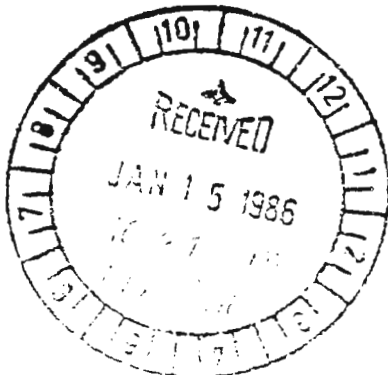



PREFACE

The Committee on General Governmental Operations to which was referred Bill No. 244, "An act to name the Mangilao Community Center the Senator William D.L. Flores Community Center," conducted a public hearing on Tuesday, August 27, 1985 at 9:30 a.m. in the Legislative Session Hall.

The Committee members present were Senator T.S. Nelson, Chairman, F.R. Santos, Vice-Chairman, and Senators Frank Blas, J.G. Bamba and Senator Edward Duenas.

BACKGROUND/TESTIMONY

Notification letters of the scheduled hearing on the above captioned legislation were sent out by the Chairman of the Committee to: the Governor of Guam; the Legislative Executive Director; the members of GGO Committee; the Director of Administration; the Director of Bureau of Budget and Management Research; to the family of late William D.L. Flores and to Commissioner Nick Francisco.

Providing testimony in favor of Bill No. 244 was Commissioner Nick Francisco of Mangilao who provided a written testimony. (Exhibit A)

Also providing testimony was Ms. Margaret E. Flores, who provided written testimony labeled exhibit "B". In her testimony, Ms. Flores testified that her family is in favor of the passage of Bill No. 244 and wished to thank the Committee for the generous offer. Ms. Flores, however, requested that the bill be amended to include Senator Flores' nickname so that the name of the Mangilao Community Center, if changed, would read, "Senator William D.L. Flores (Bilmar) Community Center".

There being no further witnesses to render testimony for or against the legislation, the Chairman adjourned the hearing on Bill No. 244.

COMMITTEE FINDINGS

The Committee finds that:

1. Honoring a longtime and faithful civil servant from Mangilao deserves the honor of having a public building bear his name and therefore recommends that the Mangilao Community Center be named the Senator William D.L. Flores (Bilmar) Community Center.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on General Governmental Operations to which was referred Bill No. 244, "An act to name the Mangilao Community Center the Senator William D.L. Flores Community Center" has had the same under consideration, and now wishes to report back the same with the recommendation to do pass as amended.
