7 continuation of certain necessary capital
8 improvements within the territory of Guam
9 and to make appropriations for such pur-
10 poses and projects during the fiscal year
11 ending June 30, 1953; and for other
12 purposes.

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

14 Section 1. It is the purpose of this act to continue the
15 ten-year construction program for necessary, adequate and appropriate
16 public works, buildings, structures and facilities required for the
17 operation of the Government and in the interests of the public welfare
18 and safety of the people, and in order to continue the rehabilitation
19 of the territory of Guam.

20 Section 2. The Governor is hereby authorized to construct,
21 erect, install, extend, establish, maintain or develop, by contract
22 or otherwise, for the government of Guam, necessary, adequate and
23 appropriate public works, buildings, structures, land, installations,
24 facilities and equipment as hereinbelow specified and for which
25 appropriations are herein made.

26 Section 3. There is hereby appropriated from any funds in
27 the Treasury of Guam not otherwise appropriated the following sums
28 of money for the purposes and projects as herein set forth, during
29 the fiscal year ending June 30, 1953:

30 (a) To improve, strengthen, replace and remodel
31 facilities and structures of the existing and interim
32 Guam Memorial Hospital, the sum of \$57,000.

(b) To continue construction of the permanent
hospital development, including amortization of loans,
and to provide funds in connection with all phases of
the financing of construction of this facility including

1 but not limited to travel and contracts for personal
2 services in connection with any proposed bond issue
3 for such construction, the sum of \$400,000.

4 (c) To plan, construct and acquire necessary
5 land, for three Elementary school structures and to
6 complete a fourth, the sum of \$450,000.

7 (d) To improve, extend and remodel existing
8 interim Elementary school structures, the sum of
9 \$26,000.

10 (e) To plan, provide utilities for and the con-
11 struction of the first increment, of the permanent
12 George Washington High School, the sum of \$400,000.

13 (f) To extend, improve and remodel the existing
14 and interim George Washington High School facilities,
15 the sum of \$40,000.

16 (g) To extend and improve roads in various villages
17 and to replace Pago River bridge, the sum of \$428,500.

18 (h) To plan, acquire necessary land for, construct
19 and erect a community building and necessary facili-
20 ties and equipment in connection therewith, to house
21 the health, fire and police services and the office
22 of the village Commissioner, in furtherance of the
23 ten-year permanent construction program, the sum of
24 \$40,000.

25 (i) To complete the planning, construction and
26 erection of an adequate and appropriate permanent
27 Government House of Guam, the sum of \$125,000.

28 (j) To plan, extend, construct and install sewers
29 and sewerage systems for and in the municipality of
30 Sinajana, the sum of \$100,000.

31 (k) To plan, purchase material for, and install
32 additional facilities for the government of Guam

1 telephone exchange, the sum of \$50,000.

2 (l) To purchase and install recreational equipment,
3 in accordance with the recommendations of the Recrea-
4 tion Commission, which shall be in addition to the
5 recreational facilities provided for in the planning
6 and construction of the four permanent Elementary
7 schools and the permanent High School as hereinbefore
8 provided, the sum of \$50,000.

9 (m) To purchase land for Adelup School site,
10 Barrigada School site and miscellaneous sites, the
11 sum of \$133,500.

12 Section 4. The Governor is authorized to acquire lands,
13 rights, and easements pertaining thereto and in connection therewith,
14 or other interests therein, including the temporary use thereof, by
15 donation, purchase, exchange of Government-owned lands or otherwise.

16 Section 5. Appropriations made herein carrying out the
17 purposes and projects authorized by this Act shall be available for
18 expenses incident thereto, including administration, overhead, plan-
19 ning and supervision, and any and all other expenses incident thereto,
20 and shall continue in full force and effect and shall be available
21 until expended for such purposes and projects.

22 Section 6. The Governor is hereby authorized and empowered
23 to request, apply for, receive and use for the advancement or accom-
24 plishment of any project or public purpose authorized by the Legis-
25 lature, any and all Federal financial aid in the form of loans, grants
26 or subsidies, and technical or other advice and assistance, upon such
27 terms and subject to such conditions as any agency of the United States
28 of America as the grantor thereof may require; provided, however, that
29 nothing herein contained shall create or authorize the Governor to
30 incur a general obligation of the Government of Guam in violation of
31 Section 11 of the Organic Act of Guam; and without limiting the
32 generality of the foregoing, the Governor is authorized and empowered

1 to give, in his discretion, priority in applying for any such
2 Federal aid from the appropriate agency or agencies of the United
3 States, to the development, construction and expansion of the
4 hospital and power facilities of the territory of Guam.

5 Section 7. This is an urgency measure and shall take
6 effect upon its approval by the Governor.

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
