4	An Act to repeal Chapter 48 of the Civil Regulations with the Force and Effect of
5	Law in Guam as enacted by Guam Congress Bill No. 10; to amend Section 337 of the
6	Penal Code of Guam and to add a new Chapter 48 of the Civil Regulations with the Force
7	and Effect of Law in Guam, relating to cockfighting, and declaring the urgency
8	thereof.
9	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:
10	Section 1. Chapter 48 of the Civil Regulations with the Force .
11	and Effect of Law in Guam as enacted by Guam Congress Bill No. 10 is hereby
12	repealed.
13	Section 2. There is hereby added a new Chapter 48 of the Civil
14	Regulations with the Force and Effect of Law in Guam to read as follows:
15	"Sec. 1. There is hereby established in the Government
16	of Guam a Cockpit License Board (hereinafter referred to as
17	the "Board") which shall consist of three members including
18	the chairman appointed by the Governor with the consent of
19	the Legislature.
20	Sec. 2. The members and chairman of the Board shall be
21	appointed for terms of one year each and shall receive no
22	compensation as such, but may be reimbursed for their reason-
23	able and necessary expenses incurred in the course of their
24	official duties.
25	Sec. 3. The Governor may issue as executive orders and
26	the Board may recommend to the Governor for issuance as
27	executive orders such reasonable rules and regulations, not
28	inconsistent with the laws of Guam as may be necessary or
29	desirable to enable the board to carry into effect the
30	provisions of this chapter.
31	Sec. 4. Within the limits of its authorized budget and
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consistent with the Compensation Law of Guam, the board may employ and discharge such employees as shall from time to time be necessary in carrying out the duties and responsibilities imposed thereunder.

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Sec. 5. There may be established as hereinafter provided licensed cockpits in Guam.

Sec. 6. Licenses for the operation of cockpits shall be issued by the board only after the awarding of the license as herein provided.

10Sec. 7. Notice of the proposed awarding of the license11for the operation of the cockpit shall be posted in at least12three public places, in the municipality for which a license13is to be issued for a period of 15 days prior to the date14stated in the notice for the receiving of bids for such license.

15 Sec. 8. Bids must be submitted within a period of 10 days 16 from the date fixed in the notice for the receiving of bids. 17 Each bid shall be accompanied by a deposit of \$10.00 which 18 shall not be returned and the amount of such deposits shall 19 be paid into the Treasury of Guam. All bids must be sealed 20 and will be publicly opened 5 days after the expiration of 21 the dates for receiving bids at the hour and place to be 22 stated in the notice. The minimum bid which can be received 23 or accepted by the board for the operation of licensed cockpit 24 shall be the sum of \$500.

25 Sec. 9. The board shall award the license to the highest 26 bidder provided that the bidder is approved by the board. In 27 the event that for any reason the board does not approve the 28 highest bidder, or the highest bid is for any reason otherwise 29 not acceptable to the board, new notices shall be posted and 30 bids received in the same manner as if new notice had hereto-31 fore been given except, that a bidder who has been disapproved 32 by the board may not submit a new bid.

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l	Sec. 10. All licenses shall be for a period of two
2	years but may at the expiration of that time be renewed by
3	the board for an additional period of two years upon the pay-
4	ment by the licensee of an amount equal to the amount of his
5	original bid.
6	Sec. 11. No more than one license for the operation of
7	a cockpit shall be permitted in each municipality and no
8	cockpit shall be located within a radius of 500 yeards from
9	the defined limits of a village.
10	Sec. 12. A license may be suspended or revoked for
11	violation of any section of this Act or any executive orders
12	issued pursuant thereto and all proceedings for such sus-
13	pension or revocation shall be by the court in the manner
14	provided by the Administrative Adjudication Act.
15	Sec. 13. No license shall be issued to anyone not a
16	citizen of the United States.
17	Sec. 14. Cockfights may be held on Sundays, legal
18	holidays or Church holidays or on the Saint's feast day of
19	each village. In addition thereto, additional cockfight
20	events may be held each year upon the approval thereof by
21	a majority of the members of the board.
22	Sec. 15. The hours of operation of cockpits shall be
23	as follows:
24	(a) Sundays, legal and/or Church holidays 0900 to 1830
25	(b) Saint's Feast Day of a village 1000 to 1830
26	(c) On other authorized days 1000 to 1830
27	Sec. 16. The admission fee to a cockpit shall be as
28	follows:
29	(a) Each person entering the arena with a fighting
30	cock \$1.00
31	(b) Each person entering the arena without a fighting
32	cock \$2,00

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l	Sec. 17. The amount of a bet placed by any one person
2	on any one combat shall not exceed fifty (\$50.00) dollars.
3	Sec. 18. For each combat between cocks, a fee not to
4	exceed two (2%) per cent of the total amount of bets, will
5	be collected by the holder of the franchise."
6	Section 3. Section 337 of the Penal Code of Guam is amended to
7	read:
8	"337. Cockpits and cockfighting. Every person who shall
9	either: (1) Operate a cockpit without a license; (2) engage
10	in cockfighting (Balentia) outside of a licensed cockpit;
11	(3) permit any person under 18 years of age to attend a
12	licensed cockpit is guilty of a misdemeanor.
13	Section 4. This Act is an urgency measure and shall take
14	effect upon approval by the Governor.
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
