An Act establishing July 21 as a legal public holiday and designating this day as Liberation Day.

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:
2	Section 1. The 21st day of July in each year shall be
3	known as Liberation Day, and is hereby made a legal public
4	holiday in the Territory of Guam in commemoration of the an-
5	niversary of the liberation of the Island of Guam from the
6	enemy on July 21, 1944 and the inauguration of a civil govern-
7	ment for Guam on July 21, 1950. When this holiday falls on a
g	Sunday, it may be, by proclamation of the Governor, observed
9	upon the following Monday.
10	Section 2. The Governor of Guam is authorized and requeste
11	to issue annually a proclamation calling upon the people of Guam
12	to observe Liberation Day by displaying the flag at their homes
13	or other suitable places, with appropriate ceremonies and fes-
14	tivities expressive of the public sentiment befitting the occa-
15	sion.
16	Section 3. The Governor of Guam is further authorized and
17	requested to annually appoint a Liberation Day committee to plan
18	and make appropriate arrangements for the celebration of this
19	day. Said committee shall be composed of members selected from
20	the Executive, Legislative and Judicial branches of the Govern-
21	ment of Guam and members of patriotic, educational, religious
22	and other civic organization.
23	Section 4. This act shall take effect upon its approval
24	by the Governor.
