



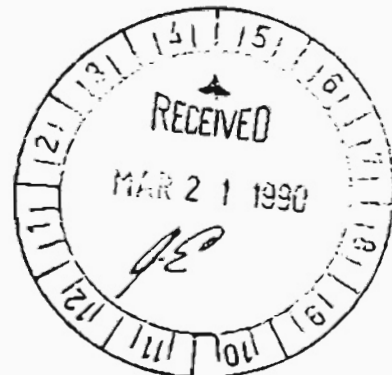





1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:
2 Section 1. Appropriation. Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) are
3 hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the Guam Council on Arts
4 and Humanities ("CAHA") for Guam's participation in the 1990 Cultural Fair
5 to be held in Long Beach, California.

1 Section 2. Task Force. Expenditures of the funds appropriated in
2 Section 1 of this Act shall be the responsibility of a special task force
3 committee (the "Committee"). The Committee shall consist of

4 1. Three (3) members from CAHA appointed by CAHA's
5 chairperson,

6 2. Three (3) members from the Guam Visitors Bureau appointed
7 by its chairperson, and

8 3. One (1) member from the Mayors' Council appointed by the
9 president of the Council.

10 Section 3. Purpose of Committee. The purpose of the Committee is to
11 oversee and ensure the highest quality possible of all cultural and
12 promotional products presented by Guam during the 1990 Cultural Fair in
13 Long Beach, California.

14 Section 4. Reversion; report of 1989 Cultural Fair. Any of the funds
15 appropriated in Section 1 of this Act not expended shall revert to the
16 General Fund. The Director of CAHA shall be the certifying officer for the
17 appropriation made in this Act; provided, however, that no funds
18 authorized by Section 1 of this Act shall be provided to CAHA until CAHA
19 shall have furnished the Governor a written report satisfactory to him on
20 the expenses incurred in the attendance by Guam at the 1989 Cultural Fair
21 held in Vallejo, California.

22 Section 5. Appropriation for ESPN. One Hundred Fifty Thousand
23 Dollars (\$150,000) are hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the
24 Guam Visitors Bureau to sponsor the telecast by Entertainment & Sports
25 Programming Network ("ESPN") of Guam's 1990 "Smokin Wheels" races.
26 Within sixty (60) days after completion of the telecast, the Chairman of the
27 Guam Visitors Bureau shall submit to the Legislature a report of all
28 expenditures under this section, including but not limited to a balance
29 sheet, a statement of receipts, and a general description of expenses
30 arising out of the tournament.

ARTS AND HUMANITIES FOR THE 1990
CULTURAL FAIR IN LONG BEACH.**

The Committee on Ways & Means conducted a public hearing on Monday, January 22, 1990 beginning at 8:00 a.m. at the Legislative Session Hall to hear testimony on Bill No. 1151. Senator Carl T.C. Gutierrez, Chairman of the Committee conducted the hearing. Members present were Senators George M. Bamba, Ted S. Nelson, Ernesto M. Espaldon and Doris F. Brooks.

TESTIMONY

Mr. Alberto A. Lamorena V, Executive Director of the Guam Council on the Arts and Humanities Agency submitted written testimony.

Mr. Lamorena in his testimony supports "this worthwhile event which will prove both beneficial towards the promotion of our island as a tourist location and to provide a better understanding of our people and our culture. Funds requested will be used to subsidize Guam's participation and to cover initial expenses incurred by the planning committee in Long Beach."

Last year the first Chamorro Cultural Fair was held in Vallejo, California with over 4,000 people attending. Due to the huge success of the project Mr. Lamorena met with representatives of the Northern California Chamorro Cultural Association and members of the Chamorro clubs in Southern California and decided that the project should be continued on an annual basis alternating the sights from Northern and Southern California.

Mr. Lamorena stated that "Guam's participation will include a delegation of dancers and singers that have yet to be designated. Exhibit will be assembled and displayed in cooperation with GCAHA and the Guam Museum. Craftspersons will also accompany the delegation to give lecture

demonstrations on various traditional artforms. GCAHA will also play an active role in the planning and implementation of the fair and will therefore work very closely with the festival committee. Also scheduled will be a speakers forum that will include government officials or agencies interested in attending the fair."

Mr. Lamorena when on further to say that during the "delegation's travels several stops are being planned for San Jose, Ca., Bremerton, Wa. and Honolulu, Hawaii to do performances. The delegation has been invited to perform in Honolulu at the 'Festival of the Pacific' scheduled in June, expenses will be paid for by the festival committee."

"The Chamorro people are proud of their cultural heritage regardless if they are living on Guam or abroad. We must continue to instill pride in our culture so that our future generations of Chamorros will never forget the significance of our culture and it's people" said Mr. Lamorena.

RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on Ways & Means recommends that Bill No. 1151 be passed by the Twentieth Guam Legislature as Substituted.





1 **Section 3.** The purpose of the committee is to oversee and

TESTIMONY ON BILL NUMBER 1151

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$50,000) TO THE GUAM COUNCIL ON ARTS AND HUMANITIES FOR THE 1990 CHAMORRO CULTURAL FAIR IN LONG BEACH, CALIFORNIA.

Mr. Chairman, Senator Carl Guitierrez and members of the Committee on Ways and Means my name is Alberto A. Lamorena V, Executive Director of the Guam Council on the Arts and Humanities Agency. I am appearing before you today to testify in favor of Bill 1151 appropriating \$50,000 to the Guam Council on the Arts and Humanities Agency for the 2nd Annual Chamorro Cultural Fair to be held in Long Beach, California.

There are presently approximately 40,000 Chamorros living in California. With approximately 65% of the Chamorros living in Southern California. Last year the first Chamorro Cultural Fair was held in Vallejo, California with over 4,000 people attending. Due to the huge success of the project I met with representatives of the Northern California Chamorro Cultural Association and members of Chamorro clubs in Southern California and we decided that the project should be continued on an annual basis alternating the sights from Northern and Southern California to provide a better opportunity for Chamorros in California and surrounding areas to attend the fair.

I am presently working with Mr. Kin Borja who will be chairing the committee in Long Beach. His committee is comprised of representatives from the various Chamorro clubs in Southern California. Tentative plans are presently being looked into, although nothing has been definitely confirmed until he has been assured that funds are available for the event. I have talked to Mr. Borja on several occasions and I am confident that his committee will work diligently towards the success of the project. He has stated that they are presently looking into a facility that will accommodate approximately 8,000 people and that the fair will encompass one whole weekend rather than last year's one day event. He has also spoken to governmental officials in Long Beach and they have offered him full support for the proposed project.

I am appealing before you today to approve funding for this worthwhile event which will prove both beneficial towards the promotion of our island as a tourist location and to provide a better understanding of our people and our culture.

Funds requested will be used to subsidize Guam's participation and to cover initial expenses incurred by the planning committee in Long Beach. For additional information concerning expenses please see the budget attached.

Guam's participation will include a delegation of dancers and singers that have yet to be designated. Also an exhibit will be assembled and displayed


in cooperation with GCAHA and the Guam Museum. Craftspersons will also accompany the delegation to give lecture demonstrations on various traditional artforms. GCAHA will also play an active role in the planning and implementation of the fair and will therefore work very closely with the festival committee. Also scheduled will be a speakers forum that will include government officials or agencies interested in attending the fair. This was proven very informative to the people attending the fair last year and will again be incorporated this year.

The delegation's itinerary has yet to be confirmed although the fair is tentatively scheduled for mid June. During the delegation's travels several stops are being planned for San Jose, Ca., Bremerton, Wa. and Honolulu, Hawaii to do performances. Since the delegation's airfare has already been paid for to travel to the west coast, expenses for the above mentioned locations will be minimal. The delegation has been invited to perform in Honolulu at the "Festival of the Pacific" scheduled in June, expenses will be paid for by the festival committee.

The Chamorro people are proud of their cultural heritage regardless if they are living on Guam or abroad. We must continue to instill pride in our culture so that our future generations of Chamorros will never forget the significance of our culture and it's people.

In closing I would like to Thank you for you kind attention and for your continued support for the arts.


