
CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR

An Act to repeal Chapter IA, Part I, Title I, of the Code of Civil Procedure, relating to the Superior Court of Guam, and for other purposes.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Sec. 1. Chapter IA, of Part I, Title I, of the Code of Civil
3 Procedure of Guam is hereby repealed in its entirety.

4 Sec. 2. The original jurisdiction of the Island Court of Guam
5 to try, hear, and determine civil actions and proceedings wherein
6 the Government of Guam is a party plaintiff, party defendant, or
7 party in interest, which was revoked by implication on the effective
8 date of Executive Order No. 24-47, dated 3 October, 1947, is hereby
9 reinstated to the same extent and purposes as if Executive Order
10 Number 24-47 had never been promulgated.

11 Sec. 3. All records, books, papers, causes, actions and pro-
12 ceedings lodged, deposited or pending in the Superior Court of Guam
13 wherein the Government of Guam is a party plaintiff, party defendant
14 or party in interest, are transferred to the Island Court which has
15 jurisdiction over them as if they had been in the first instance
16 lodged, deposited, filed, or commenced therein.

17 Sec. 4. All records, books, papers, causes, actions, and pro-
18 ceedings lodged, deposited or pending in the Superior Court of Guam
19 wherein the United States of America is a party plaintiff, party
20 defendant, or party in interest, are transferred to the District
21 Court of Guam which has, by virtue of the passage of Public Law 630
22 of the United States Congress, jurisdiction over them as if they had
23 been in the first instance lodged, deposited, filed or commenced
24 therein.

25 Sec. 5. This act is an urgency measure and shall take effect
26 upon its approval by the Governor.
