

Bill No. 183

Introduced by P. B. Leon Guerrero

An Act amending Section 91 and adding Section 92a to Public Law 34, Tenth Guam Congress, relating to the qualifications of members of the Guam Legislature.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Sec. 91 of Public Law 34, Tenth Guam Congress, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 91. In accordance with the provisions of Section 10, Public Law 630, 81st Congress, approved August 1, 1950, the legislature of Guam is hereby established and shall be composed of a single House of 21 members who shall be elected at large. The Legislature shall be known as the Guam Legislature."

Section 2. Sec. 92a is hereby added to Public Law 34, Tenth Guam Congress, to read as follows:

"Sec. 92a. No person shall sit in the Legislature of Guam nor be eligible to be a candidate for election to that office who holds an office, position or appointment in the government of Guam requiring the advice and consent to, or confirmation of, the Legislature."
