






An Act to add Section 62a to Public Law 17, First Guam Legislature, relating to jurisdiction of the District Court of Guam.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 62a is hereby added to Public Law 17, First Guam Legislature, to read as follows:

"Section 62a. In the absence of the judge of the District Court of Guam or his inability to serve, the Island Court through its chief judge shall have original jurisdiction in pleas of guilty, defaults and matters preliminary to trial in all causes where original jurisdiction is given to the District Court, except causes arising under the laws of the United States."

Section 2. This is an urgency measure and shall take effect upon its approval by the Governor.
