COMMITTEE ON WAYS & MEANS COMMITTEE REPORT ON

BILL NO. 1090: AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO IMPLEMENT PAY RANGE REASSIGNMENTS OF ADMINISTRATIVE POSITIONS.

The Committee on Ways & Means conducted a public hearing on Tuesday, December 19, 1989 beginning at 9:00 a.m. at the Legislative Session Hall to hear testimony on Bill No. 1090. Senator Carl T. C. Gutierrez, Chairman of the Committee conducted the hearing. Members present were Senators George M. Bamba, Franklin J. A. Quitugua, Doris F. Brooks and Martha C. Ruth.

TESTIMONY

No one appeared before the Committee but the Chair is in receipt of written testimony from Mr. Felix P. Camacho, Executive Director, Civil Service Commission; Mr. Don Parkinson, Senator, Twentieth Guam Legislature; and Mr. Wilfred G. Aflague, Director, Department of Administration.

Mr. Felix P. Camacho testified in support of the Bill. He requested that two additional sections be added to the proposed Bill to address retroactivity on the aforementioned positions. He also stated in his testimony that Section 4 of the proposed Bill is consistent with the request of the Commission as stated in CSC No. 89-703, dated September 20, 1989.

Senator Don Parkinson in his testimony recommended that an amendment be added to address reassignment of pay range for the position of Administrative Supervisor of the Department of Law as approved by the Civic Service Commission at its meeting on March 2, 1989 (CSC No. 89-308), to be made retroactive to August 24, 1986.

Mr. Wilfred Aflague in his testimony recommended that the Bill not be approved at this time, as the Legislature has already mandated the Civil Service Commission to conduct an appropriate salary and classification review of all classified positions within the Government of Guam, through Public Law 20-65.

The Committee is also in receipt of a petition on Bill Nos. 880 and 1090 from employees of the Department of Administration, Division Accounts, in fairness to the other Division of Accounts employees that the additional positions be included.

COMMITTEE FINDINGS

The Committee only adopted the pay range assignments for the Administrative Services Officer and the Chief of Administration positions because these two positions were the only ones that were originally in error under the Option 1. Approving the other positions would be detrimental to the classification system because it will cause a snowball effect and cause all other positions to be readjusted. Public Law 20-65, sections 7 and 8 mandates a government-wide classification and salary study. The Committee feels that it would be prudent to wait for the completion of said study.

RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on Ways & Means recommends that Bill No. 1090 be passed by the Twentieth Guam Legislature as Substituted.



Dear Senator Gutierrez:

Bill No. 1090 is an "Act to appropriate funds to implement pay range reassignments of administrative positions approved by the Civil Service Commission in their Board Action No. 89-671, dated September 1, 1989. It also retroactively implements the pay range reassignment for the Deputy Controller of the Department of Administration to August 24, 1986. When testimony was presented to the Civil Service Commission Board, the Department of Administration did not concur with the pay range reassignments proposed by the Civil Service Commission. This department made a strong presentation contending that the pay range reassignments were benchmarked against inappropriate position titles. The effect of these reassignments would cause position disparity within the Classification and Compensation Plan. Ultimately, it will cost the Government of Guam millions upon millions of dollars to correct this disparity.

Provided is a background information which should shed some light as to the problems and issues confronting the appropriations necessary in this bill:

BACKGROUND:

On August 22, 1980, Public Law 15-136 was enacted implementing the 1978 Salary Survey and Classification and Compensation Findings conducted and co-chaired by the Civil Service Commission and Department of Administration with technical assistance from the federal government's Office of Personnel Management. This study developed parity among existing classes of positions within the Government of Guam. Almost immediately after the passage of Public Law 15-136, Public Law 15-138 was enacted giving the Department of Education administrators and administrative personnel salary increases equal to 25% above the teachers salaries. Result - Disparate Compensation Plan!

Then ... on June 22 1984, and July 9, 1985, Public Law 17-58 and Public Law 18-8 were enacted establishing the Port Authority of Guam's Classification

and Compensation Plan patterned after the federal government's GS and WG schedule. The law created differences in salaries of up to \$5,000 for counterpart positions in GovGuam. Result - Disparate Compensation Plan!

Then ... on February 7, 1985, Public Law 18-1 enacted the teachers reclassification, but again maintaining the 25% variance for DOE administrators and administrative personnel. This law created differences in salaries of up to \$10,000 for counterpart positions in GovGuam. Result - Disparate Compensation Plan!

Then... during 1985, the Legislature and the Civil Service Commission either sponsored legislation or approved department-wide reassignment of pay ranges for Revenue and Taxation, Bureau of Budget and Management Research, Department of Corrections and Guam Police Department. Result - Disparate Compensation Plan!

Then... on June, 1985, the Department of Administration petitioned the Civil Service Commission to approve its reassignment of pay ranges for counterpart or similar positions which were previously implemented. The department wanted PARITY. Instead, the Civil Service Commission adopted something called Option II and Option I. Option II was basically an across-the-board adjustment of three pay ranges. Option I was more systematic but still lacked interclass correlations. Result - Disparate but workable!

OPTION III AND IV...?

Then... on November, 1988, P.L. 19-19 was enacted reassigning the pay ranges for BBMR analysts. The effect of this enactment has resulted in the misalignment of professional, supervisory and administrator positions. The highest pay range, Pay Range 60, is now inadequate for interclass correlations. Result - Disparity within Option I.

Then... on January 17, 1989, P.L. 19-52 was enacted reassigning the pay ranges of certain Revenue and Taxation positions. Result - Disparity within Option I.

Then... on September 1 and 6, 1989, the Civil Service Commission reassigned the pay ranges of certain administrative positions, i.e., Administrative Services Officer (49), Chief of Administration (51), Administrative Officer (42) and Administrative Assistants (35). In addition, the Commission reassigned the pay ranges of engineering, construction and planning positions, defying basic concepts of position classification and benchmarking them against Budget and Management positions. Imagine assigning the salary of an Engineering Aide or Building Inspector positions to a professional Budget Analyst. This action has certainly cast a "dark shadow" on the merit system integrity of the Commission. Result - Further disparity within Option I!

This department, therefore, recommends that Bill No. 1090 not be approved a this time, as the Legislature has already mandated the Civil Service Commission to conduct an appropriate salary and classification review of all classified positions within the Government of Guam, through Public Law 20-65.



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Comments on Bill 1090

Bill 1090 proposes to appropriate such funds as are necessary to implement the pay range reassignments of administrative positions per Civil Service Commission (CSC) No. 89-671. In addition, the Bill would reassign the Pay Range of the Deputy Controller position of the Department of Administration.

Per CSC 89-671 seven (7) positions, inclusive of the following:
