PREFACE

The Committee on Education conducted a scheduled public hearing on Bill No. 285. The hearing was conducted in the morning on Friday, August 2, 1985 in the Legislative Session Hall. Committee members present at the hearing were as follows:

BACKGROUND

Testimonies heard on Bill No. 285 were as follows:

1. Mrs. Carmen Nededog, Chairperson of Guam Public Library Board

Ms. Nededog supports the intent of the bill to amend Section 42004 of the Government Code. She has reservations, however, since the proposed amendment does not clarify the word "student." Is the bill referring to full time student, part-time student or any and all students? Is it referring to a specific grade level, including the university level? While in support of the bill, she would still like clarification on the "student."

2. Ms. Magdalena S. Taitano, Territorial Librarian

She noted that she is the Territorial Librarian for the Guam Public Library system and was an alternate delegate to the White House Conference on Library and Information Services. At the White House Conference in 1979, Guam was represented by six (6) people, one of which was a youth.

One of the conference follow-up and recommendations is that "states and territories be encouraged to include at least one youth as voting member on the library board.

Bill No. 285 will implement the recommendation of the White House Conference on Library and Information Services.

She urges favorable consideration of the bill.

Discussions

- 1. Senator Dierking stated her opinion that while she has no problem in defining "student" she is confident that the Governor, in his wisdom, will not appoint a grade school student or anyone not qualified.
- 2. Present membership is five (5) but the total number for a complete board is seven (7).
- 3. The possibility of appointing one from the senior high school and one from the university level was discussed and received some support among those present.
- 4. There is no prohibition under the present law for the Governor to appoint a student and that Bill No. 285 may not be required.
- 5. While there has not been any recommendation from the public library representatives for the Governor to appoint a "student", there has been, however, the recommendation for the appointment of a "youth."

ANALYSIS OF BILL NO. 285

Bill No. 285 proposes to establish in law the appointment of one student to the seven (7) member Guam Public Library Board.

COMMITTEE FINDINGS

The Committee finds that there is support for the intent of the bill, except, perhaps, for clarification of the type of student to be appointed to the Board.

It is also noted that the intent of the bill is in line with the recommendation of the 1979 White House Conference on Library and Information Services with respect to including at least one youth as a voting member on the library board.

COMMITTEE REPORT

Substitute Bill 285

"An act to amend Section 42004 of the Government Code relative to the composition of the Guam Public Library Board, and for other purposes."

At a meeting of the Committee on Rules on August 15, 1985, Bill No. 285, introduced by Sen. F. R. Santos, was amended in the following fashion:

Section 1, which deals with the membership of the Guam Public Library Board, remained unchanged.

A new Section 2 was added which further amended an amendment of Section 16 of P.L. 18-1 contained in Section 19 of P.L. 18-10 by splitting the original appropriation of Sixty Thousand Seven Hundred Twenty-two dollars (\$60,722.00) into Thirty-six Thousand Nine Hundred Sixty-four Dollars (\$36,964.00) for building maintenance, equipment, and necessary expenses of the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation Workshop Center; and Twenty-three Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty-eight Dollars (\$23,758.00) for salaries of sheltered workshop employees.

A new section 3 was added which further amended Part XXII of Section 5 of Chapter I of P.L. 17-70 to transfer funds within the Superior Court of Guam.

A new Section 4 was added to appropriate Five Hundred Dollars (\$500) from the General Fund to the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation for the expenses in obtaining an orthopedic prosthesis.

A new Section 5 was added to require minimum insurance levels for vehicles operated on the highways of Guam for the transportation of persons for hire.

A new Section 6 was added to require minimum insurance levels for vehicles operated on the highways of Guam. The section also requires the Director of Revenue and Taxation to annually increase minimum insurance coverage beginning on April 1, 1987.

A new Section 7 was added to require a penalty for those who do not comply

with the new insurance regualtions.

A new Section 8 authorizes the Director of Revenue and Taxation to suspend vehicle registration, after a hearing, if the registered ownerfails to provide proof that the required insurance has been obtained.

A new Section 9 was added which repeals and reenacts Subsection (a) of 16 GCA Section 19105, the Financial Responsibility Law, raising insurance requirements for surety bonds.

A new Section 10 was added which repeals and reenacts Subsection (b) of 16 GCA Section 17101, the Imputed Negligence section, to increase the limit of liability.

A new Section 11 was added which authorizes the Director of the Department of Revenue and Taxation to promulgate necessary rules and regulations to allow implementation of Sections 5 through 10 of this act.

A new Section 12 was added which requires the suspension of registration of the vehicle and suspension of the drivers license of the driver in any traffic related case should there be no insurance coverage on the vehicle or driver.

A new Section 13 was added which allows the Speaker of the Legislature or his designee to perform marriage ceremonies.

The committee recommends that Bill 285 as substituted be reported out with the recommendation to do pass as substituted.

Section 4. The sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation for the purposes of expenses incidental to the obtaining of orthopedic prosthesis.

"§7158. No vehicle shall be operated upon the highways of the territory of Guam for the transportation of persons for hire unless

The registered or legal owner of any vehicle operated or used for the transportation of persons for hire shall be held responsible for compliance with this Section; provided that all policies currently written for lesser limits before the effective date of this Act shall be deemed in compliance with this Section until they expire or are renewed, not to exceed one (1) year, provided that each insurance company shall in writing inform each policy holder of any automobile liability policy written for less than the foregoing new limits of the passage of this Act, of the availability and cost of insurance at the new limits, and inform such policy holders that their policy may be inadequate and that the liability of the owner of a vehicle may exceed policy limits. The Director of the Department of Revenue and Taxation shall not register or license any vehicle which is not insured as herein Proof of compliance shall be required before license or provided. registration is issued. No automobile insurance policy may include any exclusion of drunk drivers as to third party coverage."

"§7158.1. Insurance Required. (a) No vehicle shall be operated upon the highways of the Territory of Guam unless such vehicle is insured under a general public liability insurance issued by a qualified insurance company for a minimum coverage of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) for property damage, One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) for personal injury or death to one (1) person, and Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000) total because of personal injury or death to two (2) or more persons. The registered or legal owner of any vehicle operated upon the highways of Guam and the operator of such vehicle shall be jointly responsible for compliance with this Section, provided, that all policies currently written for lesser limits before the effective date of this Act shall be deemed in compliance with

this Section until they expire or are renewed, not to exceed one (1) year, provided that each insurance company shall in writing inform each policy holder of any automobile liability policy written for less than the foregoing new limits of the passage of this Act, of the availability and cost of insurance at the new limits, and inform such policy holders that their policy may be inadequate and that the liability of the owner of a vehicle may exceed policy limits. The Director of the Department of Revenue and Taxation shall not register or license any vehicle which is not insured as herein provided. Proof of compliance shall be required before license or registration is issued. No automobile insurance policy may include any exclusion of drunk drivers as to third party coverage.

- (b) The Director of Revenue and Taxation shall by rules and regulations annually increase the minimum insurance coverage provided for in 16 GCA §7158, Subsections (a) and (b) of 16 GCA §7158.1, 16 GCA §7158.2, Subsection (f) of 16 GCA §3610, Subsection (a) of 16 GCA §19105 and Subsection (b) of 16 GCA §17101. The increase shall be effective the first day of April of each year, commencing April 1, 1987. The increase shall be a percentage amount not less than the percentage increase in cost of living on Guam for the previous calendar year. In addition, the Director may increase minimum insurance coverage provided for in the code sections cited in the first sentence of this Section further as he may deem necessary, after public hearing. All such increases and related rules and regulations shall be promulgated pursuant to the Administrative Adjudication Law.
- (c) No insurance company may issue any automobile liability policy for vehicles driven within the territory of Guam for less than the minimum amounts specified by this section, as later amended by rules and regulations as to minimum amounts."

Section 7. A new 16 GCA §7158.2 is added to read:

"§7158.2 Penalty. Any person who willfully fails, refuses, or neglects to comply with the requirements of 16 GCA §§7158 and 7158.1 shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall have his or her vehicle registration and driver's license suspended by the Director of Revenue

and Taxation after a hearing, until compliance with 16 GCA §§7158 or 7158.1 has been completed."

 Section 8. A new Subsection (f) is added to 16 GCA §3601 to read:

"(f) The Director of Revenue and Taxation is authorized to suspend, after hearing, the registration of any motor vehicle, trailer, semi-trailer, or pole or pipe dolly if the registered owner is unable to provide adequate proof that automobile insurance required by 16 GCA §§7158 or 7158.1 has been purchased or is current at the time the annual inspection or registration is affected."

Section 9. Subsection (a) of 16 GCA §19105 is repealed and reenacted to read:

"§19105. Insurance. (a) No policy or bond shall be effective under §19104 of this Title unless issued by an insurance company or surety company authorized to do business in Guam, nor unless such policy or bond is subject, if the accident has resulted in bodily injury or death, to limits, exclusive of interest and costs, of not less than One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) because of bodily injury to or death of one (1) person in any one (1) accident and Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000) because of bodily injury to or death of two (2) or more persons in any one (1) accident, and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) because of injury to or destruction of property of others in any one accident."

Section 10. Subsection (b) of 16 GCA §17101 is repealed and reenacted to read:

"(b) Limitation of Liability. The liability of an owner for imputed negligence imposed by this Section, and not arising through the relationship of principal and agent or master and servant, is limited to the amount of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) for the death of or injury to one (1) person in any one (1) accident and, subject to said limit as to one (1) person is limited to the amount of Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000) with respect to the death of or injury to more than one (1) person in any one (1) accident and is limited to the sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) for damage to property of others in any one (1) accident; provided, that in the event that the limits of liability of the insurance policy covering such

accident is more than the policy minimums set herein or is more than the policy minimums later set by rules and regulations promulgated by the Director of Revenue and Taxation, then the higher limits shall apply."

PREFACE

The Committee on Education conducted a scheduled public hearing on Bill No. 285. The hearing was conducted in the morning on Friday, August 2, 1985 in the Legislative Session Hall. Committee members present at the hearing were as follows:

BACKGROUND

Testimonies heard on Bill No. 285 were as follows:

1. Mrs. Carmen Nededog, Chairperson of Guam Public Library Board

Ms. Nededog supports the intent of the bill to amend Section 42004 of the Government Code. She has reservations, however, since the proposed amendment does not clarify the word "student." Is the bill referring to full time student, part-time student or any and all students? Is it referring to a specific grade level, including the university level? While in support of the bill, she would still like clarification on the "student."

2. Ms. Magdalena S. Taitano, Territorial Librarian

She noted that she is the Territorial Librarian for the Guam Public Library system and was an alternate delegate to the White House Conference on Library and Information Services. At the White House Conference in 1979, Guam was represented by six (6) people, one of which was a youth.

One of the conference follow-up and recommendations is that "states and territories be encouraged to include at least one youth as voting member on the library board.

Bill No. 285 will implement the recommendation of the White House Conference on Library and Information Services.

She urges favorable consideration of the bill.

Discussions

- 1. Senator Dierking stated her opinion that while she has no problem in defining "student" she is confident that the Governor, in his wisdom, will not appoint a grade school student or anyone not qualified.
- 2. Present membership is five (5) but the total number for a complete board is seven (7).
- 3. The possibility of appointing one from the senior high school and one from the university level was discussed and received some support among those present.
- 4. There is no prohibition under the present law for the Governor to appoint a student and that Bill No. 285 may not be required.
- 5. While there has not been any recommendation from the public library representatives for the Governor to appoint a "student", there has been, however, the recommendation for the appointment of a "youth."

ANALYSIS OF BILL NO. 285

Bill No. 285 proposes to establish in law the appointment of one student to the seven (7) member Guam Public Library Board.

COMMITTEE FINDINGS

The Committee finds that there is support for the intent of the bill, except, perhaps, for clarification of the type of student to be appointed to the Board.

It is also noted that the intent of the bill is in line with the recommendation of the 1979 White House Conference on Library and Information Services with respect to including at least one youth as a voting member on the library board.
