



1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Chapter IV of Title I of the Government Code is amended
3 to read:

4 "CHAPTER IV

5 Section 300. Revenue from Vending Machines. Except for
6 revenues derived from the sale of goods and services purchased from
7 vending machines and amusement devices which are located on property
8 which is within the jurisdiction of the University of Guam, the Guam

1 Community College, the Guam Airport Authority and the public schools
2 pursuant to Title LXVI of the Government Code, all net revenues
3 derived from the sale of goods and services purchased from vending
4 machines and amusement devices located within any facility operated by
5 the government including any autonomous or semi-autonomous
6 government agency or any corporation which is wholly owned by the
7 government shall be paid into the General Fund.

8 Section 301. Notwithstanding any rule, regulations or law, all
9 net revenues derived through the sale of goods and services utilizing
10 vending machines and amusement devices located within public schools
11 shall be used exclusively for authorized student activities and all net
12 revenues derived through the sale of goods and services utilizing
13 vending machines and amusement devices located within the University
14 of Guam shall be budgeted and expended by the Student Body
15 Association as approved by the Board of Regents and within the Guam
16 Community College shall be budgeted and expended by the Student
17 Body Association as approved by the Board of Trustees of Guam
18 Community College. Nothing in the sections of this Act shall be
19 construed to impair the obligation of existing contracts.

20 Section 302. Placement of Vending Machines. A contract for a
21 duration not to exceed two (2) years for the placement of vending
22 machines within facilities operated by the government including any
23 autonomous or semi-autonomous government agency or any corporation
24 which is wholly owned by the government, shall be entered into only
25 after advertising for sealed annual bids in a newspaper of general
26 circulation within the Territory fourteen (14) days prior to the formal
27 bid opening and then only with the highest responsible bidder. The
28 governing boards of the autonomous and semi-autonomous agencies and
29 government-owned corporations shall adopt rules and regulations not
30 inconsistent herewith for the solicitation of bids. Bids for contracts
31 for non-autonomous agencies within the Executive Branch shall be
32 administered by the Director of Administration in accordance with
33 government bidding procedures. The procedure for the award of bids
34 within facilities operated by the Judiciary or the Legislature shall be

1 in accordance with bidding procedures applicable to those branches of
2 government, provided that bidding and contract procedures relative to
3 the placement of vending machines and amusement devices on property
4 under the jurisdiction of the Guam Airport Authority shall be in
5 accordance with such rules and regulations as may be from time to time
6 adopted by the Authority."

"AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER IV OF TITLE I OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE"

Bill No. 56 provides that the net revenues to the Government from the sale of goods and services from vending machines at the University of Guam, will be at the use of U.O.G. Student Body Association with the approval of the Board of Regents (SEE Exhibit "A"). This legislation was publicly held at 10:00 AM., January 22, 1985, in the Legislature Session Hall.

BACKGROUND

Currently, all net revenues derived from vending machines in Government buildings, except at the airport and public schools, are deposited directly into the General Fund. Bill No. 56 provides that revenues from vending machines at U.O.G. will instead be placed at the disposal of the U.O.G. Student Body with the approval of the Board of Regents. According to a fiscal note received from the Bureau of Budget and Management Research, this redirection of revenues will result in a loss of only \$12,000 approximately to the General Fund (SEE Exhibit "B")

TESTIMONY

At the public hearing, the Committee received written testimony from J.U. Torres, Chairman, U.O.G. Board of Regents (SEE Exhibit "C"). In his written testimony, J.U. Torres expressed his office's support for this legislation. He further recommended two amendments to the bill. The first would clarify the language regarding the expenditure of this revenue through the Student Body

Association and Board of Trustees. Mr. Torres's second amendment called for extending the authorized contract period for vending machines from one year to two years.

These amendments have been incorporated into the substitute bill approved by the committee.

Mr. Andrew Orsini also testifies in favor of Bill No. 56 (See Exhibit "D"). Mr. Orsini stated that, "I consider the passage of this bill to be an affirmation of the Legislature's commitment to assisting the students in more active involvement both in academic programs and in finances for programs". Mr. Orsini also expressed support for the two amendments proposed by Mr. Torres.

COMMITTEE FINDINGS

The Committee finds that enactment of this legislation would be beneficial to the U.O.G. Student Body and indeed to the University as a whole.

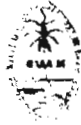
COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

The Board of Trustees of the Guam Community College would hold approval authority over the funds to be expended by the GCC Student Body Association.

Technical amendments to Bill No. 56 were also made during the meeting.



Comments on Bill No. 56

This proposed legislation is seeking to amend Chapter IV of Title I of the Government Code by exempting vending machine revenues earned by University of Guam from the General Fund. Additionally, these exempted revenues shall be used solely at the discretion of the Student Body Association and the Boards of Regents. The fiscal impact of this exemption from the General Funds is expected to approximately reach \$12,000 per annum.

The proposed legislation contained in Bill No. 56 is basically supported by my office.


However, I would like to offer two amendments to the present form of the bill as it is presently written.

- (1) Under Section 301, lines 25-29, I recommend this to read:
" . . . and all net revenues derived through the sale of goods and services utilizing vending machines and amusement devices located within the University of Guam shall be budgeted and expended by the Student Body Association as approved by the Board of Regents."
- (2) Under Section 302, lines 1-2, I recommend this to read:
"A contract for a duration not to exceed two (2) years for the placement of vending machines within facilities operated. . . ."

These two proposed amendments would provide more definite guidelines as to the implementation of Bill No. 56.

Thank you for the opportunity to present our recommendations concerning this proposed legislation.

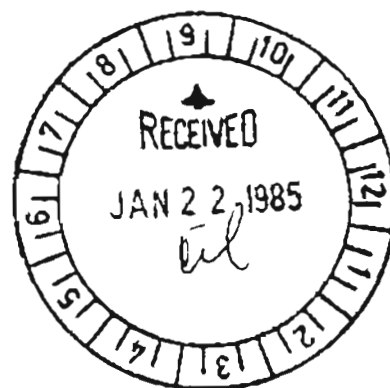

I would like to offer a proposed amendment to Section 301 to read:



9 Section 300. Revenue from Vending Machines. Except for
10 revenues derived from the sale of goods and services
11 purchased from vending machines and amusement devices which
12 are located on property which is within the jurisdiction
13 of the University of Guam, the Guam Airport Authority and
14 the public schools pursuant to Title LXVI of the Government
15 Code, all net revenues derived from the sale of goods and
16 services purchased from vending machines and amusement
17 devices located within any facility operated by the govern-
18 ment including any autonomous or semi-autonomous government
19 agency or any corporation which is wholly owned by the
20 government shall be paid into the General Fund.

21 Section 301. Notwithstanding any rule, regulations or
22 law to the contrary, all net revenues derived through the
23 sale of goods and services utilizing vending machines and
24 amusement devices located within public schools shall be
25 used exclusively for authorized student activities and all
26 net revenues derived through the sale of goods and services
27 utilizing vending machines and amusement devices located
28 within the University of Guam shall be in the discretion of
29 the Student Body Association and the Board of Regents.
30 Nothing in the sections of this Act shall be construed to
31 impair the obligation of existing contracts.

32 Section 302. Placement of Vending Machines. A

1 A contract for a duration not to exceed one (1) year for
2 the placement of vending machines within facilities operated
3 by the government including any autonomous or semi-autonomous
4 government agency or any corporation which is wholly owned
5 by the government, shall be entered into only after advertisin
6 for sealed annual bids in a newspaper of general circulation
7 within the territory fourteen (14) days prior to the formal
8 bid opening and then only with the highest responsible
9 bidder. The governing boards of the autonomous and semi-
10 autonomous agencies and government-owned corporations shall
11 adopt rules and regulations not inconsistent herewith for
12 the solicitation of bids. Bids for contracts for non-
13 autonomous agencies within the Executive Branch shall be
14 administered by the Director of Administration in accordance
15 with government bidding procedures. The procedure for the
16 award of bids within facilities operated by the Judiciary
17 or the Legislature shall be in accordance with bidding
18 procedures applicable to those branches of government, provided
19 that bidding and contract procedures relative to the placement
20 of vending machines and amusement devices on property under
21 the jurisdiction of the Guam Airport Authority shall be in
22 accordance with such rules and regulations as may be from
23 time to time adopted by the Authority."
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
