10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

11 Section 1. Part II is added to Chapter 47 of the Civil
12 Regulations with the Force and Effect of Law in Guam, to read:

13 PART II

14 1. Every law enacted by the Guam Legislature shall go into
15 effect at midnight of the day of its approval by the Governor or the
16 President of the United States, unless otherwise provided therein.

17 2. If a bill passed by the Legislature becomes a law with-
18 out the signature of the Governor by lying before him for ten days
19 (Sundays excepted) while the Legislature is in session, such law shall
20 go into effect at midnight on the last of such ten days, unless other-
21 wise provided therein.

22 3. If a bill passed by the Legislature becomes law, not-
23 withstanding the objections of the Governor, by lying ninety days
24 before the President of the United States, such law shall go into
25 effect at midnight on the last of such ninety days, unless otherwise
26 provided therein.

27 Section 2. This act is an urgency measure and shall take
28 effect upon its approval by the Governor.
