An Act to amend Section 19 of the Motor Vehicle Code of Guam (Executive Order 9-49) relating to requiring fire extinguishers to be carried in all common carriers.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Sec. 19 of the Motor Vehicle Code of Guam is
hereby amended to read:

"Sec. 19. (a) Except in the case of a motor vehicle operated with a gearshift mechanism attached to the steering column, a person shall not drive a motor vehicle upon a highway with more than one person, or if at least one of the persons is under twelve years of age with more than two persons in addition to the driver occupying the front seat of the vehicle. For the purposes of this section, two front seats shall be construed as the front seat of the vehicle.

- (b) In the case of a motor vehicle operated with a gearshift mechanism attached to the steering column, a person shall not drive such vehicle upon a highway with more than two persons, regardless of age, in addition to the driver occupying the front seat of the vehicle.
- (c) It shall be unlawful for a person to operate a common carrier upon a highway unless such common carrier shall be equipped with a portable fire extinguisher of the type and size required for the particular class of carrier by the Director of the Department of Public Safety."
