






AN ACT TO REPEAL AND REENACT CERTAIN
SECTIONS OF TITLE 19, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED
RELATIVE TO ACCREDITATION RECOMMENDATIONS
TO GUAM COMMUNITY COLLEGE, AND FOR OTHER
PURPOSES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. 17 GCA §31110 is amended by deleting the word "provost"
3 wherever it appears and replacing it with the word "president".

4 Section 2. Subsection (a) of 17 GCA §31110 is repealed and reenacted
5 to read:

6 "§31110. President.

7 (a) The Board shall appoint the President of the College
8 who shall be its chief executive officer. The President of the
9 college shall serve as the executive officer of the Board and shall
10 have full charge and control not in conflict with the policymaking
11 authority of the Board of Trustees of the administration and
12 business affairs of the College."

13 Section 3. Subsection (a) of 17 GCA §31113 is repealed and reenacted
14 to read:

15 "(a) With the exception of the President and the Private
16 Executive Secretary who shall be in the unclassified service, all other
17 employees of the College shall be classified employees. The President

1 shall serve the College on a contractual basis, and notwithstanding any
2 other provision of law, shall be entitled to all benefits of the
3 government of Guam given to employees including being a member of
4 the Retirement Fund. The term of the contract of employment
5 between the President and the Board shall not be for longer than six
6 (6) years, which term may be renewable any number of times."

7 Section 4. A new subsection (c) is added to 17 GCA §31113 to read:

8 "(c) The title of the classified position of Deputy Provost
9 established by Public Law 17-27, Section 3, shall be Vice President,
10 and the person occupying the position of Vice President shall serve as
11 Acting President in the absence of the President."

12 Section 5. (a) Persons who are occupying the positions of Provost
13 and Deputy Provost at the time of enactment of this Act shall occupy the
14 positions of President and Vice President, respectively, which are created
15 pursuant to Section 1, Section 3 and Section 4 of this Act.

16 (b) The President and the Vice President shall only be removed for
17 cause.

18 Section 6. Subsection (a) of 17 GCA §31101 is repealed and reenacted
19 to read:

20 "§31101. Administration of the Guam Community College.

21 (a) All powers vested in the Guam Community College
22 except as provided herein shall be exercised by the Guam
23 Community College Board of Trustees. The Board shall consist of
24 seven (7) trustees nominated and appointed by the Governor with
25 the advice and consent of the Legislature. Three (3) trustees
26 shall be appointed to terms of three (3) years, three (3) trustees
27 shall be appointed to terms of five (5) years and the student
28 member provided for herein shall serve a term of two (2) years.
29 Their successors shall be appointed each for a term of five (5)
30 years with the exception of the student member whose term shall
31 be two (2) years from the date of the expiration of the term for
32 which his predecessor was appointed and has qualified. Board
33 members shall be permitted to serve their full term of
34 appointment. No courtesy resignations shall be required. All

1 vacancies occurring on the Board of Trustees shall be filled by
2 the Governor with the advice and consent of the Legislature for
3 the unexpired term."

4 Section 7. (a) The legislature finds that the government of Guam has
5 derived a savings from the implementation of the provisions of P.L. 18-9
6 and therefore a source of funding for the Public Utility Agency of Guam
7 can be found in the reduced expenditures from the General Fund caused by
8 the enactment of P.L. 18-9.

9 (b) Section 2 of Chapter II, Administrative Provisions, of P.L. 17-70
10 is amended to read:

11 "Section 2. Any shortfall in the Public Utility Agency of Guam
12 Fund resulting from lack of revenues from water and sewage charges
13 and other Public Utility Agency of Guam sources shall first be made up
14 from personnel lapses within the agency and from the Personnel Lapse
15 Fund of the Executive Branch. In addition, the Governor shall have
16 the authority to transfer funds to the Public Utility Agency of Guam
17 from any other department or agency of the Executive Branch to make
18 up any shortfalls in the Public Utility Agency of Guam Fund not
19 coming from personnel lapses and Public Utility Agency of Guam
20 revenues. Further, in order to insure the ability of Public Utility
21 Agency of Guam to provide essential services such additional funds as
22 are required are hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the
23 Public Utility Agency of Guam Fund but in no event shall the total
24 revenues and appropriation to the Public Utility Agency of Guam fund
25 for FY 1985 from all sources exceed \$14,792,236."

26 Section 9. The Governor of Guam is hereby authorized to convey to
27 the qualified applicant, Mrs. Engracia Ungacta, that portion of government
28 land perpendicular to Lot No. 300-1, Agana, containing an area of 400
29 square meters, at current fair market value.

30 Section 10. The Governor is authorized to convey to the qualified
31 applicants, Mildred Duenas and Pedro Blas, that portion of the old Maxwell
32 Street situated between Lots Nos. 1248-NEW 2061 and 2060-R1, Agana, at
33 current fair market value.

1 Section 11. The sum of Thirty Three Thousand Dollars (\$33,000) is
2 appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Revenue and
3 Taxation for the purpose of renovating and relocating the Motor Vehicle
4 Office to the old airport building and for construction of an elevator at the
5 NAPA building.

**Bill No. 75: Relative to Repealing and Reenacting
Sections of the Government Code Relative to
Accreditation Recommendations to GCC.**

PREFACE

The Committee on Education conducted a scheduled public hearing on Bill No. 75. The public hearing was conducted in the morning on Wednesday, March 13, 1985 in the Legislative Session Hall. Committee members present for the hearing were as follows:

Senator Franklin J. Quitugua, Chairman
Senator Herminia D. Dierking, Member

BACKGROUND

Testimonies heard on Bill No. 75 were as follows:

1. Mr. Peter R. Nelson, Provost of the Guam Community College, Representing the Governor's LRC

Mr. Nelson read his prepared testimony which may be summarized as follows:

- Bill No. 75 had been reviewed and concurred with by GCC
- Repeal of Section 31110, 17GCA, and reenactment of Section 11971, P. L. 14-77 will address the Accreditation Commission's concern over the external environment that may compromise the institution's integrity and quality.
- Concurs with change of title of Provost to President.
- Recommends inclusion of position of Vice President in the unclassified service of GCC.
- Supports placing the service of the President on a contractual basis.
- The ... "No courtesy resignation" will allay the fear of the Accreditation Commission over the disruptive effect of replacement of Board members by each new Governor.
- The Bill as a whole should meet the Commission's concern over governance.

2. Mr. Alan Yuen, Accreditation Coordinator, Guam Community College

Mr. Yuen stated that what Provost Nelson had said are, in essence, what the Accreditation Commission were concerned with.

3. Ms. Sheila Stevens, Executive Director of GFT

Ms. Stevens expressed the concurrence of GFT with Bill No. 75 as they believe the bill will strengthen the autonomy of GCC. GFT is concerned over the language of the bill which appears to ignore Paragraphs (b-d) in Section 11963. GFT will support Bill No. 75 in its entirety if Paragraphs (b-d) are retained.

Discussions which followed the presentation of testimonies are listed below.

1. Senator Herminia Dierking asked Provost Nelson whether he was representing LRC to which Mr. Nelson answered in the affirmative. She also wondered if Bill No. 75 is one of those bills considered "inorganic". She asked if LRC didn't view the bill as taking away the power of the Governor? Did LRC consider the bill "all right" to enact?

2. Mr. Peter Nelson explained that he was present at the LRC meeting when Bill No. 75 was discussed. He presented GCC's position paper and he was authorized to present the testimony as a representative of LRC.

3. Senator Quitugua referred to Provost Nelson for explanation the concern of GFT over the omission of Paragraphs (b-d) in the amendment. The consensus is that those paragraphs are not amended and remain as they are.

4. Senator Santos asked if the Vice President is included would the Deputy Provost continue? Provost Nelson replied that he was only referring to the Vice President's position. He also stated that there is a law which entitles each agency a first assistant and a private secretary. There appears to be some conflicting laws and confusion as to which law prevails. He feels that the bill will clarify that.

5. Senator Santos asked if the change of title to President is a recommendation of the Accreditation Commission and was told by Provost Nelson it was not. It was simply a Board of Trustees recommendation. The Provost explained that the change of title to President will bring GCC to be more in line with other community colleges.

6. Mr Alan Yuen, when asked, explained that a Provost is someone who usually works under either a President or a Chancellor and who is in charge of just one aspect - the educational aspect.

7. Senator Quitugua verified with Provost Nelson that Bill No. 75, if enacted, will satisfy the Accreditation recommendations.

ANALYSIS OF BILL NO. 75

Bill No. 75 proposes to repeal and reenact certain sections of Title 17 GCA, in response to recommendations made by the Accreditation Commission with reference to appointment status and tenure of the Provost/President and a provision that ... "No courtesy resignation shall be accepted."

The bill also proposes to change the title of the chief executive officer of GCC from Provost to President.

COMMITTEE FINDINGS

The Committee finds that:

1. All witnesses favor passage of Bill No. 75 including the GCC Provost and GFT Executive Director.

2. The Governor's Legislative Review Committee is reportedly in favor of said bill and endorsed the testimony of GCC.

Dear Senator Quitugua:

The purpose of this testimony is to report that Bill 75, An Act Relative to Repealing and Reenacting Sections of the Government Code Relative to Accreditation Recommendations to GCC, has been reviewed and concurred with by the College.

Before beginning, Section 3110, 17 GCA should be changed to read Section 3110, 17, GCA.

The College concurs with the rescinding of the Section 3110, 17 GCA and the reenactment of Section 11971, P.L. 14-77. The reenactment of Section 11971 addresses a concern voiced by the 1984 Accreditation Commission over the external environment that may compromise the institution's integrity and quality.

The College feels that the amendment to Section 1, P.L. 14-77, Section 11971 to read President instead of Provost is appropriate.

The chief executive officer for similar, singular institutions of higher learning with full charge and control of the institution's administration and business affairs is nationally known as the President.

The College feels that the repeal and reenactment of Section 3, P. L. 14-77, Section 11974(a) should include the position of Vice-President who also serves in the unclassified service. Because of the confidentiality and the sensitivity of matters that pass through the President's Office, the loyalty and support of the Vice-President and Private Executive Secretary is uncompromising, if the College's goals are to be reached. The College also feels that Section 11971(a) adequately addresses the visiting Commission's concern over the question of job security for the President through contractual services.

Finally, Section 11963's enactment of ". . . No courtesy resignation will be accepted." will serve to alleviate the fear of the Commission over the control of the appointment and tenure of the Board by a new governor.

We support the repeal and re-enactment of Paragraph (a) of Public Law 14-77 of Section 11963, as written in Bill 75. "An act to repeal and reenact certain sections of Title 19, Guam Code Annotated relative to accreditation recommendations to Guam Community College, and for other purposes."

ACTION TAKEN BY COMMITTEE ON RULES

During a meeting of the Committee on Rules, held on August 21, 1985, Bill No. 75 was amended in the following fashion:

Section 1 was amended technically to include the proper section number and to make the language more clear.

Section 2 was amended technically to include the proper section number.

Section 3 was amended technically to include the proper section number.

A new Section 4 was added to establish that the Deputy Provost shall be titled the Vice President and that he shall serve as Acting President in the President's absence.

A new Section 5 was added which mandates that the present Provost and Deputy Provost of the Guam Community College become the President and Vice President of the Guam Community College.

The original Section 4 became Section 6 and was amended technically to include the proper section number.

Section 7 was added which establishes that the first assistant to the Police Chief of the Guam Police Department is a classified employee with the title of Deputy Police Chief; that in the absence or vacancy of the position of Deputy Police Chief and Police Chief that a person occupying a classified position in the Guam Police Department shall be Acting Police Chief. The section also stipulates that there shall be no Deputy Director of the Guam Police Department.

Section 8 sets a ceiling on appropriations to the Public Utility Agency of Guam of \$14,792,236.00 which includes savings from the implementation of the

provisions of P.L. 18-9.

Section 9 was added which authorizes the Governor to sell Lot No. 300-1, Agana, to Mrs. Engracia Ungacta, for current fair market value.

Section 10 was added which authorizes the Governor to sell that portion of the old Maxwell Street located between Lots No. 1248-NEW 2061 and 2060-R1, Agana, to Mildred Duenas and Pedro Blas, at fair market value.

Section 11 was added which appropriates \$33,000 from the General Fund to the Department of Revenue and Taxation to renovate and relocate the Motor Vehicle Office and construct an elevator.

The committee recommends that Bill 75 as substituted be reported out with the recommendation to do pass as substituted.

20 (a) All powers vested in the Guam Community College except as pro-
21 vided herein shall be exercised by the Guam Community College Board of
22 Trustees. The Board shall consist of seven (7) trustees nominated and
23 appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Legislature.
24 Three (3) trustees shall be appointed to terms of three (3) years, three
25 (3) trustees shall be appointed to terms of five (5) years and the student
26 member provided for herein shall serve a term of two (2) years. Their
27 successors shall be appointed each for a term of five (5) years with the

1 exception of the student member whose term shall be two (2) years from the
2 date of the expiration of the term for which his predecessor was appointed
3 and has qualified. Board members shall be permitted to serve their full
4 term of appointment. No courtesy resignations shall be accepted. All
5 vacancies occurring on the Board of Trustees shall be filled by the
6 Governor with the advice and consent of the Legislature for the unexpired
7 term.
