AN ACT TO REQUEST GUAM'S DELEGATE TO THE UNITED STATES HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES TO DELIVER AN ANNUAL ADDRESS TO THE PEOPLE OF GUAM ON FEDERAL-TERRITORIAL ISSUES, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. 2 GCA \$1124 is enacted to read:
  - "\$1124. Annually at a month to be determined by the Speaker and the Congressman, the Speaker shall invite Guam's Delegate to the United States House of Representatives to appear before the Legislature and give an address on federal-territorial issues."
- Section 2. The provisions of Section 5 of the Public Law passed as Bill 362 are exempt from any other provision of law restricting their application.

Section 3. Section 13 of the Public Law passed as Bill 362 is amended to read:

"Section 13. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, except for the Department of Education, the Department of Youth Affairs for purposes of the Summer Youth Employment Program and the secondary level of the Guam Community College, no encumbrances or expenditures in any department, agency or instrumentality of the Executive Branch of the government of Guam for the fourth quarter of 1985 may exceed the level of encumbrances or expenditures which were made in the third quarter of fiscal year 1985."

Section 4. The Guam Memorial Hospital Authority shall be exempt from the provisions of Sections 13, 14, and 16 of the Public Law passed as Bill 362 regarding the level of expenditures of the fourth quarter, filling of vacancies, and contracting for professional services.

Section 5. The Department of Public Health and Social Services and the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse shall be exempt from the provisions of Sections 13, 14, and 16 of the Public Law passed as Bill 362 for the purchase of medical and pharmaceutical supplies, procurement of physician and nursing services, payment of patient bills, assistance payments, and a systems consultant, and equipment repairs necessary for the provision of adequate medical attention to island residents. The restrictions of these sections shall continue to apply to all other expenditures of the Department of Public Health and Social Services and the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse.

Section 6. The Department of Public Works shall be exempt from the provisions of Section 16 of the Public Law passed as Bill 362 for the purpose of implementing highway improvement projects funded by the Highway Revenue Bonds.

Section 7. Section 10 of the Public Law passed as Bill 362 is amended to read:

"Section 10. (a) It is the Legislature's intent to avoid the situation reflected in Note 4 of the April 30, 1985 Department of Administration Financial Report which indicates that as of that date Four Million Five Hundred Forty-three Thousand Three Hundred

Thirty-five Dollars (\$4,543,335.00) has been advanced from the General Fund for local matching funds which have not been reimbursed from the Federal government.

(b) On the effective date of this Act, except for the Department of Public Health and Social Services the Executive Branch of the government of Guam shall not implement or continue to implement any federal function or responsibility without the receipt of federal reimbursement funds for such function or responsibility. This Section shall expire on September 30, 1985."

Section 8. Section 25 of Bill 362 passed by the Legislature on July 8, 1985, vetoed by the Governor and overridden, is repealed and reenacted to read:

#### "Section 25. A new 12 GCA \$12015.1 is added to read:

'\$12015.1. Financial Autonomy of the Public Utility Agency of Guam. Before the Public Utility Agency of Guam may raise its rates for water or sewer, it shall submit to the Public Utilities Commission an eight (8) year plan to make the rates charged by the Public Utility Agency of Guam sufficient to make the agency self-sufficient financially. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, once the eight (8) year plan has been approved by the Public Utilities Commission, it shall be referred to and approved by the Legislature before the implementation of any rate increases for water and power."

"AN ACT TO REQUEST GUAM'S CONGRESSMAN TO DELIVER AN ANNUAL ADDRESS TO THE PEOPLE OF GUAM ON FEDERAL-TERRITORIAL ISSUES."

Senator F.R. Santos, Chairman of the Committee on Federal, Foreign and Legal Affairs convened the public hearing on the review of Bill No. 374, an act to request Guam's Congressman to deliver an annual address to the people of Guam on federal-territorial issues. Present at the commencement was Senator F.R. Santos, Chairman. Attending later in the hearing were other members of the Committee, Senators Ted Nelson, John Aguon and Joseph Ada; sitting in was Senator Eddie Duenas.

There were no oral or written testimonies on behalf, or against Bill No. 374.

The Committee has no reservation in recommending passage of Bill No. 374 and, in fact, feels the need for a law which requires Guam's non-voting delegate to the U.S. Congress to deliver an annual "State of the Federal-Territory Relations Address."

Based on legal requirements that the Governor and the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court deliver an annual address on the executive and judicial state of affairs, respectively, the Committee sees the additional need for an annual review of the federal-territorial state of affairs.

#### COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

The Committee, therefore, recommends immediate passage of Bill No. 374.
