CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR



FIRST: THE OFFICE OF THE COMMISSIONER OF AGANA IS PRESENTLY LOCATED AT THE YOUTH CENTER AT THE PASEO DE SUSANA. THE STRUCTURE IS OF FRAME/BLOCKS AND TIN ROOFING. IT HAS ALWAYS BEEN EXPERIENCED IN THE PAST THAT ANY FOREWARNING OF A TYPHOON, THE COMMISSIONER'S OFFICE WAS THE FIRST TO CLOSE ITS DOORS SINCE THE BUILDING CANNOT WITHSTAND THE STRONG WINDS AND WATER WHICH FLOODS THE ENTIRE SINGLE STORY STRUCTURE. IN CONTRAST TO THE OLD CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION BUILDING, THE REQUESTED LOCATION IS IDEAL TO WITHSTAND THE WINDS AND WATER SINCE THE BUILDING IS SURROUNDED BY TALL PERMANENT STRUCTURES AND THE ROLLING
