AN ACT DESIGNATING THE OLD CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION BUILDING PRESENTLY BEING USED BY THE GUAM GAMING COMMISSION AS THE PERMANENT OFFICE FOR THE COMMISSIONER OF AGANA.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. The building located behind the Agana Cathedral which previously was used by the Red Cross and the Civil Service Commission and which presently is being utilized for office space for the Guam Gaming Commission, located on Block 28 Lot 1 containing an area of 17858+ square meters in Agana, Guam is hereby designated for a permanent office for the Commissioner of Agana.
