senator Parkinson confirmed that the hearing was on Bill 158 as introduced and that a substitute bill could be discussed in a mark-up meeting.

Senator Aguon adjourned the meeting.

Following adjournment, Senator Duenas said he had a statement for the record which he wished inserted into the testimony for the hearing. (Statement is attached).

The Committee on Rules met in a mark-up on February 6, 1985 in the Legislative Conference Room. It was decided to substitute Bill 158 with the following section changes: Section 1 was altered slightly, Section 2 remained the same, Section 3 became Section 5, Sections 4 and 5 were deleted and new Sections 3, 4, and 6 through 18 were added.

The Committee on Rules recommended that Bill 158 as substituted be passed.

#### STATEMENT OF MINORITY LEADER

After much consideration, the Republican Minority comprising of 10 senators, or 46.7 percent of the membership of the current legislature, asks that they be treated equitably in the budget consideration for the legislature's operations.

The minority members do not want to ask anything that's considered unreasonable, but only for a fair share of the budget in order to be able to discharge their duties and responsibilities to the people who elected them to office, just like the majority is expected to do so.

In the previous legislature, the Republican minority comprised of only seven senators. We made ends meet without the benefit of a minority central staff.

In the current legislature, it's a different situation. We now number 10 senators, or 46.7 of the total membership, and now the need for some sort of a central staff is more urgent than before.

We definitely need a central staff that will provide timely services and assistance commonly needed by the minority senators to effectively act and react as a group.

A detail analysis of the composition of the proposed central staff and the amount of funding needed is being finalized. We hope to submit it not later than tomorrow.

We seek the cooperation and goodwill of the Democratic majority in this matter. We ask only for an equitable share of the budget to enable the minority senators to adequately carry cut their responsibilities to the people who elected them, just like the Democratic majority wants to do.

Let me also point out that our request and the amount of funding for minority central staff will be in similar level that the Republican majority of the 16th Legislature accorded and granted the then Democratic

minority of 10 senators. In the first year of the 16th Legislature, we gave 21% of the legislative operations budget to the minority, and in the second year that increased to 24.7 %, exclusive of the senator's salaries and benefits. The amount we gave the minority enabled the minority to set up and maintain a central staff of 20 employees at a cost of \$291,669 for the first year.

So let us work in the spirit of cooperation and goodwill, as we begin our task as members of the 18th Guam Legislature.
